


JULY 3, 2022 | FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Happy 4th of July! Did any Catholics sign the Declaration of Independence? During America's founding, there was a lot of hostility towards Catholics. However, there was one openly practicing Catholic

who played an essential role in the establishment of this nation. The Declaration of Independence was signed by non-Catholics—with one exception. Meet Charles Carroll, the one and only Catholic signer of the Declaration of Independence and one of Maryland's most famous sons. Wealthy and well-educated, he was technically not allowed to hold office in Maryland due to his religion. In spite of that, he was appointed to many positions and duties within the colonial government of Maryland, became one of the colony's foremost promoters of independence, and represented Maryland at the Continental Congress. He put his name to the Declaration and gave a significant amount of his own fortune to financing the Americans in their war against England. Alexis de Tocqueville, in his 19th-century observation of the American way of life Democracy in America, discussed the natural compatibility of Catholicism with the American mindset: "...they [Catholics] constitute the most republican and the most democratic class of citizens which exists in the United States." Long before the Revolution, Catholic missionaries had dedicated their lives and shed their blood for the conversion of this land. On this 4th of July may we continue to pray earnestly for our country.

LITURGY CORNER

Words, Postures, Gestures and Things Part 1

Some of us have been attending Mass for less than 10 years, and others of us have been showing up for more than ¾ of a century. All of us believe, in some way, that we gather as a community in praise and thanksgiving, responding to Jesus' call to us, learning how to be his disciples, and celebrating his promise to us that he would be with us in "The Breaking of the Bread" – "until the end of the age." NONE of us will completely understand this Mystery until we are face to face, heart to heart with him, in the presence of the Father, enveloped in the love of the Holy Spirit.

So, in the here and now, we do our best. When we celebrate the sacraments, whether it is the Eucharist, Marriage or Baptism, or the other sacraments and other services of our church, the church provides us with instructions on how, when, where... not to confine us, but to teach us, to remind us, to make it easier for us to respond together as a community.

The first gesture directed at us is carefully and precisely scripted: the rubric says "... facing the people..." the celebrant leads us in the Sign of the Cross. Then, "...the priest, extending his hands, greets the people..." The gesture is one of welcoming, of embracing, much like the patriarch or matriarch of a family would embrace family members as they gather for a feast. If the celebrant stood there with arms crossed in front, or with hands on hips, or was facing away from the people, the gesture would not communicate our being welcomed to a banquet.

Gestures matter, and so they are scripted and are to be accomplished as written. Otherwise, we lose something important.

ST. MARY PRAYER CORNER

I can't feel God's love: Have you ever felt an emptiness or hunger for God's love? Last night before we fell asleep, my husband said, "I didn't feel God's love today, I think that is why I have been feeling so sad these past few days." When he said this, I prayed for him and then we prayed together asking for God's mercy, forgiveness and love. His words made me recognize that every person feels this way from time to time. So, what can we do when this happens? Stop and pray, turn to God (metanoia) and ask for a fresh infilling of the Holy Spirit. Jesus tells us "So I say to you: Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives; the one who seeks finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened." LUKE 11:9-10

God gave us the Holy Spirit to remind us of Christ and keep us oriented toward heaven, our goal. The good news is that God's love is always pursuing us. All we need to do is open our hearts to God's love and say, "Help me God, help me to feel your love". Trust, and let the Holy Spirit do the rest.


