

## St. Mary and Beacons of Light

#### What's happening?

At the beginning of December the archbishop promulgated the final list for the families of parishes. If you have been following the news you are aware that St. Mary is part of a family which includes Visitation in Eaton, St. Mary, Camden and St. John the Evangelist in New Paris. The future is to work toward the day in a few years when the family of parishes will become one parish. The family itself will decide how that union is accomplished and what the new parish will look like. The family will be assigned a pastor and a parochial vicar (associate pastor). Assignments for priests will be announced in the early months of this year and will take effect on July 1, 2022.

#### What do we need to do at St. Mary?

The guidelines from the archdiocese make it clear that we are not to begin planning for the family's future until after priest assignments are in place, and the formation of committees, planning groups, etc. are to begin in September.

The best preparation that we can do before the new pastor and associate arrive is to strengthen parish involvement. Since I arrived at St. Mary the Parish Pastoral Council has had a membership including anyone willing to participate. I still welcome anyone willing to participate. It will be important for the future to have council persons who will interact with the new pastor and the councils of our other member parishes in the family of parishes. St. Mary council meets the third Thursday of each month. If you are interested in getting more involved in the future of the community of believers here in Oxford join us on January 20th at 7:00pm in the BASIC lounge in the rectory basement (enter from the alley behind the church). Bring your questions and your concerns.

#### What will Fr. Jeff be doing?

The Priest Personnel office has informed me that I will be reassigned as associate for another family of parishes. I am not permitted to say where I will be until the Archbishop completes the assignment for all of the families. I had hoped to complete my ministry at St. Mary when I reach retirement age in 2025, but alas, that is not going to happen. As Geoffrey Chaucer remarks in the prologue to the tale by another Clerk of Oxenford: "Time and tide wait for no man."

When my time at St. Mary ends on 30 June 2022 I will have been associated with the parish for 49 years. My first interaction came as a freshman at Miami University in 1973. Through undergraduate and graduate school this is the parish I chose. During that time it was the people of St. Mary that caused me to consider a vocation to priesthood. Five years after ordination I returned to St. Mary as parochial vicar--associate pastor with Fr. Michael Beatty of blessed memory. After 2 years in hospital ministry and as administrator of a couple of parishes I was named pastor of St. Julie Billiart in Hamilton and dean of the Hamilton Deanery. The position of dean connected me again with St. Mary as the deanery worked through a previous strategic planning program---Ministry 2000. My departure on June 30th will complete my 15th year as your pastor. I count this time as the greatest blessing of my priestly ministry. Thank you.

#### Hopes and dreams...

When I served here with Fr. Beatty he was fond of noting that St. Mary is blessed with very competent and expert parishioners. Our farmers know their farms. Our university faculty are all experts in their fields. Our townsfolk know their businesses, and even our students are rising talents in their chosen fields.

The coming years will bring great changes to all of the families of parishes in the archdiocese. I am confident that St. Mary will be a real blessing to its own family. You have the skills and talents you will need to face the future. You will also always have my prayers!

## The Synod on Synodality

Pope Francis has called for a synod to discuss how the Church can be more synodal.

This synod will take place in Rome during October, 2023. As a first step, the Holy Father wants to hear Holy Spirit led input from all the people. He has called all the dioceses throughout the world to convene "consultative" meetings, to be completed by April of 2022.

# What is a Synod?

Simply put, a synod is a meeting or assembly of church leaders.

In the West, "synod" and "council" are synonymous, and Ecumenical Councils are the most authoritative expressions of formal synodal gatherings, always in communion with and under the authority of the Pope. In 1965, Pope St. Paul VI established the Synod of Bishops as a permanent institution of the Catholic Church, setting the stage for the renewed understanding of synodality being emphasized and explored today.

## What IS Synodality?

"Synodality" is best understood as the process by which synods make decisions.

It is a way of helping the Church to achieve its mission by the collaborative input of its members. Not just the Pope or Bishops or priests, but ALL the people of God.

A synodal approach involves hearing from all the baptized in discerning the will of God on how to best accomplish the mission of the Church. This includes all Catholics, regardless of how engaged they are in the faith, as well as non-Catholic Christians, the young, the old, the disabled, the poor, migrants and immigrants, women, religious, the laity and the clergy. Synodality calls us all to journey together, to gather in assembly. All are invited to listen to one another in order to hear the promptings of the Holy Spirit.

"Synodality represents the main road for the Church, called to renew herself under the action of the Spirit and by listening to the Word. The ability to imagine a different future for the Church and her institutions, in keeping with the mission she has received, depends largely on the decision to initiate processes of listening, dialogue, and community discernment, in which each and every person can participate and contribute." (Preparatory Document, 12)

# What is the Synod on Synodality?

The Synod on Synodality is a two year process of praying, listening, dialoguing, and discerning which will culminate in the celebration of the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in October 2023. Every diocese in the world will participate.

A synodal Church, in announcing the Gospel, "journeys together." The Synod on Synodality seeks to answer: How is this "journeying together" happening today in your local Church?

What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our "journeying together"?

Did you know that when you were baptized you were called to a priestly, prophetic, and kingly mission to bring the good news of salvation and discipleship to all? This duty then does not lie strictly with the clergy. The Holy Father recognizes that the Holy Spirit dwells within His people. So, coming together to discuss how to better further the mission of the Church is where the Holy Spirit can work powerfully.

The ten themes that will be discussed:

- · Companions: In our local Church, who are those who "walk together"?
- · Listening: How is God speaking to us through voices we sometimes ignore?
- Speaking Out: What enables or hinders speaking up courageously, candidly, civilly, and responsibly in our local Church and in society?
- Celebration: How do prayer and liturgical celebrations inspire and guide our common life and mission in our community?
- Sharing Responsibility: As missionary disciples, how is every baptized person called to participate in the mission of the Church?
- Dialogue: To what extent do diverse peoples in our community come together for dialogue?
- Ecumenism: What relationships does our Church community have with members of other Christian traditions and denominations?
- Participation: How does our Church community identify the goals to be pursued, the way to reach them, and the steps to be taken?
- Discerning: What methods and processes do we use in decision-making?
- Forming Ourselves: How does our church community form people to be more capable of "walking together," listening to one another, participating in mission, and engaging in dialogue?
