

### **Marriage Anniversary Mass**

Every year in the Fall, St. Colette Parish honors and celebrates with married couples who are observing a significant marriage anniversary. This year's celebration will take place in church on **Sunday, October 17th at the 12 Noon Mass**. Married couples whose marriages were witnessed by a Catholic priest or deacon and are observing their 10th, 25th, 40th, 50th, 60th, 70th or 75th Anniversary are invited, with their families, to join in the celebration. After the 12 Noon Mass, all the couples will be called to stand in their place and renew their marriage vows and receive a Papal Blessing.

These are not the only years a couple can request a celebration honoring their anniversary of marriage; especially if it is a significant anniversary such as 15th, 20th, 30th, 35th, 45th, 55th, 65th, or any year. The anniversary blessing for a couple whose marriage was witnessed by a Catholic priest or deacon can be celebrated during or after almost any weekend or weekday Mass and family and friends are invited to participate. The Archdiocese of Detroit is in the process of implementing a new way for parishes to collaborate and share ministries, programs and staffing called Family of Parishes. Each year in June we honor students who are graduating from High School and College. We offer thanks for all they have received in their educational training over the years. We pray to God that their futures will be blessed not only with success and happiness but also with an increased faith in God’s presence in their lives. May that faith enlighten and encourage them to share their gifts and talents with the Church and the human family.

This time of year, we celebrate the end of another academic year as many of our students, teachers, and school administrators and staffs begin summer vacations. Like those who are graduating, may they too appreciate the loving guidance God has granted them during the past year. May they have a restful and safe observance of the upcoming summer months using the time for relaxation in preparation for a new school year.

Since September of last year, the members of our High School Youth Ministry Program have met almost every Monday evening, either in person or virtually, for prayer, fellowship, and catechesis as well as for events on other days for Christian Service opportunities. In addition, our Junior High Youth Ministry Program, in conjunction with other parishes in the area, has provided a variety of activities for this age level to the best of their ability in light of the COVID-19 pandemic. A thank you is extended to our Coordinator of Youth Ministry, Mary Jo Parnell, our assistant coordinator, Aleta Cheal and to the Youth Leadership Team, Adult Leadership volunteers, and parents. Our parish is very fortunate to have these people share their talents and ministries with us. May God bless them in their efforts.

Besides our Youth Ministry Program, our parish is grateful for the service provided by other members of our staff. A thank you is extended to our Director of Music Ministry, Mark Newlon for overseeing the program and sharing with us his talent as a musician, singer, and director. Gratitude is offered to our cantors for leading us in song at our weekend Masses. Due to COVID-19 restrictions our choirs (adult, children’s and resurrection) were unable to share their ministries with us. I know they look forward to resuming their services in the Fall.

Besides those involved in our music program, we would not be able to celebrate Masses and the sacraments if it were not for all the other liturgical ministers offering their services: Fr. Alex, Fr. Mike, Deacon Gary, as well as the altar servers, church decorators and cleaners, Eucharistic ministers, lectors, sacristans, ushers, hospitality ministers, and, of course, you the members of the assembly. May God bless all of you for your dedicated service to our parish family.

Working many hours behind the scenes keeping our parish offices efficient and our properties and buildings operating and clean are the members of our parish’s support staff. This is headed by our parish’s business manager Greg Boyer and working with him are the parish secretaries Sue Donaldson and Ann Kopitz, the parish bookkeeper Karen Roosen, and the maintenance staff headed by Alex Luckhardt and assisted by Mark Standard and Aidan Micallef. A big thank you is extended to all of them for their dedicated services to St. Colette Parish.

Recognition too must be served to our Director of Religious Education, Theresa Lisiecki and her staff of Aileen Picano and Suzanne Sims. During the pandemic, they faced the difficult challenge of providing home schooling for the students of our Religious Education Program, especially for those preparing for the celebration of the sacraments of Confirmation, First Penance, and First Communion. In addition, we recognize the many programs provided by our parish under the leadership of our Christian Service Coordinator Cindy Portis. With pandemic restrictions and challenges, Cindy and her many volunteer groups provided collections of food, Advent Giving Tree gifts, and Valentine candy/school supplies and overseeing the activities of crafters and outreach to the home-bound. Service has been provided, though on a limited basis, by the Women’s Guild and the Daughters of Isabella, and the Dr. Thomas Dooley Knights of Columbus. To all these people and to those who supported our Religious Education and Christian Service programs and activities, may God bless you as well.

Currently our parish is joining all the parishes of the Archdiocese of Detroit by participating in the annual Catholic Services Appeal (CSA). Every parish is given a CSA target goal established by the Archdiocese. This year our parish’s goal is \$173,034. Every parish household is asked to make a sacrificial gift to this year’s CSA. The hope is that the average gift will be in the vicinity of \$275 per household. For some, especially those on fixed incomes, this will not be possible, even as a sacrifice, so whatever gift they can give will be appreciated. For others a gift of \$275 or more gift can be made to this year’s CSA campaign. What is asked from everyone is not an equal gift but an equal sacrifice. What is important is that each of us does the very best they can. Please consider making a pledge to the CSA allowing you to spread the payment of your gift over several months.

Prayerfully consider the most generous gift possible to support the CSA. When you receive your information in the mail regarding this year’s CSA campaign, please read it very carefully and support the CSA to the best of your ability. May God bless you for your continued support.

## Times the Church Is Open for Private Prayer



Due to COVID-19, many people are hesitant to come to church to celebrate Mass on weekends or weekdays and choose to watch Mass online or on television.

Another opportunity for prayer is to come to church when Mass is not being celebrated. Certainly, one can always pray at home, but prayer in church in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle is called adoration. Our church is open for private prayer Monday – Thursday from 8:00 am – 3:00 pm, Friday from 8:00 am – 2:30 pm, Saturday from 9:00 am – 5:00 pm, and Sunday from 7:00 am – 1:00 pm. Please note that some days the church is used for Masses or funerals and for cleaning and disinfecting. Contact the parish office for updated availability of the church building.

## DETROIT CENTER FOR THE WORKS OF MERCY

Catholic Charities has opened a new building called the Detroit Center for the Works of Mercy. They are located at 8642 Woodward Avenue in Detroit. This will also be the location for the All Saints Soup Kitchen hopefully by fall. Clothing and food boxes are given to people in the area and volunteers are needed to sort clothing and pack food boxes. The following is from Julie who coordinates the volunteers:

Our greatest need currently is having people come out to help us sort clothes. We had some spring/summer clothing drives recently with various parishes around southeast Michigan and people were very generous, so we have many donations to sort through. Tasks would include sorting through bags, hanging and folding clothes, restocking, and organizing the clothing room where client's shop, etc. We would take people anytime in the clothing room right now. Monday-Friday 9 am -5 pm or we often host groups on Saturday mornings from 9 am-noon.

Lastly, every Thursday from 1 pm -3 pm, we do an outreach event outside of our building on Woodward where we hand out free food & clothing to anyone that walks by and we get their information so we can schedule them an appointment with any of our services (i.e., food, clothing, case management, etc.). We are thinking of doing that on Saturdays too when we have enough volunteers! If you are interested in helping at this center, please call Julia Fabrizi, office: (313) 335-3261 ext. 3070.

## COVID-19 Liturgical Protocols

On May 19, 2021, Archbishop Allen Vigneron issued updated COVID-19 liturgical protocols for churches in the Archdiocese of Detroit in light of guidance from national and state health officials. These protocols are meant to permit and encourage the reverent offering of and active participation in the liturgical life of the Church.

### Updated liturgical protocols in our church:

- All church doors are unlocked for entrance into the church building.
- The Scripture Readings and music for weekend Masses are printed in the church paper. When entering the church, please receive a copy of the paper so you can more fully participate in the Mass.
- Face coverings and seating:
  - ◆ If you are fully vaccinated the wearing of a face covering is optional and you may sit anywhere in the church.
  - ◆ If you are not fully vaccinated, wear a face covering and sit in the side sections of pews (those along the church windows).
- The in-person monetary collection is resumed with the passing of the collection baskets in the pews.
- The Presentation of the Gifts of Bread and Wine by members of the assembly is resumed.
- The offering of the Sign of Peace is resumed allowing individuals to make their own determination about how widely and in what form to share the Sign of Peace.
- Distribution of Holy Communion:
  - ◆ When walking in procession to receive Communion, it is no longer necessary to keep a distance of six feet between you and the person in front of you.
  - ◆ We continue to refrain from distributing the consecrated Wine at Communion.
  - ◆ Clergy and Extraordinary Ministers of Communion continue to sanitize their hands after they receive Communion and prior to distributing Communion. They will continue to wear a face covering while distributing Communion.
  - ◆ If receiving Communion on the tongue, please receive from the priest and try to be the last person in line. If seated in the special needs pews you will have to wait until after Mass to receive Communion from the priest.


