## WELCOME HOME

Dear Parish Family,

Earlier this year, Pope Francis announced that he was establishing the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, which is to be celebrated each year on the fourth Sunday of July to coincide with the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, Jesus' grandparents. The theme for this inaugural observance is "I am with you always." (Mt 28:20). These are the very words Jesus utters to his disciples before he ascends into heaven. These are the same words that our Holy Father shares with Grandparents and the Elderly. In his letter to them, he writes, "The whole Church is close to you—to us—and cares about you, loves you and does not want to leave you alone!"

In a statement from the Vatican, "I am with you always" is also a promise of closeness and hope that young and old can mutually share. Not only are grandchildren and young people called upon to be present in the lives of older people, but older people and grandparents also have a mission of evangelization, proclamation and prayer and of encouraging young people in their faith." This annual event can be "a gift to the whole church" and one that emphasizes the pastoral care of the elderly as "a priority that can no longer be postponed by any Christian community." In the encyclical, 'Fratelli Tutti,' the Pope Francis reminds us that no one is saved alone. With this in mind, we must

treasure the spiritual and human wealth that has been handed down from generation to generation.

We have a Grandparents in the U.S. observed each September on the Sunday after Labor Day. Like Mother's Day and Father's Day, it is a day to celebrate and show our love and appreciate these important people in our lives. This new observance for Grandparents and the Elderly is not only a worldwide celebration; it is also one that encourages the grandparents and grandchildren, the elderly and young people to interact with each other. It can make real for all God's promise that, "I am with you always."

## Worship Aid for July 17-18




