BROWN BAG MEAL PROGRAM SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL HOMELESS SHELTER

"Lord, when did we ever see you hungry and not help you?"

Looking for a project, one in which you can help people in need? Does your son/daughter need to complete Community Service time? Looking for a Family Project? St. Vincent de Paul, St. Henry Conference has put together a brown bag meal program for the Homeless shelter. The meals consist of the following:

- Hearty sandwich, ham, turkey or bologna, cheese optional, no condiments on sandwich, packets are distributed at the shelter. The sandwich should be at least two ounces of meat, could be the main meal of the day.
- A salty treat and a sweet treat. (chips, granola bar etc.)
- · Piece of fruit or packet of sliced fruit.
- · Small water or fruit juice packet & napkin.
- Staple the bag shut and write the date on the bag it was made.

These meals will be refrigerated for a short time before being distributed to the shelter guests. These meals go to shelter guests who have employment for lunch, guests who miss the scheduled meals at the shelter due to Doctor's appointments etc. Also Children who may not like the scheduled meal at the shelter, or people that come in off the streets who are hungry that miss the scheduled serving. So, you can see how this program has a real need.

Drop off of the brown bag meals will be on specific Wednesday afternoons in front of the Parish Meeting Room in the Church parking lot while school is out. Meals should be made up and donated in lots of 10 or 20, appreciate all donations! For the remaining months of the year, drop off dates will be between 3:30- 4 p.m. in front of the Parish meeting room by St. Henry Church on assigned dates. Participate when you can, it's not an obligation. Please place bags in a box deep enough to cover the bags for protection of the contents and easy transporting.

As I stated at the beginning this is a great project for Families. One Family that participates draws pictures on the bags, another has the children pack the bags prior to the delivery day, then on the delivery day the sandwiches are made.

KNOWN occurs on the second and fourth Saturdays of each month, at the Apple Street Shelter for Women & Families (120 W. Apple St. in Dayton).



RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Be Ready for God to "Stop By"

In my experience, most people can be divided into two groups: those who are old enough to remember when you kept food on hand for company, and those who aren't.

For those of you in the latter group, let me explain. Before text messaging and social media made us all unconditionally, mercilessly reachable, people would do this thing called "stopping by." They would be passing by a friend's house, maybe on the way home from work or shopping, and they would just ... stop. With no warning. No notice whatsoever. "I was just in the neighborhood," they would say. I remember my mother and I would do this on many a Saturday. It wasn't an everyday occurrence, but it was common enough that you had to be ready.

"Crazy," you might exclaim. "People just appeared on your doorstep? How did you cope with the uncertainty?" Well, most of us had moms who kept a little something on hand to eat or drink that was extra nice, just in case anyone stopped by. That way, we were always ready.

Today's readings are about a lot of things: prayer, hope, redemptive suffering. They're about what it means to be a Christian, and not just what it means to do Christian things.

Most of all, though, they're about readiness. If God showed up at your door, would you be ready for Him? Would you be ready for what He gives you, or what He takes away? Would you be ready for Him to interrupt the plans you have for yourself? To disrupt the idea you carry in your mind of what a servant or a steward is supposed to

Read your Bible. Say your rosary. Go to Mass. Get to Confession. Talk to God — every day, not just when you think you need Him. That way, you are always ready.
