Welcome School Year 2021-2022 at Christ the King Catholic School

The new school year has arrived as the students came back officially on August 30th. The summer it seems went by very quickly as summers do but the staff and students are ready for school. This year we will be completely in-person and we have quite a few new students. The fact that we were able to operate last year with in-person and virtual classes for students was a plus. In addition, having small class sizes, a variety of programs for students, assistant teachers for every classroom and religion classes are a motivation tool for parents.

Many of the new parents were dissatisfied with other places their students went to in the previous school year. The parents of students who attended in previous years are impressed also about what happened this past school year at Christ the King. The major goals I have for Christ the King Catholic School are to increase enrollment, retain our current students, ensure academics are accelerated with engaging lessons and high-quality teaching and learning, gain more parent participation in school functions, increase the number of stakeholders vested in the school and church, re-image the middle school, and continue to emphasize student accountability.

These goals are the major goals and definitely not all of the goals. We have an excellent and committed team of staff who are thinking along the same lines and are committed to the school goals and the children.

One of the new goals that we have in place, and I have had extensive discussions about, is re-imagining the middle school. To ensure we prepare our middle school students for high school and get the best possible instruction and learning opportunities, we are re-imagining it.

The middle school classrooms, in congruence with classrooms at other grades levels will have assistant teachers that have a focus on implementing small group work, individual assistance and hands on opportunities for the students. In those classrooms the following will also be implemented: project and place-based learning, experiential opportunities, focus on teacher-student meaningful relationships and structured measures of success.

Technology will be extensively used, and specific professional development will be applied to assist the teachers in this endeavor. The middle school consists of core of Helena Bosler, Robert Lothian and Michael Gingles.



Helena Bosler, who teaches English language arts, spelling and religion served as our online teacher for grades 6,7 and 8 this past school year. Mrs. Bosler is goal oriented and very creative in her teachings.



Robert Lothian is new to Christ the King Catholic School. He will be teaching middle school mathematics and science. Mr. Lothian will use a myriad of methods to enhance each child's daily learning experience. He will use the following: textbooks, research websites, Freckle, Renaissance Star (science), and IXL (math) He will use interactive programs to create students own project-based research videos, and so on. He will ensure that each student will have the freedom and trust to align their faith, education, socio-emotional learning, peer-to-peer communication skills amongst a vast number of other types of individual growth. He will use green screen capabilities to create worlds in which the students will explore through their own interactive videos. He will also create several videos weekly that are child friendly, educational, topical, and enjoyable content for YouTube.



Mr. Michael Gingles is also new to Christ the King Catholic School. He will be teaching middle school social studies and creative. Mr. Gingles has high

expectations for his students and in his social studies class he will ensure the students learn the historical habits, thinking, understanding, & analyses since the beginning of human society. He will venture into early civilizations and cultures, classical traditions of the eastern hemisphere. He will ensure the students have a geographical understanding of important known places and regions. He will ensure the students obtain knowledge and the purposes of civics and governments here and abroad. In his creative writing teachings, he will expand a student's writing skills where his or her imagination can be used to write a story. Types of creating writing will include fiction and non-fiction, poems, scripts for a play, or an entry in a personal journal. He will also ensure that students will be engaged in reporting on "current events" (two per week) to enhance and to omit language barriers, increase vocabulary, comprehension, encourage critical thinking, problem solving, oral expressions, and listening skills. He emphasizes that his goals for students are to become an informed citizen and a lifelong news reader.

This will be an excellent year for Christ the King Catholic School. The expectations are higher than last year, and we are ready to uphold the ever-changing needs of our children in an ever-changing society. With the collaboration of all stakeholders and a committed teaching and church staff we will attain the goals we are setting. We want all our students to be prepared for the next grade and we will continually add new academic and enrichment programs, stay current and update ourselves with the modern instructional practices to benefit teaching and learning and focus on the individual student.
