An Easter Message from the Cathedral and Parish Staff

Today we celebrate Easter Sunday, the pivotal Feast of the entire Church year. It is our opportunity to give a renewed perspective to the whole of our life. Often as we find ourselves confronted by death, sickness and inequity of every kind we find ourselves saying, "It's just not fair." We wonder how "good" people seem so often to end up in worse shape than the "bad." We might even wonder what we, or others we love have done wrong to deserve this kind of "treatment" from God in this life. Often we cannot make sense of it this life. Often we cannot make sense of it.
On Good Friday as we envisioned Jesus on the cross we could

not help but realize that he too did not live the easy life. Indeed, bad

things happened to him! We wonder how a loving God could have put his own Son into that terrible position. Even more importantly, we wonder how Jesus kept his love of the Father intact through it all.

Ultimately, I think it is about his vision. Easter is the Feast which asks us to see our life from a different perspective. It is primarily about trust in the promises of God. It is the Feast that reveals to us that there is actually more to life than mosts the even. Josus believed with his whole. is actually more to life than meets the eye. Jesus believed with his whole being that his Father would take care of Him. His trust in the care that being that his Father would take care of Him. His trust in the care that His Father gave Him is often so different from our understanding of God's care. If we are honest, we often define "proof" of the Father's care for us as a world where nothing bad will ever happen to us or our friends, and everyone will be happy and safe without any difficulty or fear, and then die peacefully in their sleep at age 110. That is just not the case.

Jesus came to show us that the Father's care is for our eternal soul. We read in Matthew 10:28; "Do not fear those who kill the body but are unable to kill the soul; but rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell." God's concern is that we be happy for all eternity in the kingdom of heaven. What happens here on earth is a part of the broken human condition. Jesus suffered and died to prove to us

of the broken human condition. Jesus suffered and died to prove to us that even death cannot take away our spirit and life. Jesus' resurrection is evidence for all believers that there is something beyond the veil of death. Not all is made whole in this life and, ultimately, something better than we ever imagined will happen to us when our time here is over. The Feast of Easter shouts out to us that it is eternal life that awaits us. Beyond death, there is no more sadness, no more pain, and no more fear. As we celebrate this Feast, let us find that promise of joy in the midst of everything we are confronted with in the world.

In conclusion, I would like to thank everyone who worked so hard to make this Lent and Easter so beautiful and meaningful. This list is long and includes Bishop Kulick, Fr. Pujol, Deacon Bill, as well as our parish staff, all of our ministers, greeters and everyone who attended our services to share her or his faith as the Body of Christ gathered together. We truly have had a blessed season of







Sponsorship Forms

Forms for parish members to serve as sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation can be completed in the Parish Office or with a priest at a weekend Mass. To act as a sponsor, you must be at least 16 years old, a practicing Catholic who has received Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. If married, it must be within the guidelines of the Catholic Church. Call and speak with any of the ladies in the office, our office hours are 10 AM - 3 PM.

By appointment only. Contact Katie Zuzik in the Parish Office at least three months in advance of the Baptism. A class for parents is required to reflect on the meaning of the sacrament, review the Ceremony and to highlight the importance of family commitment to practicing the Catholic Faith. 


