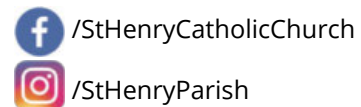

From the Pastor's Desk

Why do the priests rotate? You may not realize it, but we now have five priests rotating through the family of parishes: Fathers Jerome Bishop, David Howard, Jim Manning and I, who are on full-time duty, and Father Tom Shearer, pastor emeritus of Our Lady of Good Hope and St. Henry, who generously continues to help out as needed. The reasons for this: you deserve a chance to get to know those of us who are unfamiliar, and we need to get to know you as well. Also, I wanted it to be clear that we all serve the whole family of parishes, not just for this or that parish.

Being consistent with the Holy Eucharist. Because of this, there will be some things that need to be consistent at all three sites to avoid confusion. One of them has to do with how we send the Most Blessed Sacrament from Mass, to those who are unable to attend. The direction from the bishops is as follows: after the distribution of Holy Communion to those attending Mass, and after the priest prays the post-communion prayer, those who will take the Eucharist to the sick and homebound are invited forward. They receive pyxes (i.e., small, closed containers blessed for this purpose) and, in a few words from the priest or deacon, are sent immediately with the Blessed Sacrament. They go right away to their visits to the sick, not waiting for the final blessing. This rite of sending serves a valuable purpose: it reminds all at Mass of the many people who are absent, perhaps more than we might realize.

If you prefer, you are welcome to touch base with the priest (or deacon if present) after Mass. But I do ask that folks not present a pyx in the communion line. Rather, bring the pyx before Mass to the priest, or else, after Mass. For me, in particular, this allows me to learn more about you and the folks to whom you are bringing the Eucharist.

What else is Father Fox up to? This week, I began getting to know folks at Bishop Leibold School as we are already making plans for the fall. Although Father Manning serves on the school board, I think it is important that I attend meetings when I can. Also, I am putting together a meeting soon with all three pastoral advisory councils. And I continue to get acquainted with our parish staffs and they are getting accustomed to a new fox in the parish house.

From the Safe Environment Office

With summer activities in full swing, we would like to remind all parish/school employees and volunteers of the requirements of the Decree on Child Protection. **All employees and volunteers** are required to have completed The Archdiocese of Cincinnati SafeParish™: Protecting Children From Sexual Abuse - Arch. of Cincinnati Edition training or child protection training under the prior child protection platform (VIRTUS). **In addition, employees** are required to complete an online background check, manual fingerprint, and B4 form once prior to beginning employment. Ohio Department of Education licensees may have additional requirements and should check with their school office or athletic departments if there are any questions. **Volunteers** are required to complete an online background check prior to volunteering with youth, which can take 2-4 weeks to complete. **Employees and volunteers are required to stay current in completing SafeParish™ quarterly bulletins.**

As of July 8, there are 10,000+ SafeParish user accounts that are pending due to lack of compliance in completing the quarterly bulletins. With the school year beginning for most in August, please make sure to complete the quarterly bulletins or you will not be able to work/volunteer with youth until your SafeParish account is approved. "Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick and visited you? And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me'." Matthew 25: 37-40.

SHARING GOD'S LOVE WITH THOSE WE SERVE

Diana found herself in an unimaginable position, out of work and injured in an auto accident, she called our St. Henry helpline for food, personal care items, and utility assistance. St. Henry conference was able to deliver bags of groceries to her home. Diana stated on the phone that many years ago, she worked for a nonprofit that assisted those in need, and one day she prayed to God asking if she would ever need assistance, would He come to her aid? Diana truly believes that these many years later her prayer has been answered. *The hungry are fed and the sick are visited.*

A grandmother by the name of Lisa and her 13-year-old granddaughter relocated to Ohio for a new job opportunity but after arriving, Lisa's hours were reduced. Your loving hearts, along with a wonderful local non profit, enabled us to provide furniture to create a home. *A stranger is welcomed.*

Gina, a grandmother caring for a child with a severe developmental disorder is assisted with clothing and books for stimulation. *The needy are clothed.*

Susan is a disabled adult who cannot drive. She has been able to get by for years on her disability payment by managing her money carefully, provided her mother paid her quarterly water bill. Her mother could not pay the most recent bill and Susan's water was shut off. Because of your gifts, her water was turned on again within a day. *The thirsty are given drink.*

Inflation has impacted all of us, especially our neighbors who were already struggling. We are now averaging 25 calls a week but only have funds to help 7 of those 25. **Our next collection is July 31.** We humbly ask you to give what you can, no matter how small. If you receive envelopes one is provided for SVdP, if not just write St Vincent de Paul on a plain white envelope and place donation inside. Thank you, St. Henry parishioners, for your loving hearts and ongoing spirit of generosity. Since January over 400 neighbors have experienced a renewed sense of hope in humanity due to your kindness. At every conference meeting and in our daily lives, *we give thanks and pray for you.*

We received 223 calls and were able to assist 162 of our neighbors, volunteering 523 hours and driving 897 miles.

**OHIO RIGHT TO LIFE STATEMENT ON GOVERNOR MIKE
DEWINE'S HEARTBEAT LAW EXECUTIVE ORDER
JUNE 24, 2022**

This Executive Order is in response to the federal court lifting the injunction on Ohio's Heartbeat Law earlier today. Attorney General Dave Yost filed a legal request to lift the injunction due to the United States Supreme Court ruling in the Dobbs v Jackson Women's Health Organization case.

"The Heartbeat Law has been sitting on the sidelines in federal court which could have saved countless lives over the past several years. Starting right now no baby with a beating heart can be aborted in the state of Ohio," said Ohio Right to Life President Mike Gonidakis. "We are grateful that our Attorney General Dave Yost acted swiftly and got the injunction lifted."

Director of Communications Elizabeth Whitmarsh stated, "Many would have been lackadaisical on this, but because we elected strong pro-life leaders, thousands of lives are protected from abortion starting this very moment. Our Attorney General and Governor saw an opportunity to save lives and they immediately got it done. This is true leadership and should be a model for the how we move forward."

Founded in 1967, Ohio Right to Life, with more than 45 chapters and local affiliates, is Ohio's oldest and largest grassroots pro-life organization. Recognized as the flagship of the pro-life movement in Ohio, ORTL works through legislation and education to promote and defend innocent human life from conception to natural death.

THIS WEEK IS NFP AWARENESS WEEK

God designed marriage as an "intimate partnership of life and love" (see *Gaudium et spes*, no. 48). ... Marriage is oriented to the good of the spouses and to the creation and nurture of new human life (see *Gaudium et spes*, no. 48). Making decisions therefore, about when and how many children to have in marriage is a sacred responsibility that God has entrusted to husband and wife. ...

The Catholic Church supports the methods of **Natural Family Planning (NFP)** because they respect God's design for married love. In fact, NFP represents the only authentic approach to family planning available to husbands and wives because these methods can be used to both attempt or avoid pregnancy. When learning about NFP, it is important to know that:

1. Natural Family Planning is an umbrella term for certain methods used to achieve and avoid conception. These methods are based on the observation of the naturally occurring signs and symptoms of the fertile and infertile phases of a woman's menstrual cycle. ... No drugs, devices, or surgical procedures are used to avoid pregnancy. ...

2. NFP reflects the dignity of the human person within the context of marriage and family life, promotes openness to life, and recognizes the value of the child. By respecting the love-giving and life-giving natures of marriage, NFP can enrich the bond between husband and wife. (Standards for Diocesan Natural Family Planning Ministry, p. 23)

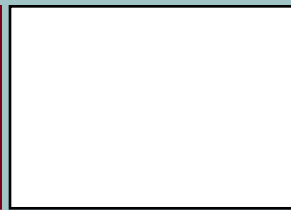

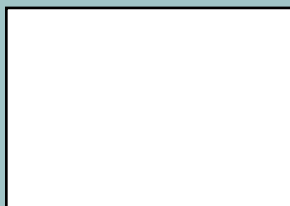

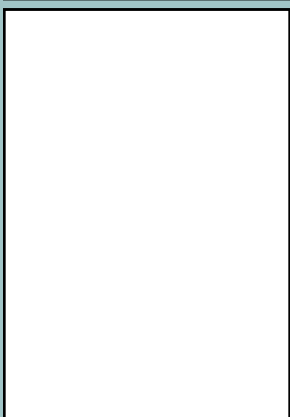
