Mercy in Action Day of Service 2021.

Last Saturday, October 16th, parishes from across the Archdiocese of Detroit "witnessed to the power of God's Mercy during the Fifth Annual Mercy in Action Service Day. Normally, this event, hosted by individual

vicariates and parishes at multiple locations has brought together thousands of volunteers who courageously engage in the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy". Due to COVID-19 the AOD states that "the people of Southeast Michigan hunger for an experience of God's Mercy like never before!" The invitation asked if

'Christ the King Parish was in'? And as always, even if in a much smaller capacity the answer was, "YES!"

In the past we have done fall yard clean-up for the parish, assisted seniors with their personal yard cleaning and served at St Christine. Due to the difficulty of planning a group project during the pandemic, the service project this year was left completely up to us. As a staff we came up with the idea for parishioners to create three small goodie bags for seniors and/or parishioners we have missed worshipping with during COVID. The bags would consist of light snacks such as granola bars, fruit, small candies and a coco or cider packet, etc. Most importantly a personalized note expressing how much we miss them and how we are praying for them would be included.

Three names of parishioners living in close proximity were provided to anyone who asked to take part in this this year's contact free service project.

As in many cases when we request for volunteers, parishioners Tess Tchou & Diane Griffith were quick to respond. Tess shared with me, "I initially learned about Mercy Day through a flyer sent out by the Vicariate asking for support for a clothing donation drive at St. Scholastica. I thought it was a good idea for Christ the King to reconnect w/ elderly parishioners, but the expansion of the project to include outreach to parishioners who have not been seen or heard from since the pandemic was even better."



We especially liked this project for families with smaller children. Deacon Joe loved the idea that "parents and grandparents with children

could work together and talk about how we are all called to imitate God's mercy. The kindness, generosity and love we can share with others is like all those little blessings of comfort we receive from our merciful God when we are lonely, or sick or maybe scared about something like COVID. An unexpected card from a child and a little snack are such sweet surprises that your children can give to our seniors and parish members who are right now not able to gather with us. That is indeed a reflection of the sweet mercy of God to warm the hearts of those receiving these little packets of goodies" with a simple ring of the bell, a wave, smile and/or peace sign.

The Stamper Family is the perfect example of imitating God's mercy through their actions. Pre-pandemic, the three children celebrated their individual birthdays by hosting coffee hours

for the parish. Then, at the beginning of the lockdown they contacted the office and asked for names and addresses of parishioners they could send handmade cards and loving messages to. Though the family lives quite a distance from Christ the King and have been unable to worship with us due to safety concerns, parents Ron & Christine have made a concerted effort to stay connected to the parish through online children's religious education and by attending Mass via Zoom . Christine shared, "I think we're going to make up some bags for the nuns that live in

"I think we're going to make up some bags for the nuns that live in the neighborhood in addition to the names you give us. I know my mom is going to visit a nun friend of hers and I'll give her the bags when she goes. I'm ok with the distance either way. We're always up for a drive. I just like the idea that we can make someone who needs it smile."



For me personally, I loved the idea of sharing this special time of giving back with my son. A delay in him leaving allowed for us to work on this project together and I am grateful we had the opportunity

to support our parish the way we have been loved and supported.

As I write this article, there have not been many requests for names, but the great thing about this service project is there is no expiration date. We still have names available for anyone who feels called to, as Christine and Deacon Joe said, "imitate God's mercy and make someone who needs it smile."



THE WISDOM OF POPE FRANCIS



With a sense of responsibility, commitment and concern for the environment and for the poor, people who are young adults today may be the last generation able to ensure a healthy future for all the Earth's inhabitants. Today our mother

Earth is groaning and warning us that we are approaching dangerous thresholds. Young adults are perhaps the last generation that can save us; I am not exaggerating.

The young economists, entrepreneurs, scholars and scientists have been working online in international groups with older experts for more than 18 months, studying agriculture and employment, peace and ecology, finance and development in the search for ways to make the economy better for more people and for the environment.

I ask you to draw on your creativity and resilience. I pray that you would use your gifts and knowledge to right the wrongs of the past and direct us toward a new economy that is more inclusive, sustainable and supportive.

The importance of the young people's work is more obvious than ever.

The COVID-19 pandemic has not only revealed to us the profound inequalities that infect our societies: it has amplified them. Since the appearance of a virus from the animal world, our communities have suffered a great increase in unemployment, poverty, inequality, hunger and exclusion from necessary health care.

Over the past two years, we have been confronted with all our failures in caring for our common home and family, a past and present where too little attention and energy is devoted to cooperation, solidarity and to the relationship between human beings and the rest of nature.

The sick economy that kills stems from the assumption that we are owners of creation, able to exploit it for our own interests and growth.

But the pandemic reminds us that we have been called to care for the goods that creation gives to all; it reminds us of our duty to work and distribute these goods in such a way that no one is excluded. Finally, it also reminds us that, immersed in a common sea, we must embrace the need for a new fraternity.

This is a favorable time to feel anew that we need one another, that we have a responsibility toward one another and toward the world.

Living in kinship with one another and caring for the earth, he said, means learning fairer ways to sell and distribute goods and more responsible behavior when we consume.

With our gaze fixed on Jesus, we will find the inspiration to design a new world and the courage to walk together toward a better future, putting kinship at the center of the economy.

Do not be discouraged: Let yourselves be guided by the love of the Gospel, which is the spring of all change and which urges us to enter into the wounds of history and rise again.


