Belonging and Taking Ownership.

Summer is a time for regrouping, spending time with family and friends and getting some projects done. In the church we celebrate many things, including many of the martyrs in June and many other things including the Goodell's Fair, Armada Fair, the St. Augustine Festival, and two of our parish patronal feast days—St. Mary Mystical Rose on July 13 and St. Augustine on August 28. I want to encourage you to participate in these events and get involved. This is my theme for our new fiscal year: Belonging and Taking Ownership. I want to make the appeal to each of you to get involved in parish life, whether in a ministry or team, or even praying from home and giving to support the parish. I encourage all of you to look into year hearts and pray, to see what you want to try or what you want to do.

Often, it's the same 10% of families doing most of the volunteering. In other words, please take ownership in your parish home; have skin in the game! I am encouraging all ministry leaders to be open to new members and ideas. St. Augustine once famously said of God, "Oh beauty ever ancient, ever new." It's good to hold to tradition with our feet firmly rooted in the Lord and his Church, and we need to reach out to others, evangelize and grow, which will challenge us to change our ways of doing things possibly, though without compromising on the tenets of our Faith. Consider joining a ministry! Expand ministry. Know that you belong and taken ownership. One of the ways I would like to encourage everyone to take ownership more deeply is by giving.

We will have a capital campaign starting soon at two of our three parishes for much-needed campus improvements. Also, the Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) has begun for our parishes.

Hopefully, you have received a mailing on this by now. As you know, CSA is the Archdiocesan fundraiser to continue providing helpful services to us on the parish level, including marriage and family resources, annulment assistance, forming new priests through the seminary, and running the operations of the Archdiocese. If we do not hit the goal amount that is set by the Archdio-

cese, they will take the balance from our savings. Additionally, the Archdiocese assesses our collections at 7%. Anything given to the parish is subject to this assessment, except the amount we exceed our CSA target. My friends, as Fr. Mallia and others have encouraged you in the past, so I am going to restate and make a strong appeal to you to please give to CSA. Once we hit our goal, 100% of all overage comes back to the parish without being assessed the 7%. Please give, give, give to CSA. Maybe consider a plan to give to CSA a little more than you did in the past. Once you do that, please give your normal donation amount once or twice per month to CSA. If you have not given to the parish or CSA in the past, please prayerfully consider giving. It helps us run our buildings (take care of water damage, complete preventative maintenance, etc) and provide staffing to keep the lights on and our programs running to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ and spread the Kingdom of God!

According to Archdiocesan reports, last year, Holy Family missed their goal by roughly \$2,800 with 19% of families giving; the balance was taken out of savings. St. Augustine exceeded their goal by roughly \$800 with 21% of families giving. St. Mary Mystical Rose exceeded their CSA goal by roughly \$15,000 with 18% of registered families giving. Thank you to everyone who gave!

Here are our CSA targets for the 2024 fiscal year:

- ☐ **Holy Family \$47,254** (a reduction of 3% from 2023)
- ☐ **St. Augustine \$78,226** (a reduction of 2% from 2023)
- ☐ **St. Mary Mystical Rose \$20,017** (an increase of 1% from 2023)

We need you. You belong. Please take ownership in your/our parish. Please give to CSA.

It's best thing for our parish financial health. Most importantly, pray for our parishes, parishioners, neighbors, staff, deacons and priests. We need divine help to motivate hearts to make this family work well.

You belong, so please taking ownership. God bless you all! My prayers (and Fr. Anthony's and our beloved deacons') continue for you.

Q. It's such a challenge to watch a movie with my family these days. We will get started watching the movie and then a same-sex relationship becomes the center point or main character. For example, the main character has two dads that are affectionate towards each other throughout the movie. I've been in the habit of just stopping the movie and looking for something else. But now the kids are older they need a Catholic response to this open sin on full display. How can I respond to this appropriately to a middle school age and older child? Thank you for any tips.

A. I can't find a specific scripture, catechism reference, or textbook answer to fall back on. I could not find any official or unofficial Catholic direct response to your question. So, be forewarned, the following is coming from my personal thoughts, not Catholic teaching per se. However, I believe I am in keeping with Catholic principals with the following:

Keep doing what you have been doing. Turn the filth off immediately. Do not pollute your screen, your home, your own eyes, or the eyes of these impressionable pre-teens and teens. However, when they have seen or heard something, this age group needs a direct and immediate response. An age-appropriate conversation is in order. A seventeen-year-old will require a different approach than will a twelve-year-old. Address the issue head on. But what do you say? How do you say it? I don't know..... But God does.

Matthew 10:19-20: "... do not worry about how you are to speak or what you are to say. You will be given at that moment what you are to say. 20 For it will not be you who speak but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you." WOW! Jesus promised supernatural guidance.

Children today are bombarded by evil from all sides. Satan is trying to entice them into a world of sin and self-destruction. Social media, the public school system, their peers, the medical field, elected officials and news outlets all openly conspire to destroy the family. I believe the single most important thing you can do is to keep your child off social media. If it's too late for that, monitor their activity as best you can. Our public school system with its woke teachings and erosion of parental rights is an equal danger. Keeping them from these most evil environments will help them to be more open to your guidance. You cannot and should not try to shield them from the sickness that prevails. Rather, allow them to learn through the lens of your Christian perspective, not societies distorted perspective.

They have bible studies and movies for all age groups. You will find cartoons with a message for younger kids. 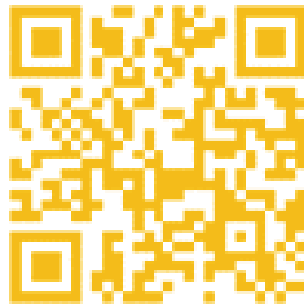

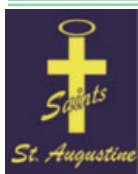

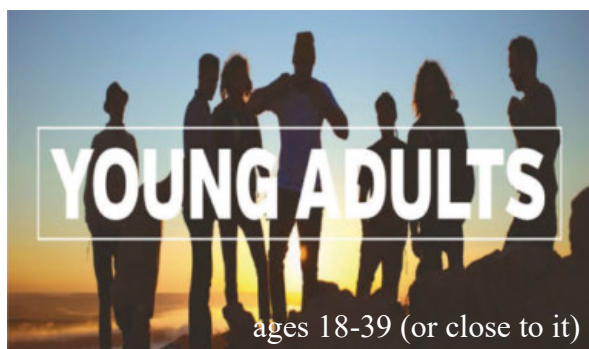
