

From Our Rector

“... whoever thinks he is standing secure should take care not to fall.” 1 Corinthians 10:12

“Pride goes before disaster and a haughty spirit before a fall.” Proverbs 16:18

I think one of the most dangerous statements we can say is, “this could never happen to me.” All of us, at some time, have felt that sense of relief, self-satisfaction even, at avoiding misfortune. We feel a sense of immunity from tragedy. My house won’t flood because I live on top of a hill; I am safe because I have a security system; my child/spouse/friend would never (fill in the blank).

I go to Mass/Confession/tithe, so I feel pretty confident I’m going to heaven.

Until the flood does come; someone breaks into your house or breaks your heart. Both the prophet and the evangelists tell us today that God’s judgement is just, but above all it is merciful. There is no “score card” where rewards and punishments are delivered promptly. Trials come to the good and the bad; and sometimes it seems that the latter escape judgement all together.

Yet we see “as man sees,” not as God. We want certainty, but the only true certainty is that Christ was born, lived, and died for our salvation. Paul is challenging us to live not in fear, but in gratitude.

The gardener in Luke’s Gospel is patient; he knows he must feed the soil; he knows to give the tree time to bear fruit. Just so, God is patient with us. He wants, as the prophet Joel reminds us, to “return to him.”

At the midpoint of Lent, I encourage you to be a patient gardener: with each other and with yourself. Continue to feed your soul; continue to seek ways to bring you closer to God. Though we may not automatically think of Lent as a season of Hope, it is profoundly so. The Hope of the Resurrection, of OUR salvation is at hand.

The Second Collection this week will go towards Easter flowers for the altar. Honor a loved one with a special gift!





The Office of Young Adult Ministry assists parish staff in creating a culture of friendship, prayer, and purpose among young adults (19-35).



Why the Stations of the Cross?

Along with icons, stained glass, and statues, it's easy to overlook the other collection of images that decorate most Catholic Churches: the Stations of the Cross.

"The Way of the Cross" (in Latin, Via Crucis; or the Via Dolorosa, the "Way of Sorrows") is a devotion that traces the last stage of the journey that Jesus walked in his earthly life: from the Garden of Olives through his death on the Cross.

Where did this practice come from?

Traditions tell of the early Christians retracing the steps of Christ and pilgrims walking this way in Jerusalem. Around the 17th century, knowing that many Christians couldn't travel to the Holy Land, permission was given to local parishes to start creating their own "Stations" of the Cross. We have practiced this tradition (especially during Lent) ever since!

How many stations are there?

There are fourteen stations. There have been varying versions of the practice, from 5 to 12 to the now-settled 14.

Why is this devotion important?

The Stations of the Cross invites us to make a spiritual pilgrimage of prayer. We can't skip ahead to Easter Sunday; we must acknowledge the entire journey of Christ's Paschal Mystery, and taking time in reflecting on the agony of Christ's last hours before death can call us deeper into this mystery of love and bring us to deeper conversion.
