NOTE FROM A BOARD MEMBER

I joined the Board of Directors of the Catawba County Council on Aging in 1983 and have supported the Council's programs since then. Recently I completed a project that may be of interest to many of my fellow Catawba County senior citizens. The project's minimal cost was a gift from one of my sons and is based on the premise that everyone's life is a story worth telling, especially to one's children, grandchildren and to future generations of your family.

Contrast what follows with the options we senior citizens have to pass on information to the next generations. With oral history information gathering, a microphone is placed in front of the subject and questions are asked. He or she almost immediately responds. They do not have time to think of their response. It can be short or even non-existent. Another option we have is recording our thoughts in a diary. I didn't find this appealing to me or the recipients. It left a lot to be desired.

The option I chose was neither of these and it went like this. Each week for the past year I would receive a question (which was selected by my son) via e-mail. They dealt with such topics as:

What were your favorite toys as a child? What was your mom like when you were a child? What are some of your childhood memories of your father? Did you have any pets growing up?

In my particular life there were questions regarding my college years, my spouse, my jobs, the houses we lived in, my hobbies, my beliefs, etc. No stone has been left unturned. Pictures were added to the text and subsequently a book has been printed which I and my children have received. Everything has been documented. 


LIVING WILLS & HEALTH CARE POWER OF ATTORNEY

A **living will** is a legal document that allows you to make prior decisions about whether your life should be prolonged by certain medical procedures. A **health care power of attorney** is a legal document in which you give someone power to make medical decisions for you if you are not competent or if you are unable to communicate.
