FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This Second Sunday of Ordinary Time presents us with a beautiful Gospel passage in the miracle at the wedding feast at Cana. This is one of our Lord's first signs to manifest who He is. He reveals that He can transform what is ordinary to something extraordinary. As our Lady commands the servants to "do whatever He tells you", He orders them to fill the stone jugs with water. However, the water becomes wine! It does take the cooperation of the servants for this miracle to take place, they have to actually respond to His orders. In a similar way, in our lives, we have to respond to the Lord's promptings. It may be very simple things, like going to Mass faithfully on Sundays, taking time every day for prayer, but we too can experience the transforming power of His grace.

Day of prayer for the unborn- This Saturday, January 22, is a day of prayer and fasting for the protection of all human life. Please, be sure to take some extra time this day interceding for this most basic of human rights- the right to life. Also, in addition to this intention, please, be interceding for anyone who has had an abortion. These men and women are in need of a deep encounter with the Lord's healing mercy. Ultimately, this battle will not just be won by legislation, but by the conversion of hearts!

Faithfulness to one parish- I recently received an email from a young family that is leaving the parish and I rejoiced! The rejoicing was not because of their leaving the parish but the reasons behind the switch: they had been commuting to attend Mass here, but with two little ones it has become difficult to make the trek. They recognize a need to avoid the "consumer mentality" when it comes to parishes and are choosing to invest in their local parish rather than bounce around to what is convenient. Would that every Catholic in Washtenaw County take this same approach! Certainly we ought to avoid the consumer mentality, but committing to one parish means I receive formation/direction from one pastor/team of priests, and I am committed to one community. It is actually for my spiritual benefit to commit to one place and one community. Certainly, there may be situations where you need to attend Mass elsewhere for different reasons, but most Sundays you should be at the parish to which you are committed! We cannot advance as a community of Spirit-filled, missionary disciples of Jesus, if people go to Mass (the source and summit of our life as Christians) to the location that is most convenient for them on any given weekend. Consider this an encouragement to go all-in!
