Our various Project Serve ministries here at St. Dominic are amazing opportunities for parishioners to share their time, talents and treasures with those who are in need. Project Serve is under the direction of staff member Tim Sokal, yet each ministry is directed by a parish volunteer. These parishioners are in direct contact with each of our partner agencies as they continually help them to discern how our St. Dominic parishioners can be involved.

Joe and Amy Fogerty are a beautiful example of parishioners who have taken a leadership role with Project Serve. In addition to sharing their musical talents each week at Sunday Mass, Joe and Amy direct our ESSOC program in El Salvador. As both of them are fluent in Spanish, they communicate on a weekly basis with Oscar Reyes, our ESSOC coordinator in El Salvador. Joe and Amy have developed an online application form for students to apply for college scholarships. Each fall, they visit our mission and interview all of the candidates who apply. They then try to coordinate sponsors here at the parish. They facilitate monthly communications between students and sponsors and are always available to help the students when they confront challenges at school. We are grateful to Joe and Amy for all that they do to facilitate this program and help to change the direction of so many young lives in El Salvador.

Another example of parishioner Project Serve leaders are Derek and Agata Wojno. Derek and Agata coordinate the monthly lunch with prayer and reflection at Matt Talbot ministries, an in-patient facility for those working to overcome addiction. Derek and Agata have gathered an amazing group of volunteers from the parish to assist with this ministry, and the director of the agency regularly shares with me that the group from St. Dominic provides much inspiration and support to their clients.

Thanks to these dedicated parishioners and so many others who make the gospel come alive through our Project Serve ministry!

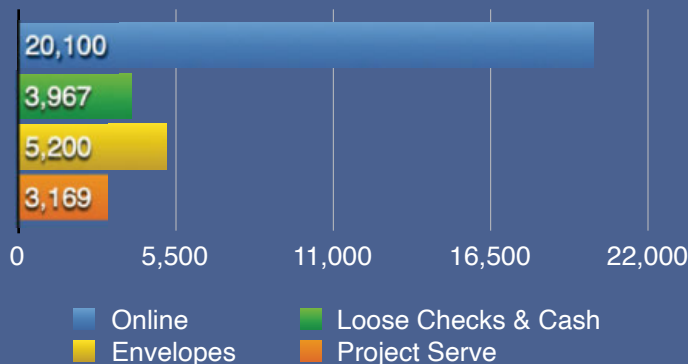

Reading 1: Wisdom 18:6-9

The night of the passover was known beforehand to our fathers, that, with sure knowledge of the oaths in which they put their faith, they might have courage. Your people awaited the salvation of the just and the destruction of their foes. For when you punished our adversaries, in this you glorified us whom you had summoned. For in secret the holy children of the good were offering sacrifice and putting into effect with one accord the divine institution.

Reading II: Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-12

Brothers and sisters: Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen. Because of it the ancients were well attested. By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; he went out, not knowing where he was to go. By faith he sojourned in the promised land as in a foreign country, dwelling in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs of the same promise; for he was looking forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and maker is God. By faith he received power to generate, even though he was past the normal age —and Sarah herself was sterile—for he thought that the one who had made the promise was trustworthy. So it was that there came forth from one man, himself as good as dead, descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sands on the seashore.

Gospel: Luke 12:35-40

Jesus said to his disciples: “Gird your loins and light your lamps and be like servants who await their master’s return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival. Amen, I say to you, he will gird himself, have the servants recline at table, and proceed to wait on them. And should he come in the second or third watch and find them prepared in this way, blessed are those servants. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour when the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come.”

August Pope Video: For Mutual Coexistence

Let us pray that societies where coexistence seems more difficult might not succumb to the temptation of confrontation for ethnic, political, religious or ideological reasons. Jesus, Lord of our history, Faithful companion and living presence, You who never tire of coming to meet us, Here we are, in need of Your peace. We live in times of fear and division. Sometimes we act as if we were alone, Building walls that separate us from one another, Forgetting that we are brothers and sisters. Send us Your Spirit, Lord, To rekindle within us The desire to understand one another, to listen, To live together with respect and compassion. Give us the courage to seek paths of dialogue, To respond to conflict with gestures of fraternity, To open our hearts to others without fear of differences. Make us builders of bridges, Able to overcome borders and ideologies, Able to see others through the eyes of the heart, Recognizing in every person an inviolable dignity. Help us create spaces where hope can flourish, Where diversity is not a threat But a richness that makes us more human. Amen.



Speaking & Listening Skills

The academic performance goal for St. Dominic School's five year accreditation cycle is that *"Students will develop the skills to actively listen and communicate respectfully with others to build stronger relationships and deepen learning."*

During the 2024–2025 school year, students learned about the core skills of listening during the first semester and speaking during the second semester. Teachers used lessons from *The Language of Learning* by Margaret Berry Wilson to guide the learning. Listening to learn involves focusing on the speaker, staying engaged, caring about what the speaker says, and working to summarize what the student is hearing.

Speaking skills include taking turns, staying on topic, speaking confidently and speaking clearly. They practice these skills during lessons and each week at our school Mass. During the 2025–2026 school year, students will learn how to ask and answer questions and craft an argument during a discussion. The overall goal is to create students who move on to high school with strong speaking and listening skills, important tools for their future.



First Communion Preparation: Don't Wait Until 2nd Grade



Preparing for First Communion begins in the family with regular attendance at Sunday Mass. Children learn what they live. They learn that this holy gathering is important to family life; and the prayers, readings, and songs hold meaning for those gathered. They learn they are a part of a worshipping community. They belong here. Additionally, First Communion preparation at St. Dominic requires that a child has attended religious education for at least two years before making their First Communion to ensure that they are adequately prepared for the reception of Jesus in holy communion.

This year's 2026 class of 67 first communicants has 16 children who are not the traditional 2nd grade age. We are thrilled to welcome families who, for many reasons, may not have been able to follow the typical path of attending PSR since kindergarten. If you have young children in kindergarten or first grade, who do not attend a Catholic school, don't wait until second grade to sign them up for religious education with the expectation that they will be ready to receive First Communion in second grade. Sign them up this year, bring them to Mass regularly, and allow them to "grow up" with their faith community. Grounding them in God's love is the absolute best gift you can give your children. 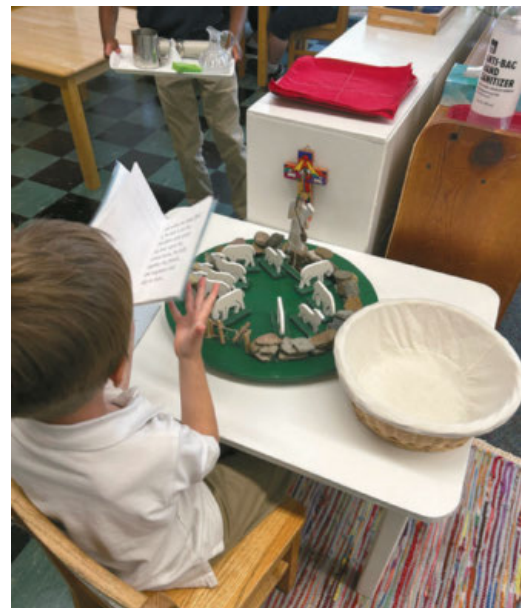

ESSOC Trip 2025

A Note from our El Salvador ESSOC co-directors Amy & Joe Fogerty:

The ESSOC program, which currently provides scholarships to 132 college students in El Salvador, is one of the largest and most successful components of our St. Dominic mission in El Salvador. Recently, a group of ESSOC sponsors from St. Dominic had the opportunity to travel to El Salvador, where we witnessed first-hand how college students from Chiltiupán are breaking the cycle of generational poverty and changing the lives of those in their community. Each sponsor had the meaningful opportunity to visit the home of their student and meet their family. ESSOC students and their sponsors exchange letters regularly, but finally meeting face to face takes that connection to a new level. The week was filled with joy, fellowship, new friendships, and lots of learning.



One highlight from the trip was a visit to ITCA University, where we attended an informational session, toured the campus, and enjoyed lunch in the cafeteria with the university's Rector, the Dean of the school of Culinary Arts, and the head chef (an ESSOC graduate). We also visited the nearby student apartment, which currently houses 24 students, and shared dinner with them.

This special trip to El Salvador is offered every July and is a powerful way for sponsors to engage directly with the students they support. If you are a current sponsor or are considering becoming one, please consider joining us next year, especially if you have never been to El Salvador before.



Efforts are now underway to recruit new sponsors for our next class of ESSOC scholars. A sponsorship of \$1500/year will cover the majority of expenses for a college student. SAINT DOMINIC SOLAR PANEL INSTALATION UPDATE

For more than a year, Saint Dominic staff and parishioners have been diligently working to develop a plan to install a solar array on three roofs of the school building. Last month, this dream became a reality as our permit with the City of Shaker Heights was finalized, materials were delivered, and installation began. We are hopeful the system is fully operational by early September.

Saint Dominic Church and School collectively **use about 176,000 kWh of electricity annually**, equivalent to approximately 13 homes' annual usage (based on average electricity usage in Ohio). Our solar array will have approximately 290 panels placed on three different roofs of the school building. **The new solar array will produce approximately 175,000 kWh (about 99% of what we use) annually.** The produced electricity will be used to meet the needs of the school and the church. Sometimes we will make more than we need, and the extra will be sold to the electric company at the exact rate we pay. At other times (evenings or cloudier days), we will still need to draw electricity from the electric grid. However, overall, we will be producing 99% of our annual power needed, eliminating much of the need for fossil-fuel-driven facilities to make our parish and school community's electricity.

Early in his pontificate, **Pope Francis** illuminated Catholic Social Teaching on care for creation by writing the first-ever papal encyclical ***Laudato Si': On Care for Our Common Home***. In the 182-page document, he called on all people of goodwill, especially Catholics, to an "ecological conversion," urging us to recognize that "the climate is a common good, belonging to all and meant for all." He was not shy in his criticism of the "use of highly polluting fossil fuels" as a key contributor to the current ecological crisis. He emphasized the urgent need to transition toward sustainable sources of energy. Catholic teaching, rooted in Sacred Scripture, teaches that **creation is a gift entrusted to each of us**, not a resource to be exploited, and our response must reflect a commitment to the common good and the dignity of the poor, who are most vulnerable to the planet's warming. Investing in renewable energy—like our new solar array—is a concrete expression of the Saint Dominic community's understanding of our responsibility to "care for our common home" by reducing harm to the environment, promoting the use of clean energy, and fostering a culture of sustainability rooted in Gospel values.
