# FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We hear in today's second reading about all the different parts which make up the Body of Christ. The ear cannot say to the hand I have no need of you. In a similar way, each of us makes up some part of the Body of Christ, the Church. We participate as a member of the body with both the universal Church, that is, the Church throughout the whole world, and in a way with our particular Church here in Ypsilanti. This is where commitment to a particular parish is an essential part of our growing as disciples and advancing the Kingdom of God. If I do not actually commit myself to a particular group of disciples, it would be like a hand saying, I want to move between different bodies. However, the hand cannot function without the rest of the body! Ed Fride as the moderator. I invite you to see the article for more details. I'm grateful that Fr. Ed, Fr. Pieter, and I have already been meeting together to pray (and eat!) and share what the Lord has put on our hearts for this endeavor. They are both holy, good priests, who just desire to make Jesus known and loved. While it is not clear yet what particular changes we may see, we have begun to identify places where we desire to share our resources with one another. I'm grateful that all of us are already seeking to be on mission, and now we get to bless and support each other in furthering that work. Please continue to pray that the Holy Spirit would guide us.
