Happy Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity! This Sunday right after the conclusion of the Easter season is always dedicated to one of the central mysteries of our faith—that God is one in three. While our words will always fall short of the grandeur of God, by faith we do seek to peer into these realities. There is a striking story about St. Thomas Aquinas at the end of his life. He is renowned as one of the greatest theologians in the history of the Church. He wrote extensively on the mystery of who God is, as well as, who we are. However, later in his life, he was praying and had a mystical experience of the Lord. Some posit that it was a glimpse of the Lord's glory. After this experience, he simply said that, "compared with what I have seen, all that I have written is as straw to be burned." Wow! Of course, this doesn't mean we give up, rather this should encourage us to press in to come to know our God who is a communion of love.

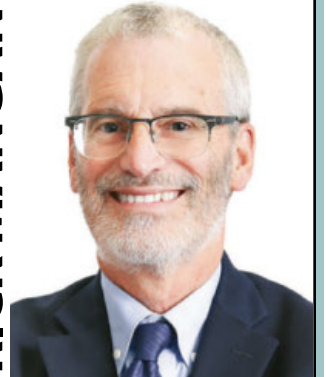
