

### LITURGY SPOTLIGHT


"Ezra the scribe stood on a wood pulpit which they had made for the purpose...and Ezra opened the book in the sight of all the people" Nehemiah 8:4-5).



The ambo is a stationary reading desk used for the proclamation of the Word of God. Somewhat elevated, it is designed with care and nobly crafted. The ambo reflects the dignity and sacredness of the Word. Sometimes it is veiled with the appropriate liturgical color. On occasions of festive solemnity, it is fitting to decorate the ambo with a simplicity that reflects its purpose. The ambo is reserved for the readings, the Gospel, and the Exultet (Easter Proclamation). It may be used for the homily and Prayer of the Faithful. Commentaries and announcements are

made from another suitable place. For one who listens with reverent attention, the Word becomes prayer burning in the heart and desire for the Eucharist (notice the symbol of Word and Fire on our ambo). The word announced from the ambo is fulfilled and given in the Eucharist.
