

### Be Filled with Fr. Phil

#### New Year: Fear or Faith?

We're halfway through this month. How are we doing? With all the things that have happened in the past two years, we could all certainly use some good news. I shared with our school students at our first School Mass from break that we can either dread what this year will bring or choose to see it with the eyes of faith. In the Gospel reading that day, we heard Jesus read from the Prophet Isaiah and how He shared that this year was proclaimed to be a year "acceptable to the Lord."

It seems more and more there's bad news unfolding around us and things don't look like they're getting any better. I remember hearing someone who prophesied this about the news: they will be agents of terror. And if you think about it, it's true! People who feel the need to be plugged in to all the news have high levels of anxiety and fear. They don't know what to do. They say they pray but fear grips their hearts and paranoia sets in. And we need to stop, to stop for a moment and think if we are behaving like children of the Most High God or more like children of the world?

Do we believe that Jesus is with us? Don't dismiss that thought! We might be quick to say, "Yes, *but...*" and that's where we lose the point! There is no "but"! Who are we giving our hearts to? Maybe our focus needs to shift more and more on what Jesus is inviting us to do rather than giving our attention to what news outlets want us to pay attention to. Too many individuals have traded their hope, their joy, their peace for the anxiety inducing spirit of the news and social media. For what? What is there to gain from it? Do you want to perpetuate the fear, the anxiety? Or do you want to build up your faith? Where is your focus?

We have a wonderful opportunity available to build up your faith, your relationship with God, especially with the Holy Spirit. Every Monday, 6:30 PM, at St. Mary Mystical Rose, The Wild Goose series has been made available once again. While it began on the first Monday of this month, come and join us for prayer. Sure, you can watch the series online with Formed.org, yet there is something very powerful and personal when you participate with others, interact with others in the faith. It's more than just watching the videos. It's about encountering the living God through prayer, inspirational testimonies, and intimacy found in spending time with our Jesus in the Holy Eucharist during Adoration.

If you've had enough of the noise of the world, come rest a while in His presence. We can choose to be deep in what the world says we should focus on and feel, fostering an even greater experience of anxiety... or we can choose to grow deep in our faith and be attentive to His voice and how He wants us to operate in this world and realize that His voice is not one that arises from condemnation but One that speaks to heart.

#### Encounter Conference

A few weeks back, a few of us from the parishes attended the annual conference that Encounter Ministries put together. It was certainly a very anointed time to encounter the Holy Spirit anew, a time that built our faith and our relationship with Him. Please pray for us as we continually discern how the Lord wants this gift that He has given us be made alive in our Family.

#### Update on Directors

Some have been curious as to the responsibility of the Directors for our Family. We are in the process of prayerfully figuring

out what that will look like for our Family (rather than make a cookie-cutter approach). Until we know what that will be, please keep us in your prayers. (And when we do, still pray for us! It will be the intention of prayer that will change.)

While he has his duties with the Archdiocese, you may see him around helping Fr. Steve and I with Holy Mass and confessions. Please warmly welcome him when you see him. ## From the Desk of Fr. Ray Arwady

Dear Parishioners of Holy Family, St. Augustine, and St. Mary, Mystical Rose,

My name is Fr. Raymond E. Arwady. You can call me Fr. Ray, Fr. Raymond, Reverend Arwady, or Reverend Father, or whatever seems appropriate. If you want to know how to pronounce my last name, it rhymes with “Our Lady.” Just put a “W” where the “L” is in “Our Lady” (Our-WAY-Dee).

I moved into the rectory at St. Augustine January 4, 2022 and celebrated my first weekend Mass with your family on January 8.

I am what is called a Priest-in-Residence and I will probably be with you for about one year. In that time, I will perform some light sacramental work, celebrating Masses and hearing confessions, while also engaging in ministry in other places throughout the Archdiocese. It's sometimes known as supply ministry.

The Archdiocese moves me around a lot. I spent five months at St. James Rectory (Our Mother of Perpetual Help Parish), Ferndale, approximately one year at St. Frances Cabrini, Allen Park, and likewise about one year at the Church of the Divine Child Parish, Dearborn.

I have been a Priest of the Archdiocese of Detroit for about 12.5 years having been ordained with your Pastor Father Philip Ching May 30, 2009.

I have mostly served as an Associate Pastor for eight years, and Administrator for two years. I have always served at parishes that have schools: St. Michael the Archangel in

Livonia, two years; St. Paul On the Lake in Grosse Pointe Farms, three years, Immaculate Conception in Lapeer, three years, and St. John the Baptist in Monroe, 2 years. The other 2.5 years have been in supply ministry as a Priest-in-Residence.

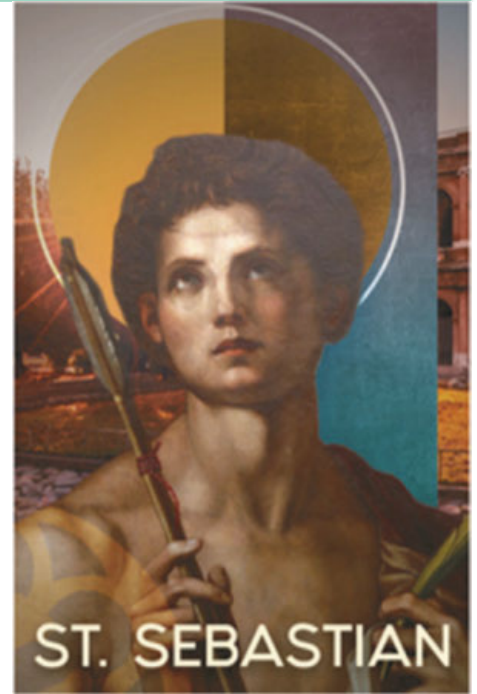
Before hearing my call to be a Priest, I studied engineering at Oakland University in Rochester obtaining a Master Degree, and I worked for General Motors for 6 years.

My Father is Lebanese and my Mother is Italian. They had seven children and my first sister, my parents first child, Debra Rose, died a few days after birth, and she rests in peace at Holy Sepulcher Cemetery in Southfield. All the rest of my family members are still living, including my parents—God Bless them!

I grew up in Northville, through the sixth grade, then in Troy for roughly ten years, and Sterling Heights. I never attended Catholic School and a unique characteristic about myself is that I have a twin brother who also studied engineering with me at Oakland University and we both worked for six years in the automotive industry, and we both became Priests.

My brother was ordained one year after me and he is currently serving as the Pastor of St. Christopher in Marysville.

I look forward to seeing you around the Family of Parishes.

## Feast Day January 20

Not much is known about the life of St. Sebastian (256-287), except that he was a Roman martyr whose name has been mentioned throughout history since early 350.

We see St. Sebastian many times in art, especially from iconic paintings from Guido Reni, Andrea Mantegna and Handrick ter Brugghen. Historical scholars now agree that a spiritual story has the beloved saint entering the Roman army because only there could he assist Christian martyrs without arousing suspicion on himself. Eventually he was found out, brought before Emperor Diocletian and delivered to Mauritanian archers to be shot to death. Pierced with arrows, he was left for dead, but managed to survive. He recovered from his wounds but still refused to leave.

One day, St. Sebastian took up a position near where the emperor was to pass. He confronted the emperor, condemning him for his cruelty to Christians. This time, the sentence of death was carried out, and St. Sebastian was beaten to death with clubs. Today he is the patron saint of athletes.

# IT TAKES ALL KINDS

"If every flower wanted to be a rose," wrote St. Therese of Lisieux, "spring would lose its loveliness."

Who is God asking you to be today? There is an obvious answer that springs to mind right out of the gate. God wants me to be a good person (a good father, a good husband) today; today, God wants me to be a saint.

But this answer fails to get to the heart of the question. We are all striving today to serve the same Spirit, but we are given different gifts to do so. The one who has the gift of knowledge may fail if today he decides he wants to be a healer. The one who has the gift of "varieties of tongues" might falter in the expression of wisdom.

Think about the wedding at Cana and the players in the scene: the servers, the guests, the bride and groom. They all have a unique role to play, and though it is to the servers that Mary gives the instruction, "Do whatever he tells you," her words apply to all.

Today, are we called to be the servers — do we wait on God's instruction and carry it out, no matter how foolish or impossible it may seem to our human ears? Are we asked to be the disciples, to bear witness to a miracle and to give our testimony? Are we called to imitate the Blessed Mother herself and give encouragement to follow God's word?

Let us examine our gifts and listen in the silence of our hearts to the direction of the Spirit. Then and only then, let us do whatever He tells us.

### No More Chains

While teaching at St. Augustine, I am reminded over and over again how meaningful learning becomes when it is connected to our Catholic faith. This Christmas season, I had the pleasure of revisiting the novel, “A Christmas Carol”, by Charles Dickens with my 6th graders.

In the beginning of the story, when Scrooge’s old friend Marly made his visit to Scrooge, the kids quickly identified the chains that were wrapped around him as symbols for his sins that were never reconciled. They also pointed out from the text Marly acknowledging that each link on his chain was made from his own free will. I loved that the kids could recognize this

and relate it to their own lives. Some students even visualized what their own links would look like. It is in our own doing of what choices we should value, and these choices will have consequences even beyond this life. What a powerful message for students to hear, especially before they experienced the Sacrament of Reconciliation!

While we are at the end of the Christmas season, it’s important to be reminded of the overwhelming gift from God Our Father, Jesus, who came to die for our sins. I can hear the kids right now saying, “No more chains, if we choose.”

It was a blessing to experience a story I have known for so many years with the freedom to let my students see it through their personal knowledge and faith they have in Christ. I can say with much certainty, they are growing in knowing the true meaning of Christmas!

### Mail Call



**Q:** Several organizations have been sending me what they claim are “relics” from various saints. There is always a request for a donation along with these “gifts”. I do not

wish to receive these items. This also seems like an unethical practice. I am reluctant to just throw these things into the trash. How should I treat these items which are now piling up? What are Church guidelines for both sending and receiving these things?

**A:** I agree that receiving an unsolicited gift is annoying. Some probably are from ethically questionable sources. Keep in mind, however, that many very worthy causes have turned to some very creative methods, like this one, to encourage much needed donations.

You are probably receiving legitimate third class relics. A third class relic is something like a piece of cloth or jewelry that has been in physical contact with a first or second class relic. A second class relic is some personal item that was owned or used by a saint. This would usually be an article of clothing, a book, rosary, etc. At the top of the list are first class relics. These relics are some part of the saint’s body like a lock of hair.

There are no specific Church guidelines related to the sending or disposal of third class relics. My first thought would be to return these items and ask to be removed from their mailing list. If you do not wish to do this, perhaps donate the items. You may also dispose of a third class relics by burning or burying them. We should avoid just tossing such things in the trash. Third class relics are quite different from first class relics. The Church has specific and significant rules regarding first class relics. You will not receive legitimate first class relics in your mail box.

### What does it mean to have a Mass "offered" for someone?

An individual may ask a priest to offer a Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or, as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died. One must never forget the infinite graces that flow from the Sacrifice of the Mass which benefit one's soul. Pope Leo XIII in his encyclical "*Mirae caritatis*" (1902) beautifully elaborated this point and emphasized the connection between the communion of saints with the Mass: "The grace of mutual love among the living, strengthened and increased by the sacrament of the Eucharist, flows, especially by virtue of the Sacrifice [of the Mass], to all who belong to the communion of saints."

When a priest offers Holy Mass, he has three intentions: First, to offer the Mass reverently and validly in accord with the norms of the Church. Second, to offer the Mass in union with the whole Church and for the good of the whole Church. Third, to offer the Mass for a particular intention, such as the repose of the soul of someone who has died.

The special personal fruits of the Mass benefit the celebrating priest who acts in the person of Christ in offering the Mass and to the people who are in attendance and participate in the offering of the Mass. These fruits are both extensively and intensively finite, since each of us is finite. Therefore, the more a Mass is offered, the more benefit is conferred.
