



For All of Our Fathers



LITURGY SPOTLIGHT

Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. With each Mass that is celebrated, Jesus, Son of God and Son of Mary, comes down upon the Altar. When he comes to our table, he is living; Body, Soul and Divinity. Known as Corpus Christi before the calendar reform of Vatican II, today's solemnity was first observed in several dioceses of Belgium before being extended to the universal church in 1264. It was originally kept on Thursday after Trinity Sunday as a link to the Holy Thursday celebration because, as it was said, the Church's joy at the gift of the Eucharist was overshadowed on Holy Thursday by the sorrow of Good Friday. The 1969 Calendar reform combined the old observances of Corpus Christi and the Precious Blood (formerly July 1) into one solemnity that celebrates the mystery of the Lord's enduring presence in our midst through the gift of his body and blood given in the Eucharistic liturgy. The solemnity is moved to Sunday in places where it is not a holy day of obligation.

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ Jesus our Lord,

This weekend we reflect on the great Gift of the Eucharist, and our horizontal relationship, through Jesus, with one another and with the world. This year is special because it begins a three-year National Eucharistic Revival in the United States. The first year is the diocesan year. Bishop Daniel Thomas has designated Pat Oedy-Murray as the Diocesan Point-Person. A diocesan team will be formed to curate ideas and resources for parishes to utilize in year two, which will be the parish year.

The mission of the National Eucharistic Revival is "to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist." The Revival envisions "a movement of Catholics across the United States, healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist—and sent out in mission 'for the life of the world. (John 6: 51)" The mission and vision of this National Eucharistic Revival overflows with hope for a life changing experience of the Holy Eucharist, especially of the Mass, in the lives of all Catholics. The effort of this program is to promote Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and reach out to parishioners and Catholics who have fallen away from the Eucharist and their active faith.

We will have our Traditional Corpus Christi Procession this Sunday following the 10:30 am Mass. The procession will go around the block and back into the church for Benediction. At each corner of the block, there will be a brief Scripture Reading, prayer and blessing on that quadrant of the parish.

Let's make this truly historic by having a large participation. Even if you attend other Masses, please plan to join us. It only takes about 30-40 minutes. Imagine what blessings we may receive!
