

Offering Our Burdens to Jesus In our daily duties there are always burdensome elements which entail some measure of fatigue and discomfort. But these are the very things that we should appreciate as precious gifs that we can offer to God. Everything that tastes of suffering is, in fact, of utmost importance. The world does not accept suffering, because it is no longer familiar with the value Christian life gives it, and because suffering goes against our human nature. Thus, the world tries to avoid and to ignore it. Yet suffering has a mysterious task: It can become a way to happiness, to that true and enduring happiness which alone can fill our hearts. It is the same happiness that God enjoys and that we humans, destined to what is absolute, can share already this life. Precisely through his suffering, Jesus has given joy to every person: joy here on earth and unending joy in the next life. In the same way, by accepting and offering to him our daily worries and concerns, we obtain happiness for ourselves and for others. (Servant of God Chiara Lubich)

# Eucharistic Prayer IV Part 2

Last week, we talked about Eucharistic Prayers in general. They all begin with the dialogue "The Lord be with you... It is right and just" and then continue with a preface which picks up the theme for "today's" liturgy. The Preface ends with the "Sanctus," – "Holy, holy, Lord..." and then begins the text of the particular Eucharistic Prayer itself. We are using Eucharistic Prayer IV as our guide to the Eucharistic prayers because of its poetry and its unhurried pace.

Eucharistic Prayer IV has its own preface. It speaks of God in unapproachable light and glory, and yet it calls God "Father," a term of endearment, of approachability. This affirms God's almighty and eternal being, and God's fatherly love for us.

After the Sanctus, the prayer continues, and speaks for itself: (Note: **Text in bold** is just a guide – it is not in the prayer.)

#### (By and in Love we are created.)

We give you praise, Father most holy, for you are great, and you have fashioned all your works in wisdom and in love. You formed man in your own image and entrusted the whole world to his care, so that in serving you alone, the Creator, he might have dominion over all creatures.

# (We turned away, but You, Father, remained constant in your love for us)

And when through disobedience he had lost your friendship, you did not abandon him to the domain of death. For you came in mercy to the aid of all, so that those who seek might find you. Time and again you offered them covenants and through the prophets taught them to look forward to salvation.

My daughter pursued the doctors because she knew something wasn't right. Two months after Elizabeth's birth, they agreed. The doctors said they could do a surgical procedure where they literally cut open her skull and reconstruct it. If they did not do this Elizabeth could be blind by age 5 or have mental issues. Our family and friends were put in high prayer mode. The surgery was planned. Elizabeth needed to be 6 months old.

My daughter, granddaughters, (Hannah age 3 and Elizabeth now 3 months) and I went to the Shrine of St. Joseph in Grass Lake. We had a picnic lunch by the grotto. We prayed for a successful outcome for Elizabeth. Hannah and I decided to go for a walk to the Hill which has a large cross at its top. The pavement has many stone pavers with inscriptions on them. I told Hannah we needed to pray for Elizabeth which we did. While walking on the pavers, Hannah pointed to one and Hannah said, "Trust." The paver said, "Jesus, I trust in You." It truly was a message from the Holy Spirit. Hannah COULDN'T read. Yet, she pointed out that paver. I knew at that moment everything was good. The Lord had this! Elizabeth's surgery was successful. Now Elizabeth, at age 8, is a healthy energetic Child of God. Praise the Lord!!!


