FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Happy Feast of Corpus Christi! Today we rejoice that our Lord's promise to be with His bride always, is fulfilled in a unique way through His sacramental presence in the Eucharist. What a marvelous gift that our Lord comes to meet us in this humble way. Of course, our openness to His love and grace directly impacts our experience of His real presence. So, what can we do to press in for more? First, repent! We always want to be confessing our sins in the sacrament of reconciliation with a priest. Especially, when we are aware of grave or mortal sins, we must confess prior to receiving communion. Second, we can spend more time in Eucharistic adoration. Adoration is simply an extension of that moment in Mass when the priest holds up the consecrated host and chalice for everyone to adore. We are allowed to fix our gaze upon Him, and to let Him gaze upon us. Thirdly, we can choose to surrender our hearts and lives more fully to Him. A simple prayer which can be very powerful as we receive communion is, "Jesus, please, take your seat on the throne of my heart." That is, be the center of it all—be number one in my life. May we continually grow in our experience of the King of the universe in His body and blood, so that He might sustain us on our pilgrimage to our heavenly home, where we will see Him face to face!

Adoration: Speaking of adoration, I just want to affirm our parish on filling up the slots for First Friday Adoration in June. Due to a scheduling oversight on our part, we didn't have the sign-up out with much advance notice. However, we were able to fill up the slots in just a few hours after that email. So, thank you for your commitment to spending time with our Lord, and let's keep it up in July! Also, we will have a brief period of adoration after the 11 AM Mass this weekend!

Seminarian: I mentioned a while back that we were supposed to have two seminarians with us for the summer, but unfortunately, due to some different circumstances, we will only have one. I'm very grateful for Paul Keenan's presence with us. He just moved into the rectory this past week, and will be around for most of the summer. You've likely seen him serving at weekend Masses, but feel free to introduce yourself throughout the summer. Please, be praying for him and the other men discerning the Lord's will for their lives.

Abortion: With the likely overturning of Roe v. Wade, it will send the fight for the right to life back to the states. There is a petition circulating currently which is incredibly misleading as a reproductive freedom act. People soliciting signatures have been using very misleading tactics. Do not sign this petition! Signing it, with full knowledge would constitute grave sin. See the details in the bulletin for more.

RRM Meeting: I will be in DeWitt on Tuesday for a meeting with the Diocese about the first wave of parish groupings for realigning resources for mission. Please, pray for us!

Finance Council: I will meet with our Finance Council on Wednesday evening. I'm so grateful for the generous service of these parishioners who help us in administering the financial assets of the parish. Between the roof replacement, flood mitigation, and other projects going on, we've been keeping them very busy!



This visiting missionary Priest will be celebrating Mass and making his appeal to SJB on the weekend of July 30/31st.




