

**Postscripts from Sr. Pat**

All four Gospels begin their Resurrection stories not with an account of Jesus’ actual rising from the dead but with the discovery of the empty tomb. Although the stories differ in detail, they all agree on the most important point—the same Jesus whom the Romans crucified is now alive! In the Gospel according to Matthew, Mary of Magdala and another woman (also named Mary) go to inspect the tomb early on Sunday morning. There is an earthquake, then an angel dressed in dazzling white announces that Jesus is alive. After the women inform the apostles of what they experienced, Peter runs to the tomb and find it empty. In Luke’s Gospel, the resurrected Jesus first appears not to the women but to two disciples on their way to Emmaus.

In today’s reading we find Mary Magdalene visiting the tomb by herself. Seeing the stone has been rolled away, Mary fears that someone stole Jesus’ body, so she runs to tell the apostles. Both Peter and the beloved disciple visit the tomb and find it empty. After the apostles leave, two angels speak to Mary, and Jesus appears to her.

Mark’s version had Mary of Magdala and two other women finding the tomb empty. A young man (an angel) dressed in white explains to them that Jesus has been raised from the dead and instructs them to tell Peter and the other apostles about what has happened. Unfortunately we do not have the original ending of this Gospel, so we do not know anything about what Mark says concerning Jesus’ post-Resurrection appearances. The ending we do have dates back to the first century, but it is just a summary of the details we find in the other three Gospels.

Mary’s role in all four Gospel stories is unusual because she appears as the hero in an event that took place in a male dominated society. It is interesting not only that the resurrected Jesus chose to appear first to a woman instead of to Peter or another apostle, but also he chose a woman instead of a man from his inner circle to be their first to tell the others. Jesus must have had a great deal of confidence in Mary, and proving that this confidence was not misplaced, she did not disappoint him. (J.J.Satabowich)

**Detroit-area Catholic schools have seen few virus cases since school year began**

Since August, Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Detroit have predominantly operated in-person classes, with the exception of a few independent schools and a state-mandated suspension of in-person learning in the weeks after Thanksgiving. Just as importantly, they've kept COVID-19 at bay while doing so. As of March 4, the Archdiocese of Detroit's Office of Catholic Schools reported 594 cases out of approximately 26,000 students and 3,000 staff — a 1.71% positivity rate, with 425 positive cases being students — since the academic year began. The office further reported no "outbreaks," where four or five cases could be linked to one classroom, occurred in an archdiocesan classroom. 

## Procedures for our Parish

### Infant Baptism

Baptisms take place the second Sunday of each month, except during Lent, after the 12:00pm Mass. Parents must be registered, active members of the parish for three months prior to their child's baptism. Parents and godparents are required to attend one preparation workshop, unless there was a previous baptism within three years. Classes will be held only four times a year: January, April, July, and October, the Monday before the baptism at 6:30pm. When scheduling your child's baptism, arrange to attend the baptismal class **prior** to and closest to your chosen date of baptism. Please contact the office.

## A Happy Ending Isn't the Whole Story

"Is there a happy ending?"

When my kids were young, we never made it past the first whiff of any narrative tension before I got this question. As soon as whatever princess or furry woodland animal who was the hero of the story got into any small scrape, they wanted that reassurance, "Is there a happy ending?"

I can't say I blame them. Don't we all feel that way sometimes? We enter into a relationship with someone or some situation, and we just want to protect ourselves. We want to know it's not going to go badly — or, if it does, that we will be able to come back from it. It's a human instinct, a reflex. Our inclination to protect ourselves makes it so that we sometimes want to press fast-forward on the bad stuff and skip straight ahead to the happily-ever-after.

Easter is the ultimate happy ending. It's the day of miracles. The day when all the stones roll away and all the sins are forgiven. It's the day that puts everything right.

But if we learned anything from this week — from the Passion and death of the Lord — it's that we can't press fast-forward on the hardships of life. That tension, that loss, that fear — it's crucial, isn't it? As Catholics, we are who we are because of Easter. But Easter doesn't happen without Good Friday.

So, does the story of salvation have a happy ending? We know it does. But we also remember that the ending isn't all that matters.

## Saint of the Week

### **Saint Julie Billiart— Patron against poverty; bodily ills; disease**

St. Julie Billiart was born in 1751 in France. She was a very holy person from youth, showing great spiritual growth at age nine. She was paralyzed for 31 years of her life after a shock to her nervous system. She sheltered priests during the French Revolution, and with the assistance of a Viscountess and friend, she founded the Institute of the Sisters of Notre Dame. Though she was of poor health, she worked to teach and catechize children, especially the poor, and her order was focused mostly on the education of sisters to teach. Her feast day is April 8th.



## Wine Distribution

**Question:** Why haven't Catholic Churches gone the way of disposable cups for wine distribution?

**Answer:** If a Catholic has ever attended a Protestant worship service and saw the communion service that was offered for that community, one of the things that might have stood out was the use of small, disposable cups for distributing the wine or grape juice. This is in stark contrast to the precious metal chalices used in Catholic churches during the Mass.

Although practices for Protestant Christians can vary (ranging from large shared chalices, to personal-use cups, to dipping the bread in the wine/grape juice), the norms governing Catholic practices are fairly direct: "Sacred vessels are to be made from precious metal. If they are made from metal that rusts or from a metal less precious than gold, then ordinarily they should be gilded on the inside. In the Dioceses of the United States of America, sacred vessels may also be made from other solid materials that, according to the common estimation in each region, are precious ... they are to have bowls of nonabsorbent material" (nos. 328-330). Rather than being a commentary on the beliefs or practices of those other communities, these rules are intended to highlight the reverence that Catholics have for the bread and wine consecrated at Mass, which become the Body and Blood the Lord.
