A NOTE FROM FR. PETERMAN



Happy Trinity Sunday! On this great feast of the Church, we recall one of the core beliefs of our Catholic faith: that the one God we worship is three divine persons. Thankfully, we don't have to understand this. Sometimes it seems like the more I try to explain the Blessed Trinity the more confused I get! But what is asked of us is to believe it. God truly is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. All three have always existed as the one true God: "In the beginning was the Word,

and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God. All things were made by him: and without him was made nothing that was made." (John 1:1-3) When we come together to worship God at the Holy Mass, we begin by acknowledging each person of the Trinity. In every opening prayer, or Collect, the priest addresses "God our Father" or "O Lord." Then he says, "Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit…" In our personal prayer, we should pray in a similar way. I don't mean you have to use these exact words. But I do think that in our hearts we recognize the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. If you usually pray to Jesus—that is great!—but you might find a deeper way to connect with God by praying to the Father or the Holy Spirit as well. May this Trinity Sunday be for you a renewal of your faith in the One True God — Father, Son, and Holy Spirit!

Next weekend, the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**, also known as **Corpus Christi**. Immediately following the 11:15 AM Mass on Sunday, June 19, the parish will be leading a Eucharistic procession. This is a great opportunity to show our love to Jesus in the Eucharist, and also to witness to our Catholic faith. By processing with Our Eucharistic Lord, we will be publicly proclaiming our faith in Jesus' presence in the Eucharist. If you have never participated in something like this before, I promise you it will be a powerful experience.

This summer, Our Lady of Sorrows will be joining the parishes of St. Fabian and St. Andrew Kim to become a Family of Parishes. About Families of Parishes, Archbishop Vigneron said, "Our focus is on the renewal of our parishes and schools to align all resources to our mission of sharing Christ in southeast Michigan." Please continue to pray for this endeavor and stay tuned for further updates.


Athletic Registration Parent Playbook/Fall Athletic Registration


Teen News
