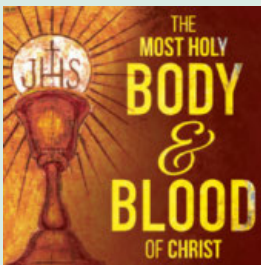
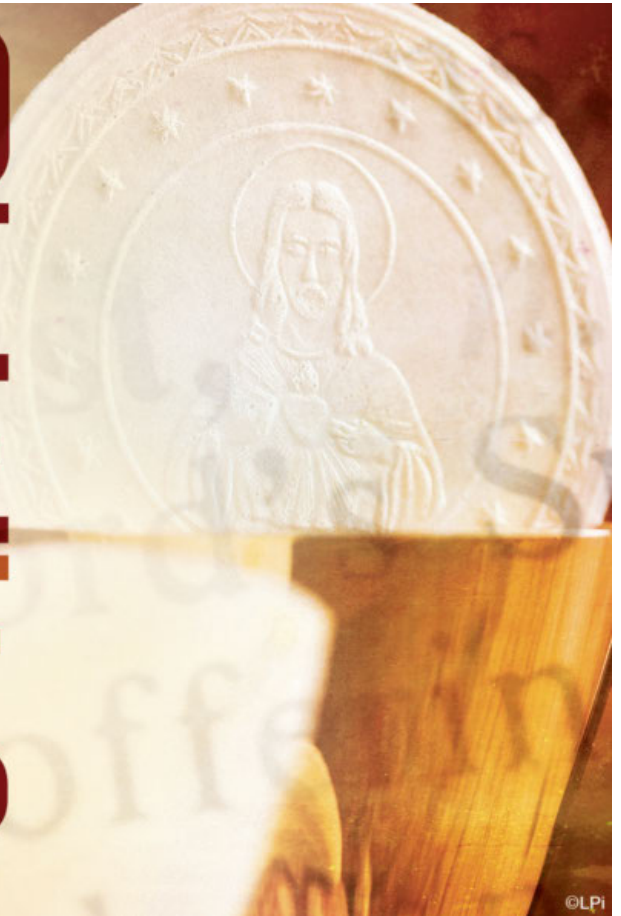

Habitat for Humanity Work Days

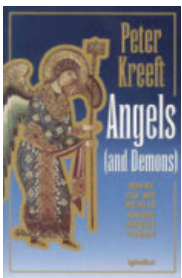

Happy Father's Day Why did Pius XII institute the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker? St. Joseph's May 1st feast day was a response to a Communist celebration. In 1955, a huge swath of the world lay under the evil shadow of Communism. Among the efforts of Pope Pius XII to counter the evil effects of Communism's atheistic ideology was the institution of a new feast in honor of St. Joseph the Worker. Pius XII placed it on May 1st, the same day that the Communists held their "May Day" celebration: an anti-religious, secular commemoration of labor. Lenin and his fellow communists viewed work in purely materialistic terms. To counter the communist view, Pope Pius XII placed before the faithful the example of St. Joseph the Worker, true model of all workers. Unlike the Communists—who viewed work in purely materialistic terms and cut God right out of the equation—St. Joseph's work had a supremely spiritual dimension. St. Joseph did his work, quite literally, for God. As a carpenter in Nazareth, he worked in order to support the Child Jesus and His Mother Mary. Jesus learned the carpenter's trade from St. Joseph and worked for the majority of His life as a carpenter Himself. The life of the Holy Family shows us the value, beauty, and sanctity of work. St. Joseph the Worker is the patron saint of all workers, especially husbands and fathers who get up and go to work every day to support the family they love and cherish. St. Joseph, pray for us.

LITURGY CORNER

Corpus Christi

During the earliest days of the church, we celebrated "The Breaking of the Bread," which grew out of the Passover-like meal in the upper room which we call "The Last Supper."

Soon, the format of "The Breaking of the Bread" grew away from the Passover Meal and became its own ritual, which is the earliest beginning of what we now call "The Mass." Our earliest record of the heart of the text of this early ritual is a small quote, found in the first letter of Paul to the Church in Corinth:

For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus, on the night he was handed over, took bread, and, after he had given thanks, broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes.

"Remembrance," for the disciples, was more than just "remembering." Remembrance has its roots in the celebration of Passover, where Jewish people not only remember but are present, across time, in that Passover evening, where the Blood of the Lamb marked them as God's People. So too, the word "memory" as used in the Mass today is more than just "remembering." The word "Memory" at Mass invites us into participation in that first "Breaking of the Bread," where Jesus gives himself then and now to us. Joy of Joys! Gift of Gifts! Maranatha – Come, Lord Jesus, come, and reside in us.

Marian Apparitions in China:

Our Lady of China appeared near Beijing in a poor village named Dong-Lu, "the place of beggars." A Mission was started there by Vincentian Fathers and by 1900 some 700 Christians were working and living there. The famous Boxer rebellion swept through China and in April of 1900, 10,000 rioters attacked Dong-Lu. The soldiers in senseless rage, started to shoot into the sky. Then suddenly they fled, frightened, and never came back again. A woman in white appeared above the settlement, the rioters' bullets were aimed at her. When the apparition did not fade, a strange horseman put the attackers to flight, and they disappeared beyond the horizon. Father Wu, a Chinese priest serving in Dong-Lu, confessed to his flock that he invoked the help of Mary. To honor Mary, a church was built on the site and Father Wu placed a picture of Our Lady on the main altar. He asked the painter to dress Our Lady in the royal robes of the dowager Empress Tzi-His. Though her robes be pagan, she belongs to every age, to all people and to every race. As was told in the Old Testament (Sirach 24:24) "I am the mother of fair love, and of fear, and of knowledge, and of holy hope." Recently, the Dong-Lu church was completely destroyed by communists, but the picture of Our Lady of China remains as it was hidden in the wall and is now carried by all Chinese priests who carry out their activities in disguise.

Our Lady of China, pray for us.

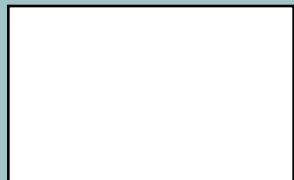

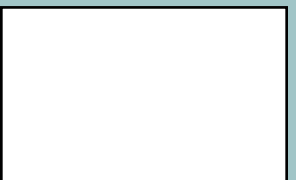
