A Kean Perspective: "Resuming Ordinary Time"

Today is our first weekend liturgy using green to denote Ordinary Time. It is the eleventh week, and a good one to get back to business. Ordinary Time, of course, doesn't mean that the Masses are "ordinary" in that there is nothing special. Rather, it means that the themes of this long season are ordered to teach and lead us. How providential that we resume this week when we hear from the prophet Ezekiel about the cedar bud that is replanted on a high hill. This image is similar to the gospel metaphors for the Kingdom of God: the seed that sprouts and grows at night in a marvelous way, and the mustard seed that becomes the biggest of all the shrub trees.

For us at St. John Fisher we see this as a good time to introduce our CSA campaign for this year. Though we are in the process of reducing our target amount, we must begin. Those who have been here through this past year will remember that last year's campaign did


not go well. This year we want to shoot for \$50,000. Though I am confident that this year's target amount will be less, any overage will help the shortfall from the previous year. Our goal last year was about \$80,000, and we only took in about \$15,000. But we'll take it one year at a time – this can be the year that we begin to rebound. We are the tiny shoot of Ezekiel or the mustard seed in Mark's gospel that starts small but grows big.

Since we are a parish in flux and have many new parishioners, many of you will want to use the cards that are provided at Mass; others may want to donate online. I myself will make a donation in which I give regularly throughout the year. This allows me to be more generous than I would if it were just a one-time gift. I invite you to consider doing the same.

The program will run all year, so know that we will report on this program from time to time. For those who give now, know that your generosity is much appreciated – may God's blessings go with you.




votion and love. They meditated upon his wounds with a special emphasis on the pierced side. The theology and devotion of the sacred heart is primarily based on two New Testament texts. In John 7:37-38 Jesus speaks of streams of life-giving water that will flow from within him. In John 19:34 the soldier's spear piercing Jesus' side brings forth blood and water. In the early Church it was often thought of as Baptism (water) and Holy Eucharist (Blood). This is the wellspring for the Church's sacraments.

For me personally, the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus began in Eucharistic Adoration. Especially during my 30-day Ignatian retreat last summer, the principal foundational statement that "Man is created to praise, reverence, and serve God our Lord, and by this means to save his soul" came alive. It was a two-fold realization that occurred to me that my love was a response borne out of gratitude, and I glorify God to share and participate in God's ongoing work (love is always generative). When Jesus revealed His Heart to St. Margaret Mary in 1675, He lamented: "There it is, that Heart so deeply in love with men, it spared no means of proof wearing itself out until it was utterly spent! This meets with scant appreciation from most of them; all I get back is ingratitude, witness their irreverence, their sacrileges, their coldness, and contempt for me in the Sacrament of Love."

Jesus asks each of us today that we might make up for this ingratitude. Let us thank God for the proof of His love which He gave us in Jesus who continues to love us with His Sacred and Eucharistic Heart.

O Jesus, meek and humble of Heart.
Make our hearts like unto Thine.
