


JULY 17, 2022 | SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

# The Eucharistic Prayer Part 1

The Eucharistic Prayer, along with the Communion Rite, constitutes the core of the Mass. We are blessed with 13 Eucharistic Prayers; 3 are for Masses for children.

Here are the elements of the Eucharistic prayers:

The Greeting, a Preface, Commemoration / Praise, Epiclesis, Words of Institution, The Mystery of Faith, Anamnesis, Commemoration of the Dead, and the Doxology.

All Eucharistic Prayers begin with this **Greeting** or opening dialogue:

Celebrant. The Lord be with you.

R. And with your spirit.

Celebrant. Lift up your hearts.

R. We lift them up to the Lord.

Celebrant. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

R. It is right and just.

All end with the Great Doxology.

"Through him, and with him, and in him,
O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all
glory and honor is yours, for ever and ever."

And the people respond with "AMEN."

The people have the last word. We give our assent to everything which has happened with the great Amen. Over the next little while we will talk about what happens between the priest's greeting "The Lord be with you" and our final "seal of approval" - our Amen.

#### ST. MARY PRAYER CORNER

When you're down to nothing, God is up to something. It was Christmas Eve and I had volunteered to serve breakfast for the Homeless at my church in downtown Detroit for 250-300 people. Snow fell all night and by 6am there were easily 200 homeless folks hunkered down under our church awning. I opened the fridge to discover that 150 lbs. of sausage and 75 lbs. of bacon had been GIVEN AWAY to another church by a generous volunteer who'd forgotten about the breakfast. We had only eggs. I had 15 volunteers with enough faith to keep the calm, but I was truly paralyzed. We prayed and began to cook. 40 minutes and 80 people later we ran out of food. I took a deep breath and went outside to tell the 250-people waiting that we had no more food. After I explained that there was no more food, no one spoke, and you could cut the silence with a knife. As I began apologizing, a Knights of Columbus truck pulled up and stopped alongside the line of Homeless folks. The driver and crew stepped out and asked if anyone needed breakfast!! They brought bacon, sausage, coffee cakes and eggs, cooked and ready to serve (they'd been looking for the homeless folks since before dawn, but the snow thwarted their ability to find them). Everyone started applauding and cheering, I had tears in my eyes as I knew I was witness to another one of God's miracles....by the way, we had more than 12 basketfuls left over. 
