





## WELCOME HOME

Dear Parish Family,

I have been reading articles and attended a webinar hosted by Bishop Bonnar concerning how to restart or reboot life, ministry and worship in the parish after the pandemic. Unfortunately, Covid-19 is still around and it might be a bit too soon to say the pandemic is behind us. The drawing out of the pandemic should not hinder us from preparing ourselves for how we are going to reboot things here. According to what I have heard and read, we need to take time to carefully and thoughtfully plan.

The diocesan webinar entitled, "Hitting the Reset Button: Transitioning for the Pandemic" was presented by Fr. Ron Witherup, S.S., a leading Catholic Bible scholar and superior general of the Sulpician Order. Fr. Ron offered ten points to help us prepare to return to a new normal. The ten points are, 1. Be prepared, 2. Be Patient, 3. Keep and Communicate a Historical Perspective, 4. Re-establish our Eucharistic Identity, 5. Reflect on Social Media, 6. Rediscover An Ethical Perspective, 7. The New Evangelization, 8. We Need To Think Positive, 9. Rediscover the Lament, and 10. Foster Hope in the World.

There is a lot there, but Fr. Ron's offerings are very helpful and rich in scripture and tradition. I do not have room to share it all here. It does tell us it will be beneficial to prepare and have a plan and not wait for things to happen. It is going to take some time and we need to be patient; patience is a virtue and biblical value. We can learn from history. This pandemic we have experienced is not the first time people have experienced a pandemic. Most important now is re-establishing our Eucharistic identity. We are people of the Word and Sacrament and the Eucharist is the source and summit of the Church's Faith. Again, this is not something that can happen overnight and it cannot happen by sitting and waiting. We can pray; we can be patient; we can trust in God and ask for help and strength.

## MEETING OF MAY 24, 2021

### Discussion of Recent Activities in the Parish

Fr. Tom stated that the scaffolding for the painting project has been moved forward now to the front of the Church and necessary repairs of cracks and sanding are taking place. They promise to be completed by June 13<sup>th</sup> our Feast Day. The painters have done very well with the backside of the Church considering that a few of them were still finishing up at St. Louis Parish. Fr. Tom has gotten positive feedback so far regarding the light blue ceiling and elegant stencil work that has been done in the Church. We will now have a company prepare and print our weekly bulletins. They have been done in-house by office staff for a long time. This will allow more flexibility and be a savings for the parish. The lease on our color copier and the supplies needed have gotten pricier. Two national companies, Diocesan Publications and Liturgical Publications, run bulletins for parishes. The bulletin will still be set up through Microsoft Publisher in the office by Michele Higham and Kelli Karns with all the necessary articles, notices and columns to be submitted no later than Monday afternoon in order to have it sent into the company electronically. They in turn will have it delivered by UPS by Thursday or Friday so that it is available for the weekend. There will be an increase in the cost of the sponsor ads on the back of the bulletin, but overall will be a savings. Our Feast Day is coming up on June 13<sup>th</sup>.

### Report of Consejo Activities

Deacon Alfredo stated that Consejo are planning a meeting for May 30<sup>th</sup>. He has suggested some agenda items to them for discussion. The foremost item would be to motivate more of the Hispanics to get vaccinated, and to openly invite them to attend and

participate in the upcoming Feast Day activities. He also suggested to have a recently completed RCIA candidate share in the welcoming speech at the beginning of our Feast Day celebration before Mass begins. Cristina Hernandez stated that 42 Hispanics were vaccinated this past weekend. Fr. Tom stated that Beacon Charitable Pharmacy reached out to us to help provide the Covid vaccinations to those in need.

### Report from Fr. Tom

Fr. Tom reported that the two deaneries of Stark County met at Christ the Servant Parish Hall to present the Bishop's initiative, as part of his Pastoral Letter, of the Church being of service and of his wanting each deanery to do a Needs Assessment. Every parish within each deanery would form a committee of 5-7 people who would be assigned the task of looking for needs within the whole community in which they reside in. This is so that we as a Church community can offer some support, solutions or help. All those committees in the deanery would then have a meeting to share their ideas, and from those ideas they would choose 3-5 of them that seemed most feasible. They would work with Catholic Charities to try to implement them, and they would be coordinated so that all parishes could participate. There is no definite timeline at this point, but hopefully by September parishes can begin to form committees as we move out of this past year of Covid. This is a process that will take time. All the parishes are having difficulty with their ministries in getting volunteers, and former committees they once had have since been disbanded.

### Additional business

Karen Hutnick questioned whether or not our parish will be participating in the collection of peanut butter and jelly for our neighboring church. Fr. Tom

stated that it is usually coordinated with our Social Concerns committee, and that he will get an answer for her about the project. She also questioned the timing of the Habitat House Projects. Fr. Tom stated that the volunteer dates are July 24<sup>th</sup>, August 14<sup>th</sup> and August 21<sup>st</sup>. Drywall day will be July 24<sup>th</sup> which will need 4 to 6 volunteers who are older than 18. Porch railing day will be August 14<sup>th</sup> which will need 4 volunteers who must again be over 18 years of age. Painting will be done August 21<sup>st</sup> and 6 to 8 volunteers will be needed. They may be at least 14 years of age. The project will be advertised in our weekly bulletin. Tim Spitale stated that his wife, Maggie is in need of new Catechist's who would be willing to teach the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Program to our children. There is a great need for them. She hopes to train them over the summer so they are prepared by this fall. Deacon Alfredo asked if anyone else had any interest in the Diversity Training Class that he will be offering. Cristina Hernandez stated that several of our youth will be celebrating their graduation at the upcoming weekend Mass. She is planning to take them kayaking as a way of doing something special for them. Gary Ranalli stated that the raffle tickets sold for our Feast Day celebration will be our major fundraiser this year. He feels that we will need to sell 400 to 500 tickets in order for the Church to benefit.


