YEAR OF SAINT JOSEPH & THE FAMILY

To mark the occasion of the 150th anniversary of the declaration of St. Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church, Pope Francis has proclaimed a "Year of Saint Joseph" from December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021. In our diocese the date is extended to March 19, 2022.

Pope Francis has also called for the Year of the Family from 19th March 2021 - 26th June 2022 to celebrate the fifth anniversary of Pope Francis' apostolic exhortation, Amoris Laeti, on the pastoral care of families.

Dedication of Our Families to the Holy Family

To celebrate the Year of St. Joseph and the Family, we continue to pray each day for one of our Parish Families. The day chosen for your family will be notified through a letter (How? Surprise!) and a reminder call. We will also list the names of the families in the bulletin each week. I request our parish families to join me to pray during your family prayer time.

ST. PETER CANISIUS | FEAST DAY DECEMBER 21



Born in Holland, St. Peter Canisius (May 8, 1521 – December 21, 1597) was a preacher, teacher, and writer throughout his whole life. At the age of 19, he received a master's degree from the university at Cologne. Soon afterwards, St. Peter met Peter Faber, the first disciple of Ignatius of Loyola, who influenced him so much that he eventually joined the Society of Jesus.

St. Peter Canisius founded colleges and seminaries, served as a missionary, cared for the sick or imprisoned, and wrote close to eight volumes of letters — many about St. Cyril of Alexandria and St. Leo the Great.

A man blessed with many talents, St. Peter Canisius is a wonderful example of a man who developed his talents to further God's work here on earth.

Week 4

EMMANUEL IS COMING

Blessed to Have Hope and Faith

Luke 1:39-45



When Mary visits Elizabeth, she exclaims, "Blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord" (v. 45). Blessed was Mary for her hope and her faith. Blessed are we to have this same hope and faith in the fulfillment of God's promise to his followers!

The way that Mary's faith was fulfilled was amazing. Jesus' birth wasn't quite the royal birth that one would expect for the King of Kings. Instead, it was quite radically the opposite. As the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* notes, "In this poverty heaven's glory was made manifest" (525, see also Lk 2:6–7).


It makes you think, doesn't it? Perhaps your faith is shaken when things don't seem to be going according to plan. The situation of the Lord's birth certainly wouldn't match most parents' hopes. But God has a plan, and he never fails. And what joy this brings! Even in the dark of winter or the dark of a spiritual winter, we can find joy in the fulfillment of our hope and faith.

Our souls can magnify the Lord — he is coming!

PRAYER

Lord God, open our hearts so that we can receive the gift of the Lord with peace and with joy. Help us see the many ways the presence of Jesus in our lives will comfort us, form us, bless us, and challenge us. Give us the courage to carry Jesus with us all the days of our lives. Amen.

SAINT JOSEPH

If anyone had to rely on a feeling that things will turn out for the best, it was Saint Joseph. He took in Mary, risking his reputation and accepting a responsibility that he at first didn't understand. But he had hope and faith, and he forged on to serve as the earthly father and protector of the Savior.

Saint Joseph's trust was called upon again when Jesus was a baby. An angel appeared to Saint Joseph in a dream and told him to take Mary and Jesus to Egypt to escape King Herod, who was seeking to kill the newborn king (see Mt 2:13–18). Joseph didn't call up his friends in Jerusalem to confirm or Google places to stay in Egypt. He fled with faith, believing that what he desired — safety for his family — would be fulfilled.

Like Saint Joseph, we can proceed with the quiet confidence that he exhibited so well in such a tremendous role.

The Nativity Scene

The first Christmas crèche was set up in a cave in Italy by Saint Francis of Assisi in 1223. When people from the village came to see the manger with hay, an ox, and a donkey, Saint Francis spoke to them about the newborn babe in Bethlehem. Take time during this Christmas season to visit the Christmas crèche in your parish church. Pray to the baby Jesus for your special intentions.

A CHRISTMAS RESOLUTION

Promise yourself that you will set aside some quiet time during the final week of Advent to prepare a place in your heart for the Christ Child. Imagine yourself in the stable at Bethlehem. Picture yourself holding the Christ Child. Allow feelings of peace and joy to fill your heart.
