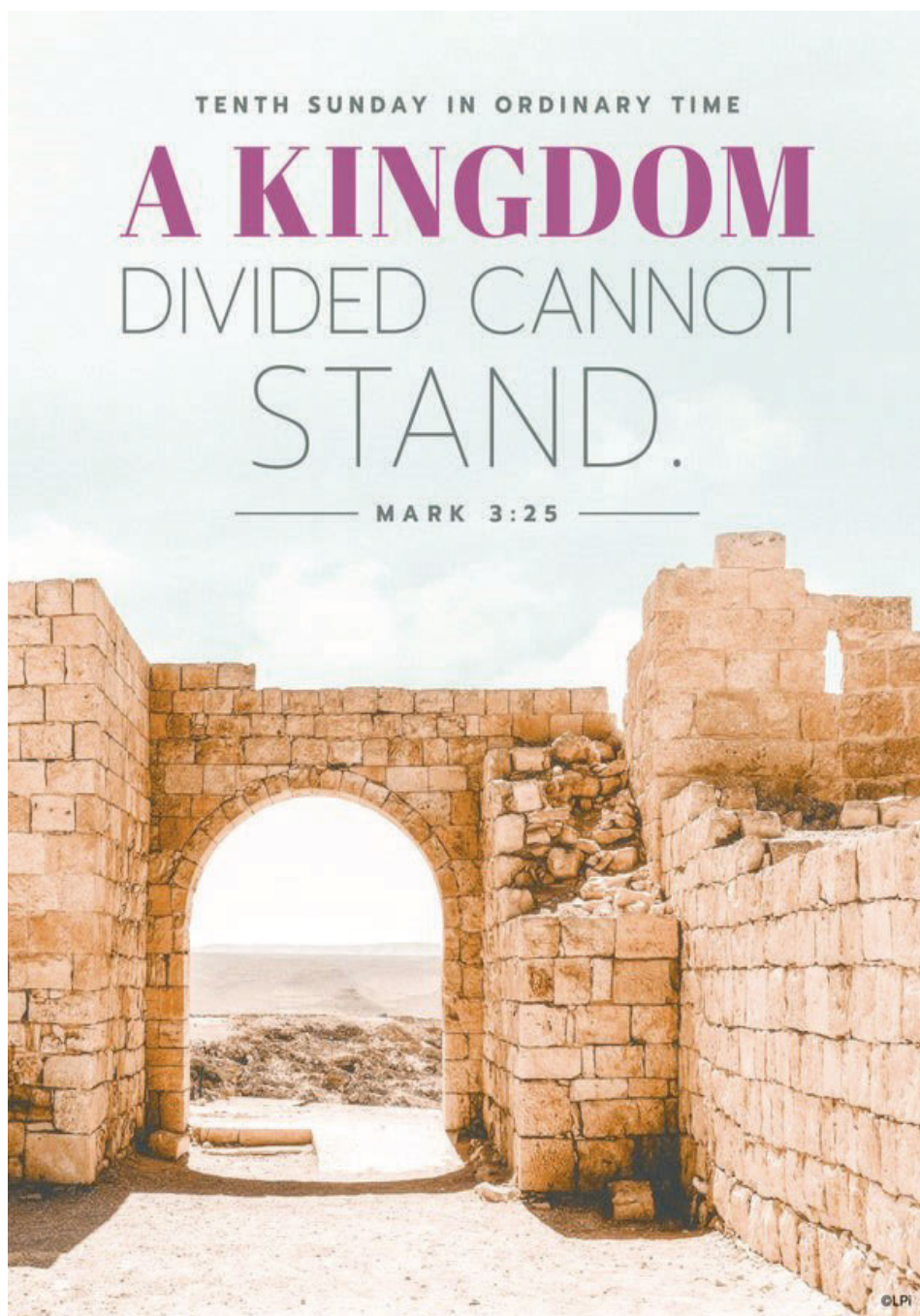

Postscripts from Sr. Pat

People are naturally reluctant to change their minds about traditional beliefs and the Jewish people in Jesus' day were no different from anyone else. They, too, were set in their ways and were reluctant to abandon their long-held convictions, especially religious doctrines pertaining to the messiah.

Some Jewish people in the first-century Palestine believed the Messiah would conquer the world and, through him, God would then restore the world to what it was like before man and woman sinned. This is what the Jews called the reign or kingdom of God.

Some Jews believed the reign of God would come quickly once the Messiah appeared and that it would be only for the Jewish people. Jesus challenges these ideas with the parables in today's Gospel.

Jesus compares the reign of God to a seed and in the first parable, he stresses how slowly a seed grows. First there is the blade, then the ear, and finally the ripe wheat in the ear. Just as this process takes time and does not occur overnight, the reign of God will also take time and will not happen all at once.

In the second parable, Jesus says that the reign of God is like a mustard seed that grows into a huge plant in which the birds of the air build their nests. Notice that Jesus does not say the birds were only sparrows, or only robins, or only blue jays. Just as all birds build their nests in the tree, the reign of God will be for all people, not only for the Jews.

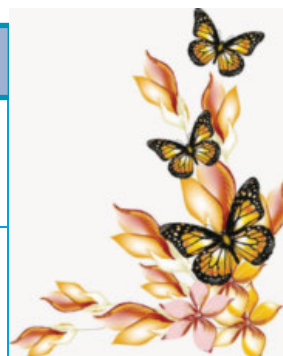
Knowing the people in his audience were likely to cling stubbornly to their cherished beliefs, Jesus usually chose not to come right out and tell them they were wrong. That method would not succeed. Instead, Jesus used parables because he knew people were more likely to remember them and share them with family and friends, discussing the meaning of each parable as they did so. In this way Jesus got them to re-examine their traditional beliefs and challenged them to think in a new direction without threatening them. (J.J.Sabatowich)

For Reflection: Each time we pray the Our Father, we pray for God's kingdom to come. We pray for the day when God will conquer the devil and restore the world to what it was like before man and woman sinned. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us to be patient. He will defeat the devil, but it will take time.

Think about this: God hears the prayers of our heart when words fail.

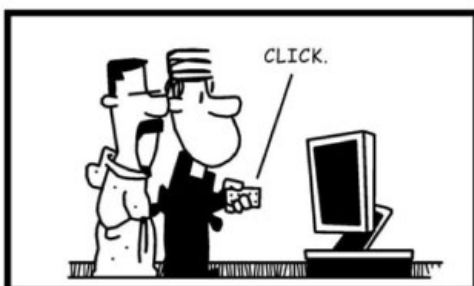

Procedures for our Parish

Infant Baptism

Baptisms take place the second Sunday of each month, except during Lent, after the 11:00am Mass. Parents must be registered, active members of the parish for three months prior to their child's baptism. Parents and godparents are required to attend one preparation workshop, unless there was a previous baptism within three years. Class will be held only four times a year: January, April, July, and October, the Monday before the baptism at 6:30pm. When scheduling your child's baptism, arrange to attend the baptismal class **prior** to and closest to your chosen date of baptism. In the Family Way

Look here: there is no one more family-oriented than me. I drive a minivan. I wear mom jeans. I wipe unidentified gunk off of kids' faces without a second thought.

I'm all about family, but I'm not always a fan of what "family" has come to mean in the modern lexicon. Family values. Family-friendly. Family-oriented. It's usually a synonym for "non-offensive." Soft. Moderate. Nice.

It's all fine, I suppose. But is it genuine? Creating a family, bringing that family physically into the world, was the hardest and most painful thing I ever did. The care and keeping of that family — the teamwork with my spouse, the feeding and watering of the children, the teaching of the writing and the reading the and praying — it's very hardcore. It's not all stuffed animals and peekaboo. It's a mental, spiritual, and physical challenge that daily brings me to my knees.

I'm not even talking exclusively about parenting young children. I'm talking about being part of a family in any way — being a son, being a daughter, being a sister and cousin and uncle. Families are complicated and strange and messy. Sometimes boundaries need to be drawn, or they need to be crossed. Sometimes walls need to be put up or torn down. It's never easy. It's never simple.

But I've never known someone who didn't want to be part of a family in some way, whether that's a blood family or one created by circumstance. And there's a reason Christ creates a family ("Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother") and not a club.

A family is a crucible, yes — but what comes out is so much more beautiful than what went in. For all the effort and even pain that is sometimes involved in a family relationship, there is nothing more defining, more fulfilling.

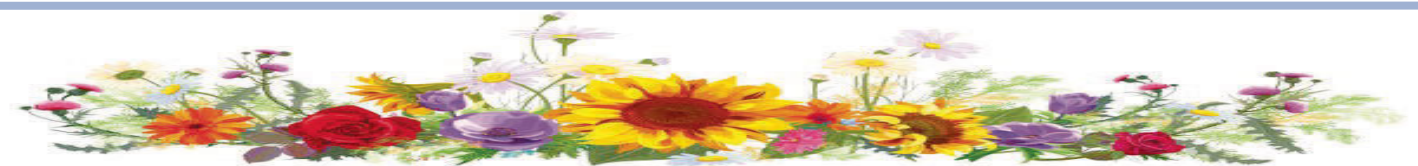
We are part of Christ's family, and what we can expect from that is certainly not a life of simple, clear-cut, undemanding discipleship. We can expect confusion. We can expect discomfort. But we can expect to be perpetually drawn to the heart of one who loves us without hesitation, without condition.

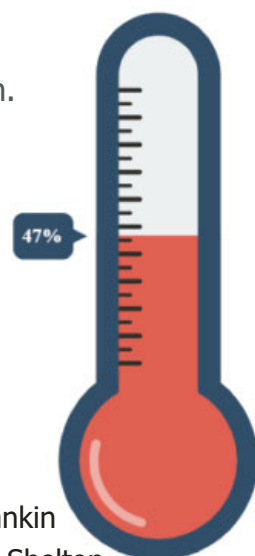
