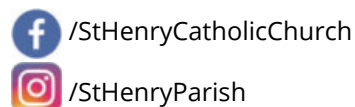

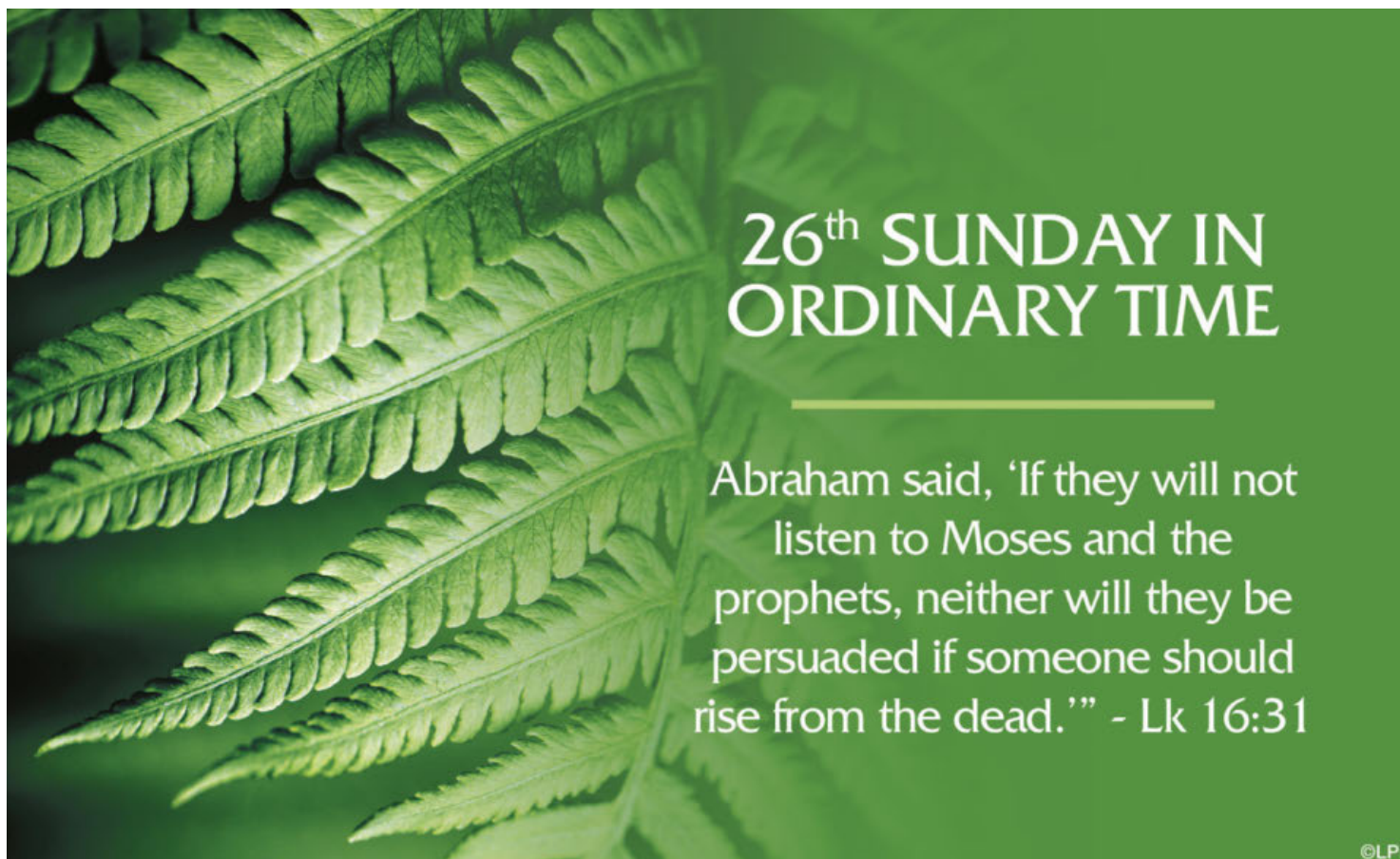

From the Pastor's Desk

Answering Service. I recently contracted with a live answering service to take after-hours calls requesting a priest for a sacramental emergency. When you call after hours and hit the option for "sacramental emergency," you'll get a live operator who will contact one of the priests. It seemed the best way to distribute these calls among four priests at three physical addresses. If you have any difficulties, please let me know.

Repairs and remodels. Recently we remodeled the bathrooms in the church – thanks to generous contributions made via "Giving Tuesday." Also underway are some playground improvements for the schoolchildren. Meanwhile at St. Henry, we replaced the a/c unit for the upstairs "cry room," at a cost of \$5,461. I don't get up to the "skybox" very often, so let me know if it's more comfortable now.

Meeting with Family Pastoral Advisory Council. On September 13, the three pastoral advisory councils met together; this is the second time we've done this. I'm so gratified to report that everyone continues to have a cooperative mindset and the members of the three councils – who don't already know each other (many do), are getting acquainted. Meanwhile, we did do some good work.

Making sure our three campuses are well maintained. First, at my request, each parish council is forming a "facilities" committee. The purpose is to help identify both short- and long-term maintenance needs and possible improvements. This will enable the joint pastoral advisory council to develop – for each campus – a plan of action, sorting items based on whether they are immediate, or near term, or merely "wish list" items. And this, in turn, will be a resource for the finance committees as budgets are formed over the next several years.

Long-term planning for the Mass schedule. Second, we discussed the need to begin planning now for the day when we have not four, but three, priests in this family. You may not realize it, but when our family grouping was announced, the intention was to have only three priests, with Father Manning retiring. When he decided to stay active with our family, he spared our parishes from making the kind of Mass schedule changes that are happening all around us. But our turn will come, and the joint pastoral council agreed that we need to formulate a plan for that eventuality.

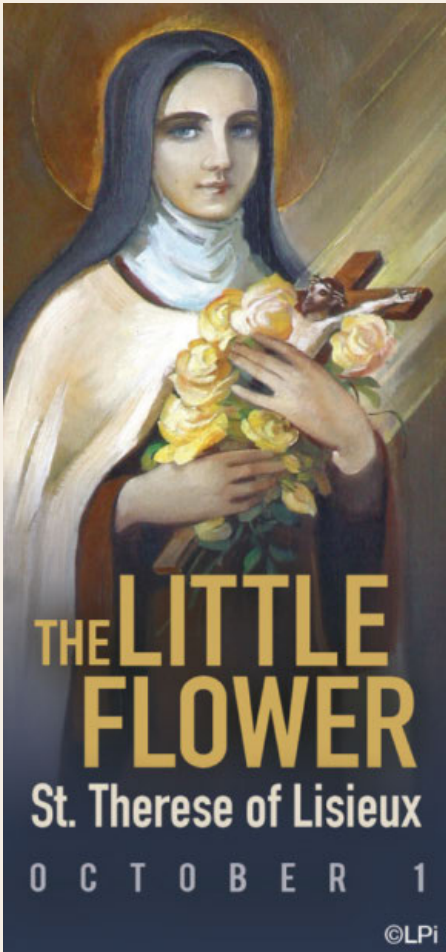

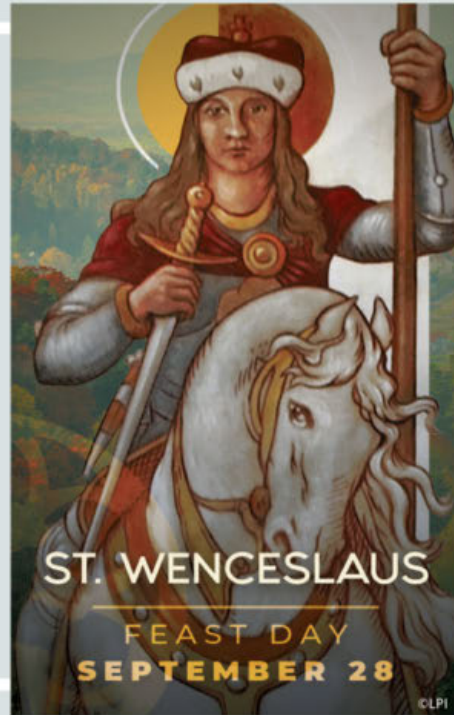

Saint of the Week

You may know St. Wenceslaus better than you think, he is in fact, the "Good King Wenceslas" from the Christmas carol penned in the 19th century. He was born in 907 near Prague, the son of the Duke of Bohemia, raised and educated as a Christian by his paternal grandmother, Ludmila, who herself became a saint. The land of Bohemia at this time was a place in turmoil. Christianity had not yet taken hold and there were power struggles even within the noble family. When Saint Wenceslaus' father died, his Christian grandmother became regent. However, his mother who may have been a pagan or at least held anti-Christian sentiments, upset at being overlooked, had Ludmilla killed. Wenceslaus, though young, eventually prevailed. He ruled from 921-929, working at unification, he supported the Church building many churches, including the rotunda of Saint Vitus at Prague Castle. And like in the carol, he cared for sick, poor, widowed, and orphaned in his kingdom. To make peace with Germany, Wenceslaus recognized King Henry the Fowler as the successor of Charlemagne, which put Bohemia under King Henry. The peace was not a popular move with the non-Christian sects and nobles who wanted to remain outside of German rule. Legend holds that his brother, Boleslaus the Cruel, led some anti-Christian movements. Whether Boleslaus plotted to murder Saint Wenceslaus, or they just had a disagreement that ended in his death, it is generally accepted that the saint was killed by Boleslaus or his men. His last words were to forgive his brother. Saint Wenceslaus was immediately recognized as a martyr for the faith and sainted. The Holy Roman Emperor Otto, I posthumously gave him the title "king." He is the first Czech saint and the patron saint of the Czech state.
