FROM YOUR PASTOR





LITURGY CORNER

The Eucharistic Prayer Part II

The word "Eucharistic" comes from the Greek for "Giving Thanks." The Mass is an act of Thanksgiving, and this giving thanks is embodied in our Eucharistic Prayer, thus its name.

The Opening dialogue of our Eucharistic prayer (The Lord be with you ... Let us give thanks to the Lord our God) is followed by a "Preface." Every Preface always begins with "It is truly right and just, our duty and salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God." The word "Thanks" again reminds us that we have much to be thankful for.

Then, the Preface calls to mind the season of the year (Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter and Ordinary Time). There are prefaces feasts and there are some which are embedded in Eucharistic Prayers. For instance, Eucharistic Prayer IV is one of the Eucharistic Prayers which has its own preface, and, working with the body of the prayer, this preface calls to mind our salvation history.

The text of the preface is set to music, for ease in chanting, and in our parish, we are blessed with a priest with a good voice.

As its name implies, the preface is a prelude. It further prepares us for the consecration of the bread and wine, where they become for us the Body and Blood of Jesus.

ST. MARY PRAYER CORNER

Big James: A humble human being, James was never without a smile as big as his gigantic, gentle persona. I remember when we talked about forgiveness with a woman who confessed that she could NEVER forgive her mother for abandoning her. James shared his witness story: "One day I thought I was going to lose my mind and I cried out to God for mercy. I had cried out to God before, but it was for judgment - I picked up the Bible and opened to a passage where Jesus says "forgive and you will be forgiven" ... I never saw that before! When I looked in the mirror, my face was ugly and snarled. I didn't even recognize myself. I knew I had to forgive but I didn't want to let go. Suddenly, it was all very common-sense...if I don't forgive, even though I did nothing wrong...I will take my life. If I forgive, I will be freed of so much hate and God will take care of me. But, believe me it was still too hard to forgive so I could only ASK GOD TO 'CHANGE MY HEART.' Immediately after I did that, my heart melted, and I felt sorry for my brother – I cried and cried...partly because I saw that I also needed forgiveness from God for hatred and bitterness. "

James often shared this story and brought many people out of unforgiveness into freedom. Last year, he slipped into heaven during the singing of 'Amazing Grace.' My friend, thank you, you helped so many forgive and begin to live again, you are greatly missed.

We have received 3 vehicles from St Mary Parish for the poor in Flint recently. One went to K, a woman with four children who was shot 7 times

by her boyfriend who was on drugs. We were able to move her into the safe house which St Mary Chelsea helped us renovate. She needs dialysis three or four times a week, the car came at the perfect time; the day after she got out of the hospital. Another car was given to a single mother who is a CNA and applying to nursing school. A truck was donated and is going to a man who turned his life around a

few years ago. Deacon Dick and I taught him plumbing, flooring, bath remodeling etc. as he helped on our houses. Now he has a small construction business and was in need of a bigger vehicle. We put window guards and security doors on all the houses. We also replaced the slate roof with asphalt and added gutters on the safe house. Coach Swager is going to help grade around the house with his family and some of his runners soon. We purchased 13 empty lots around the Church to give us a buffer zone from undesirable businesses and to eventually build small houses for the homeless. I am very grateful for all the financial support from individuals at St Mary. You make this mission possible! ~ No one is useless in the world who lightens the burdens of others. Charles Dickens
