

Sunday of the Word of God

Pope Francis has directed that this Third Sunday in Ordinary Time be set aside by the whole Church as a "Sunday of the Word of God". He issued that directive as part of an Apostolic Letter. (See *Aperuit Illis* which you can find in its entirety on the Vatican website: www.vatican.va.)

> May the Sunday of the Word of God help his people to grow in religious and intimate familiarity with the sacred Scriptures. For as the sacred author taught of old: "This word is very near to you: it is in your mouth and in your heart for your observance" (Dt 30:14).

Do you have a Bible in your home? Do you read regularly?

- •It is hard to sit down to read a collection as far ranging in history and kinds of literature as the Bible from cover to cover. Fortunately, there are many resources, commentaries (and, yes, even apps) to help you become a regular student of the Bible.
- •Start small. Look at the readings we use in the liturgy. We note the readings for the week in the bulletin every week. You can go to the bishops' website uscoborg and follow the calendar. Readings are available in English, Spanish, audio editions and with video commentary. Read aloud to yourself.
- •Ask questions! Fr. Jeff loves to help. Let's talk.
- •Listen to the word proclaimed at Mass.
- •Pick a single book of the Bible to study, perhaps for a season. This year our Sunday texts come mainly from the Gospel of Matthew. Why not sit down and read Matthew at one sitting to try and glimpse his theme and purpose as an evangelist?
- •Looking for a baptismal or first Communion gift? How about an age appropriate children's Bible?
- •Pray. Since the Bible is the Word of God, go to the source of inspiration. Sit with the reading and ask the Lord how to apply his word to your life.
