Please contact the parish office to schedule a baptism. It is recommended that parents seeking Baptism for their child attend two baptismal preparation classes.


Sacrament of Marriage:

BELIEVE: with Fr. Steve

This weekend marks the tragic 49th anniversary of the supreme court decision to legalize abortion in our nation. For nearly 50 years our pro life warriors here in Detroit and across the country have fought to end the "legal" slaughter of human life.

Over the last many decades we as Christians have given up the fight to protect the unborn. We even bought into the lie that we can vote for "pro-abortion" candidates and feel no moral responsibility for our casted vote. As Catholics, we bear some of the responsibility that this "law" is possible and we must no longer be passive in allowing it to continue.

My Body, My Choice

"My body, my choice" is one of the most common pro-choice mantras I hear. This common phrase that pro-aborts use in culture today has been erroneously taught throughout college campuses, the media, and beyond. It is chanted at rallies, and written on bumper stickers, and posted on social media. This argument comes in other forms such as "You can't tell a woman what to do with her own body" or "Women have the right to bodily autonomy!" It is essential for pro-lifers to understand how to respond to this because it will inevitably come up in a conversation. Before we figure out how to respond, we have to understand what the claim is. A pro-choice person (more often than not) already knows that a fetus is a separate body. But the claim is that an individual has the right to do anything they choose with their own body (including the one that is carrying a fetus), no exceptions. I've included a great explanation taken from Project Life Michigan's Facebook page that defeats that argument :

"When responding to this in a conversation, I first build common ground by saying something like this: "I agree

with you that choice is very important, especially choice over your own body." Then I'll make an analogy. "While I value choice a lot, I do think there are some choices that are wrong, especially when that choice violates someone else's human rights. For example, I can move my arm around all I want. You should not have the right to tell me to stop. But if I make a fist and move it at a high speed towards your face, that would be wrong of me. Your right to not be harmed trumps my right to do what I want with my body."

After you make the analogy you can connect it back to abortion by saying that a woman does not have the right to do something to her body that intentionally ends the life of another human. When you say this, they will likely say that the fetus is not a human. With that, you've just brought the conversation back to the key question: what is the unborn? You can continue the conversation keeping the focus on the humanity of the unborn and the inhumanity of abortion." Rebecca Cooper, High School Coordinator

St. Thomas Aquinas Feast Day January 28

One of the most famous members of the Dominican Order, St. Thomas Aquinas (1225 - 1274) is well-known by many for his theological work, "The Summa Theologiae." Born in Italy, his mother wanted him to become a Benedictine and had high hopes that he would eventually become abbot of Monte Cassino, where he spent much of his youth. To change his vocation, she had him kidnapped by his brothers on his way to Paris at the age of 19. He spent two years in their captivity. Despite this, nothing could shake him from his vocation to become a Dominican priest and he was eventually released. Once free, he went to Paris and then to Cologne, where he finished his studies with Albert the Great.

His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith and reason, of revealed and natural human knowledge, encompasses his writings. The Summa Theologiae, his last and, unfortunately, uncompleted work, deals with the whole of Catholic theology.

The patron saint of teachers, theologians and students, St. Thomas Aquinas died in 1274. His life and the impact he had on the whole Church, however, remains alive today. ©LPi

This Passionist-preached weekend retreat experience will invite a re-connection - to God's story and our faith story - to better anchor us in our path to hope.





Mass "offered" for someone?

An individual may ask a priest to offer a Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or, as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died. One must never forget the infinite graces that flow from the Sacrifice of the Mass which benefit one's soul. Pope Leo XIII in his encyclical "Mirae caritatis" (1902) beautifully elaborated this point and emphasized the connection between the communion of saints with the Mass: "The grace of mutual love among the living, strengthened and increased by the sacrament of the Eucharist, flows, especially by virtue of the Sacrifice [of the Mass], to all who belong to the communion of saints."

When a priest offers Holy Mass, he has three intentions: First, to offer the Mass reverently and validly in accord with the norms of the Church. Second, to offer the Mass in union with the whole Church and for the good of the whole Church. Third, to offer the Mass for a particular intention, such as the repose of the soul of someone who has died.

The special personal fruits of the Mass benefit the celebrating priest who acts in the person of Christ in offering the Mass and to the people who are in attendance and participate in the offering of the Mass. These fruits are both extensively and intensively finite, since each of us is finite. Therefore, the more a Mass is offered, the more benefit is conferred.


