FROM YOUR PASTOR

Our Sisters deeply appreciate the support they received from the second collection in July that assists them in their health care expenses. I am sure that further donations are gratefully received. The practice of Cremation was permitted by the Church in recent years with the following understanding: Cremation is not done to reject our faith in the resurrection of the dead. The Ashes are given the same respect as we would the body. There is a funeral with the ashes present and following that funeral the ashes are buried. Ashes are not to be divided, spread over favorite locations of the deceased, turned into jewelry or divided up among the family. These practices are not permitted by the Church. Once the body is cremated, the State is no longer involved in regulations and many families believe they can do whatever they wish. Please be aware of church discipline and inappropriate secularism.

example of faith to their children. We are here to help our families pass on the faith. We know everyone is thinking about their fall schedules and where and when their children need to be places. LITURGY CORNER **Eucharistic Prayer IV**

Part 3

In the preceding weeks, we reflected on the structure of Eucharistic Prayers in general, and on the unique preface of Eucharistic Prayer IV (EP IV), which orients us to the rest of this Eucharistic Prayer. The preface of EP IV affirms God's almighty and eternal being as creator of all things - including us. God is at the same time our Father, who loves us, who wants to fill us with joy. The preface concludes with the Sanctus.

The next part of the Eucharistic Prayer is called "The Thanksgiving." Here is the prayer of Thanksgiving in EP IV, which speaks for itself:

"And you so loved the world, Father most holy, that in the fullness of time you sent your Only Begotten Son to be our Savior. Made incarnate by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary, he shared our human nature in all things but sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation, to prisoners, freedom, and to the sorrowful of heart, joy. To accomplish your plan, he gave himself up to death, and, rising from the dead, he destroyed death and restored life. And that we might live no longer for ourselves but for him who died and rose again for us, he sent the Holy Spirit from you, Father, as the first fruits for those who believe, so that, bringing to perfection his work in the world, he might sanctify creation to the full."

The next part of a Eucharistic Prayer is called the Epiclesis, which is followed by the Consecration. Stay tuned...

ST. MARY PRAYER CORNER

Am I becoming lukewarm? How often do you think about whether or not you are lukewarm in your faith? Our Lord has some strong words about the lukewarm in Revelation 3:15-16; "I know your works; I know that you are neither cold nor hot. I wish you were either cold or hot. So, because you are lukewarm, neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of my mouth." Pope St. Pius echoed the Lord's words saying, "All the evils of the world are due to lukewarm Catholics." Our Catechism #2094 states: "lukewarmness is hesitation or negligence in responding to divine love; it can imply refusal to give oneself over to the prompting of charity."

How do we understand this? Well, we can look at it from the standpoint that God has created us so that we can be united with Him and reach 'perfect charity'. The virtue of charity unites and disposes us to love God above all creatures for Himself, and to love ourselves and our neighbors for the sake of God. So, this 'refusal to give oneself over to God' can be, in part, as not listening and responding to the call of the Holy Spirit over our lives. That still, small voice, alive and well in us must be better understood and discerned.

Turning to the saints, we find what St. Teresa of Avila said about the lukewarm: "The lukewarm do not embrace the cross; they merely drag it along."

What can I do? Ask God for zeal for Him. His grace alone will give you what you need in every circumstance!




