

From Fr. Pieter

Greetings! Merry Christmas! On the Feast of the Holy Family we celebrate Christmas from the perspective of Christian Family—the Holy Family of Mary, Joseph, and Jesus shows us the way that God desires to sanctify Christian family life. Pope St. John Paul II said "As the family goes, so goes the nation and so goes the whole world in which we live" (Homily of John Paul II, Perth Australia, 30 November 1986). If families suffer the Church suffers. Strengthening families should be a top priority for Catholics (even for those of us without children of our own—if you live alone, in what follows, think in terms of your community: friends, parents, siblings, and nieces and nephews—how can you help them live for Christ).

Faith-filled families shine the light of Christ into the world—they are a powerful, if not the most powerful method of evangelization. So what can we do to strengthen the life of faith in families? Firstly we can lead families to the sacraments. But our Catholic tradition also emphasizes something vital outside our parishes: the life of faith within the home, the *Domestic Church*. Parish programs help, but families must do the hard work. When St. Teresa of Calcutta won the Nobel Peace Prize she was asked, "Mother Teresa, what advice do you have for changing the world and promoting peace?" She answered "Go home and love your family."

How can we nourish the life of faith in the *Domestic Church* at home? Try to bring a rhythm of prayer into the life of your home. To be sure, we can't turn Domestic Church into a monastery, but we can sanctify our family life. Start with things that you see and smell (we learn through our senses; this is partly why we have incense and candles at Mass, and why we genuflect toward the Tabernacle—the movement of our bodies reminds us that the King of the Universe is present). In family life this can mean keeping images of Christ, the saints, a crucifix prominently visible, so that everywhere you turn reminds you of your faith.

Then try to pray together. Here are some ideas: You can begin the day with the short Morning Offering prayer (look it up on google). At the breakfast table some families read the daily Mass readings out loud if they aren't going to daily Mass that day (www.usccb.org). At noon, you can re-center your day by praying the Angelus. In particular, I urge you to pray the rosary [or even just one decade of the rosary] daily. Pope Pius XII wrote: The Rosary is a powerful weapon to put the demons to flight and to keep oneself from sin...If you desire peace in your hearts, in your homes, and in your country, assemble each evening to recite the Rosary. Let not even one day pass without saying it, no matter how burdened you may be with many cares and labors.

Family prayer doesn't have to be perfect (children bickering or puppies barking may all be part of what makes each Domestic Church a little different from all the others). But like G.K. Chesterton wrote, "If a thing is worth doing, it is worth doing badly." We just need to keep putting one foot in front of the other and walking toward Jesus. The life of the Domestic Church can be as challenging and unexpected as the unique combination of souls in each home, but God designed family so we could help each other to Heaven. He wants to use our families to change the world. Please pray for our Christian families and our parish family.
