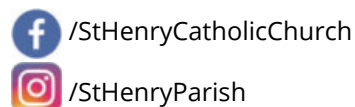

St. Mary of the Assumption offers the Catholic in Recovery ministry that seeks to serve those suffering from addictions and unhealthy attachments: alcoholism, drug addiction, pornography addiction, sex and relationship addiction, compulsive overeating and food addictions, gambling addiction, and codependency and the impact on family.

Based on the book *The Twelve Steps and the Sacraments* by Scott Weeman, this program combines the successful 12 Step approach created by the founders of Alcoholics Anonymous with the Sacraments and traditions of the Catholic Church. 12 Step programs are self-help meetings where participants admit past mistakes, surrender to a "higher power" and learn to stay sober. From the Pastor's Desk

Adding time for confessions.

I've begun scheduling confessions for Wednesdays at 6:15 pm, at St. Mary, prior to the 7 pm Mass. If the response is good, we can move the start time earlier. Fathers Bishop, Howard, Manning and I are working together and looking for ways to serve you better.

Planning Masses for nearby senior and rehab facilities.

There are a lot of locations in the area comprising our family of parishes, where folks are living or recuperating, but cannot make it to Mass. Before Covid, many of them would have Mass periodically, and with Father Howard's assistance, we're reaching out to them to resume having Mass for them.

Why didn't our Sunday Mass schedule change, while other parishes' did? One big reason is that Father Manning agreed not to retire, which he could have at 74. Instead, he is a "senior vicar," meaning he's not quite full-time, but he's not retired, either. Obviously, he can retire whenever he wants – after 47 years as a priest, he certainly deserves it.

When Father Manning does retire – or when any of us needs to step back – then we will certainly have to revisit our weekend Mass schedule. Father Bishop is 71, I'm 60 and Father Howard – we call him "the kid" – is in his early 50s, but will candidly tell you he has some health issues that slow him down. So very soon, I will be discussing with our pastoral advisory councils how to begin planning for the day we don't have four priests on active duty.

Meeting with Pastoral Councils. By the time you read this, I'll have met the first time with all three of our pastoral advisory councils. I asked them to meet jointly, because given the situation, meeting with each group individually is not practical. There are things I need their help to plan, and that will require everyone being in the room at the same time. If we have to do round-robins between three meetings, that will take forever and wear everyone out.

I'm sorry I can't always say 'yes' to meetings. Whenever a new pastor arrives, everyone comes out of the woodwork, wanting to meet, have a meal, explain a project, and so forth. I've had to decline so many requests, and perhaps should have declined more, but it's a bit awkward. I DO want to meet you; it's why we're having "Meet the Pastor / Q & A with Fr. Fox" gatherings, starting soon.

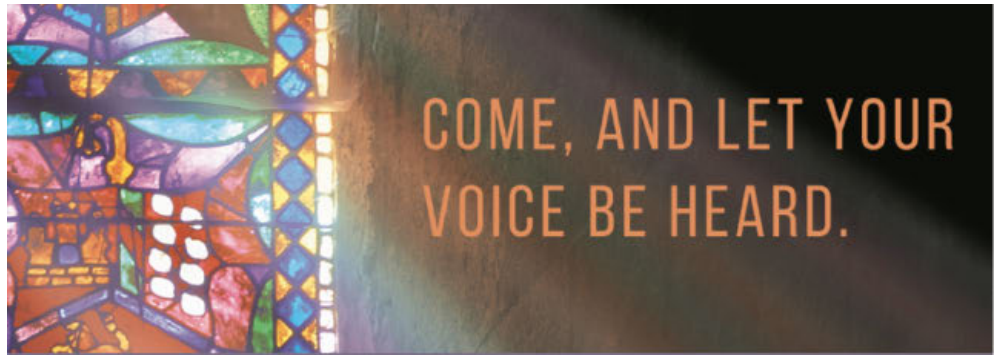

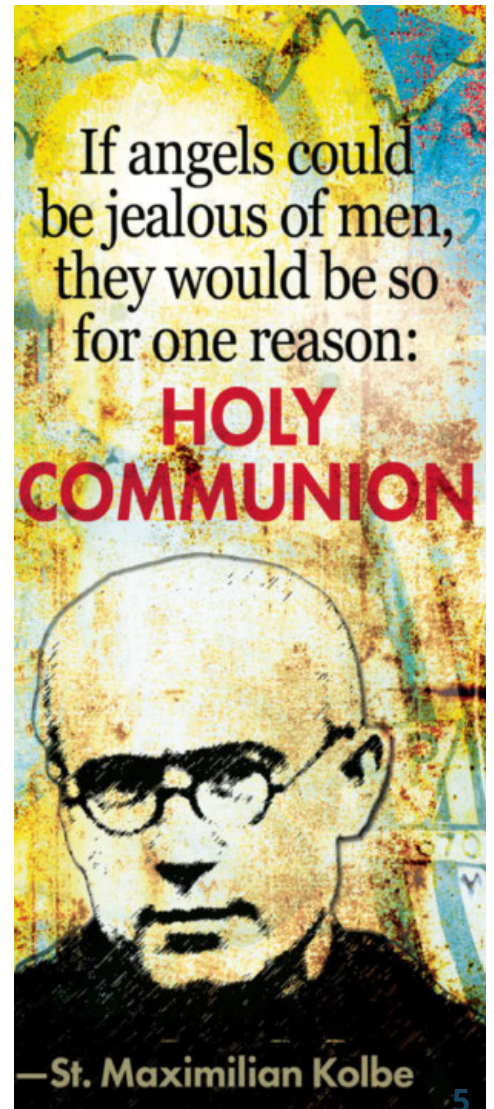
Assumption Concert

SAINT OF THE WEEK: CLARE
FEAST DAY: AUGUST 11



As a girl in 12th century Italy, Clare heard the legendary St. Francis preaching in the square below her family home.

Inspired, Clare snuck away in the middle of the night to join Francis and his followers. Francis cut her hair like the men and gave her a rough tunic and veil to wear. For the sake of propriety, Clare was placed in a Benedictine nun monastery for several years.

As more women were drawn to the simple spirituality, a new order was founded, now known as the Poor Clares.

Despite requests from the pope himself to relax their vow of poverty, Clare stood firm in following the spirit of St. Francis.

Clare's reputation for virtue spread and attracted women -- rich and poor alike -- to the new order that still exists today. -LPI

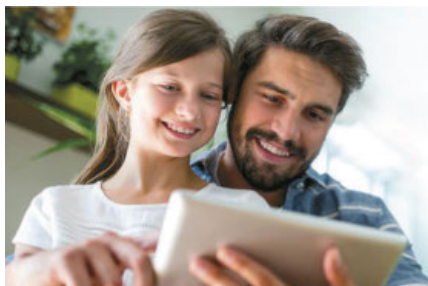
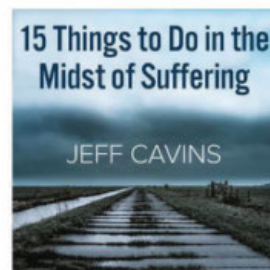

ORDINARY MOMENTS

Think of some of your favorite iconic movies. I'm not talking about the feel-good comedies or the offbeat coming-of-age flicks. I'm talking about the movies that you found had a profound impact on you or made you go "Hmmm."

I'm willing to bet that the plot of this film features some tough moments and difficult scenarios. However happy the ending, at some point, the situation for the protagonist might look awfully hopeless. The script speaks some truth to you about what it is to be human in difficult circumstances. What it means to persevere.

We're attracted to the tension that exists when the hero is besieged. We're captivated by the decisions he makes in the darkest hour of the night when it seems like the dawn will never come. Why? Because we know that feeling so well. This is the essence of our human life on earth: waiting, hoping, doubting — and enduring.

We know the ending to our story, but we don't know when it's coming. We live our whole lives in the rising action of the narrative. Sure, it gets old. Tiresome, even dull. We may start to despair that the climactic scene is coming at all.

But faith is the realization of things hoped for, and evidence of things not seen. We feel it watching a great movie, because we recognize it intuitively: it is faith which earns the happy ending. No one is drawn to the story when the hero gives up or gets tired of waiting for the payoff.

Everyday stewardship is the collection of choices we make while we're waiting, because we are called to action, not idleness, even in our perpetual state of expectation.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

AUGUST 7, 2022 | 19TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

St. Thomas Aquinas reminds us that, “Three things are necessary for the salvation of man: to know what he ought to believe, to know what he ought to desire, and to know what he ought to do.” Everyone is called to work toward their salvation, which is ultimately union with God. Those who take this call seriously must embark upon a journey inward to the deepest recesses of their soul. In the adventure and wonder of that journey, we work out the details of our union with our Beloved. We cling to what we need to believe, remain firm in what we truly desire, and are guided by what we know we have to do. Once we know that our goal is to be one with our Creator, life becomes an exciting expedition to pursue that end. We make necessary preparations, follow the map, and remain on course.

Whenever we really want something, we put our entire selves into achieving it. 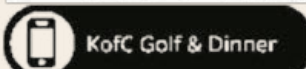

BROWN BAG MEAL PROGRAM

SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL HOMELESS SHELTER

"Lord, when did we ever see you hungry and not help you?"

Looking for a project, one in which you can help people in need? Does your son/daughter need to complete Community Service time? Looking for a Family Project? St. Vincent de Paul, St. Henry Conference has put together a brown bag meal program for the Homeless shelter. The meals consist of the following:

- Hearty sandwich, ham, turkey or bologna, cheese optional, no condiments on sandwich, packets are distributed at the shelter. The sandwich should be at least two ounces of meat, could be the main meal of the day.
- A salty treat and a sweet treat. (chips, granola bar etc.)
- Piece of fruit or packet of sliced fruit.
- Small water or fruit juice packet & napkin.
- Staple the bag shut and write the date on the bag it was made.

These meals will be refrigerated for a short time before being distributed to the shelter guests. These meals go to shelter guests who have employment for lunch, guests who miss the scheduled meals at the shelter due to Doctor's appointments etc. Also Children who may not like the scheduled meal at the shelter, or people that come in off the streets who are hungry that miss the scheduled serving. So, you can see how this program has a real need.

Drop off of the brown bag meals will be on specific Wednesday afternoons in front of the Parish Meeting Room in the Church parking lot while school is out. Meals should be made up and donated in lots of 10 or 20, appreciate all donations! For the remaining months of the year, drop off dates will be between 3:30- 4 p.m. in front of the Parish meeting room by St. Henry Church on assigned dates. Participate when you can, it's not an obligation. Please place bags in a box deep enough to cover the bags for protection of the contents and easy transporting.

As I stated at the beginning this is a great project for Families. One Family that participates draws pictures on the bags, another has the children pack the bags prior to the delivery day, then on the delivery day the sandwiches are made.

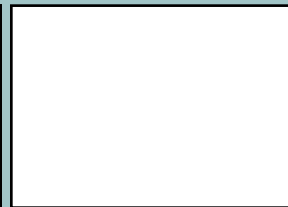
