## Solemnity of Pentecost

The Easter Season comes to its glorious conclusion with the great Solemnity of Pentecost. In ancient times Pentecost was a Jewish harvest feast, celebrated fifty days after Passover (hence the name “Pentecost,” which means fiftieth in Greek). At Pentecost, bread made from the newly-harvested grain would be offered to God. The feast also commemorated the giving of the Law on Mount Sinai.

It was while Jews from every nation were gathered in Jerusalem to celebrate this feast that the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples of Jesus gathered in prayer, like wind and fire. They must have remembered the Exodus account of the giving of the Law to Moses, when there was a sound like a trumpet blast, and fire and smoke. But the contrasts between the giving of the Law and the giving of the Holy Spirit are even more striking than the similarities. At Sinai, Moses alone went up to receive the immutable Word of God carved on tablets of stone. On the day of Pentecost the Holy Spirit came down on the people and rested on each of them in a play of wind and fire. The Holy Spirit cannot be contained, or written down. The Sequence, “Come, Holy Spirit,” that is prayed during Masses on the Solemnity of Pentecost addresses the Holy Spirit with many different titles and images—the Spirit is “Father of the poor,” “comforter,” “sweet refreshment,” “solace,” and “light.” The multitude of images suggests the free play of the Holy Spirit.

The Solemnity of Pentecost is sometimes called “the birthday of the Church,” because it was only after they were filled with the gifts of the Spirit that the apostles set forth on the mission Christ gave them, to preach the Good News, and to baptize all nations. The Holy Spirit transformed them, and transforms us.


For parish activities such as meetings, Christian Service events, study and support groups, etc., the guidelines from the Archdiocese allows the parish to make our buildings available if people feel comfortable gathering in person. All COVID-19 safety measures (facemasks, social distancing, etc.) must be followed when these activities take place on parish properties. Please use the Activities Center door to enter for these activities.

### Updated COVID-19 Liturgical Guidelines

On May 13, 2021, the Archdiocese of Detroit amended some liturgical restrictions for the celebration of public Masses during the COVID-19 pandemic. Beginning next weekend, May 29th/30th the following changes will take place at Masses here at St. Colette Church. We will reinstate the following:

- The in-person collection in the pews during Mass by passing the collection baskets.
- The Presentation of the Gifts of Bread and Wine by members of the assembly.
- It is no longer imperative for us to enforce social distancing during the Communion procession. Since it is such a short period of time, social distancing is not crucial here.

In light of recent guidelines from the Centers for Disease Control and orders from the Michigan Department of Health, last week the Archdiocese was to announce directives regarding the wearing of face coverings and the practice of social distancing at Masses and other parish activities. If received in time, these directives are included in this weekend’s edition of the church paper as an insert.



## Pastor’s Corner

Today the universal Church concludes the celebration of the Easter Season with the observance of Pentecost Sunday! Pentecost recalls what happened to the apostles and disciples of Jesus after Easter when God the Holy Spirit entered their lives and gave them the courage and strength to proclaim the Gospel. Because of the Pentecost event, the Church was able to grow and endure years of persecution and hardship. Even today, the Holy Spirit continues to inspire the Church as a community of believers and as individuals. On this Pentecost Sunday, let us pray for the whole Church that we may allow the Holy Spirit to penetrate our lives and inspire us to do our share in building God’s Kingdom here on earth!

Ordinarily the Saturday of Pentecost weekend is the day the Archdiocese of Detroit celebrates the Sacrament of Holy Orders with the ordination of new priests. This year we celebrate the ordination of three transitional deacons to the priesthood for service in the Archdiocese. However, due to COVID-19 seating limitations and social distancing requirements, the three cannot be ordained together at one Mass at the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament. Instead, two were ordained last Saturday, May 15th: Rev. John Dudek and Rev. Robert Voiland. This weekend on Saturday, May 22nd, Rev. Zaid Chabaan was ordained. We congratulate our new priests and we should continue to pray for them as they begin their priestly ministry serving God’s people.

Next weekend we will reinstate some liturgical practices that were temporarily discontinued since March of 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Reinstated are the in-person collection in the pews during Mass by passing the collection baskets and the Presentation of the Gifts of Bread and Wine by members of the assembly. In addition, it is no longer necessary for us to encourage social distancing during the Communion procession. Since it is such a short period of time, social distancing is not crucial here. These liturgical changes comply with directives issued by the Archdiocese of Detroit on May 13, 2021.

As this church paper goes to print on May 18th, parishes have not received directives from the Archdiocese regarding the wearing of face coverings and practicing social distancing in the pews of the church. Directives regarding these issues were expected sometime last week. If our parish office received these directives in time, they will be included in today’s church paper as an insert.

Currently our parish is joining all the parishes of the Archdiocese of Detroit by participating in the annual Catholic Services Appeal (CSA). The CSA makes possible a wealth of ministries, programs and services that touch the lives of thousands of Catholics and others throughout the six counties of southeast Michigan that make up the Archdiocese of Detroit. Just as our weekly contributions support the everyday operations and services of St. Colette Parish, so does the CSA support the daily operations and services provided by the Archdiocese of Detroit.

Every parish is given a CSA target goal established by the Archdiocese. This year our parish’s goal is \$173,034. Every parish household is asked to make a sacrificial gift to this year’s CSA. The hope is that the average gift will be in the vicinity of \$275 per household. For some, especially those on fixed incomes, this will not be possible, even as a sacrifice, so whatever gift they can give will be appreciated. For others a gift of \$275 or more gift can be made to this year’s CSA campaign. What is asked from everyone is not an equal gift but an equal sacrifice. What is important is that each of us does the very best they can. Please consider making a pledge to the CSA allowing you to spread the payment of your gift over several months.

Prayerfully consider the most generous gift possible to support the CSA. When you receive your information in the mail regarding this year’s CSA campaign, please read it very carefully and support the CSA to the best of your ability. May God bless you for your continued support.

## Blood Drive Wednesday, June 9th


