Every year in the Fall, St. Colette Parish honors and celebrates with married couples who are observing a significant marriage anniversary. This year's celebration will take place in church on **Sunday, October 17th at the 12 Noon Mass**. Married couples whose marriages were witnessed by a Catholic priest or deacon and are observing their 10th, 25th, 40th, 50th, 60th, 70th or 75th Anniversary are invited, with their families, to join in the celebration. After the 12 Noon Mass, all the couples will be called to stand in their place and renew their marriage vows and receive a Papal Blessing.

Please leave your name, contact information, anniversary year, and the name of the church where your marriage was witnessed. Since Papal Blessings need to be ordered ahead of time, **please contact the parish office by Tuesday, July 13th.**

These are not the only years a couple can request a celebration honoring their anniversary of marriage; especially if it is a significant anniversary such as 15th, 20th, 30th, 35th, 45th, 55th, 65th, or any year. Pastor’s Corner


This weekend our country is observing Father’s Day on Sunday! I would like to take this opportunity to extend best wishes to all fathers, grandfathers, and godfathers and to all men who may be like a father to someone. Also we remember our deceased fathers and pray God will grant them eternal peace. Today we recognize and honor the dedicated work all men offer to their families, the Church and the community. May God bless all men for their service, care and love.

This week, please remember in your prayers the students, catechists, teacher’s aids, staff and volunteers who are beginning their summer catechism program (SCAP) in the mornings and evenings. With our prayerful support, the catechism classes will enhance our students’ young lives with the gift of faith.

Currently our parish is joining all the parishes of the Archdiocese of Detroit by participating in the annual Catholic Services Appeal (CSA). Every parish is given a CSA target goal established by the Archdiocese. This year our parish’s goal is \$173,034. Every parish household is asked to make a sacrificial gift to this year’s CSA. The hope is that the average gift will be in the vicinity of \$275 per household. For some, especially those on fixed incomes, this will not be possible, even as a sacrifice, so whatever gift they can give will be appreciated. For others a gift of \$275 or more gift can be made to this year’s CSA campaign. What is asked from everyone is not an equal gift but an equal sacrifice. What is important is that each of us does the very best they can. Please consider making a pledge to the CSA allowing you to spread the payment of your gift over several months.

Prayerfully consider the most generous gift possible to support the CSA. When you receive your information in the mail regarding this year’s CSA campaign, please read it very carefully and support the CSA to the best of your ability. May God bless you for your continued support.

COVID-19 Liturgical Protocols

On May 19, 2021, Archbishop Allen Vigneron issued updated COVID-19 liturgical protocols for churches in the Archdiocese of Detroit in light of guidance from national and state health officials. These protocols are meant to permit and encourage the reverent offering of and active participation in the liturgical life of the Church.

Updated liturgical protocols in our church:

- All church doors are unlocked for entrance into the church building.
- The Scripture Readings and music for weekend Masses are printed in the church paper. When entering the church, please receive a copy of the paper so you can more fully participate in the Mass.
- Face coverings and seating:
 - ◆ If you are fully vaccinated the wearing of a face covering is optional and you may sit anywhere in the church.
 - ◆ If you are not fully vaccinated, wear a face covering and sit in the side sections of pews (those along the church windows).
- The in-person monetary collection is resumed with the passing of the collection baskets in the pews.
- The Presentation of the Gifts of Bread and Wine by members of the assembly is resumed.
- The offering of the Sign of Peace is resumed allowing individuals to make their own determination about how widely and in what form to share the Sign of Peace.
- Distribution of Holy Communion:
 - ◆ When walking in procession to receive Communion, it is no longer necessary to keep a distance of six feet between you and the person in front of you.
 - ◆ We continue to refrain from distributing the consecrated Wine at Communion.
 - ◆ Clergy and Extraordinary Ministers of Communion continue to sanitize their hands after they receive Communion prior to distributing Communion. They will continue to wear a face covering while distributing Communion.
 - ◆ If receiving Communion on the tongue, please receive from the priest and try to be the last person in line. If seated in the special needs pews you will have to wait until after Mass to receive Communion from the priest.



Thanks to all the donors who supported the St. Colette Blood Drive on June 9th. We had the best turn-out in over a year with 85 donor appointments, 11 walk-ins and a total of 77 donors signed in. Altogether, 60 units of whole blood were collected plus seven double red cell and one unit of plasma for a **total of 75 units** of blood products. The Parish offers a sincere “Thank you” to all who participated. Versiti/Michigan reports that the blood from this drive will help impact up to 225 lives.

DETROIT CENTER FOR THE WORKS OF MERCY

Catholic Charities has opened a new building called the Detroit Center for the Works of Mercy. They are located at 8642 Woodward Avenue in Detroit. This will also be the location for the All Saints Soup Kitchen, hopefully by fall. Clothing and food boxes are given to people in the area and volunteers are needed to sort clothing and pack food boxes.

They are in need of volunteers to help sort clothing. Tasks would include sorting through bags, hanging and folding clothes, restocking, and organizing the clothing room where client’s shop, etc. We would take people anytime in the clothing room right now. Monday-Friday 9-5 or we often host groups on Saturday mornings from 9 am-noon.

On Thursday from 1 pm until 3 pm, they hand out free food & clothing to anyone that walks by and they get their information to schedule an appointment with any of our services (i.e., food, clothing, case management, etc.) If you are interested in helping at this center, please call Julia Fabrizi, Office: (313) 335-3261 ext. 3070.

“Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?” —Mark 4:40

If you have ever been on an airplane when turbulence bounces it around, you know how unsettling it can be. When the pilot or flight attendant comes on the loudspeaker and announces there is nothing to be concerned about—it’s just a temporary change in the wind direction or air pressure—you sigh in relief. But it wouldn’t be unusual to still be a little worried. Why is that? Well, probably it is because it is hard to place our trust in another human being, even if he or she seems very qualified. In our Gospel today, a storm threatens to capsize the boat in which Jesus and his disciples are sailing in. Jesus isn’t the least bit worried. In fact, he is fast asleep! His disciples, on the other hand, are terrified. They wake Jesus and he calms the storm with just a wave of his hand. They have seen Jesus perform other miracles, but still they are amazed that he can control creation. When we are faced with frightening situations, it might be hard for us to believe that Jesus can change our predicament. The Gospel this weekend should remind us that God can do anything!



Let us pray: Lord, please give me unwavering faith that you are God, and you will not abandon me.

Reflection: As a family, write a simple prayer that you can all pray when you are afraid.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

As we look at our lives and world events, do we ever find ourselves wondering if God is sleeping? After all, maybe God’s patient, unconditional love has run its course and He is finally fed up with humanity’s reluctance to accept the truth about who we are. God really can’t be that patient! All throughout human history, many have prayed to God for intervention or for particular needs. Because their prayers were not answered in the way they wanted or anticipated, they felt that God may have abandoned them. Were they right? It seems that we are continuing, at a rapid rate, down a path of destruction. Do you not care, God, that we may be perishing? When the boats of our lives are rocking and the seas tumultuous, we want to know that we have God’s attention. Even more so, we want God’s intervention.

Maybe the storms and the waves are necessary. If we listen, they can teach us valuable lessons. Without them, we would never learn that we have the strength to endure, understand the uselessness of fear and worry, or develop the ability to really trust. If God immediately rushed in and simply calmed things down before they got difficult, what good would that really be? We would miss opportunities to learn how to drink more deeply of life, treasure its complexity, irony, and beauty and fully engage ourselves in surrendering to the love of our Creator. It is easy to walk on the surface of life without immersing ourselves in its messiness. Life has to burn its way through us in order to bring us to a place of secure trust. It’s unfortunate that some prefer a shallower journey.

That’s the balancing act that comes with faith. It is not God’s job to prevent us from encountering the torrential rains and winds of life. Many believe that if faith is done the right way, that God will provide for smooth sailing. That’s not how it works. God permits us to ride out the difficult stuff knowing that the storm will eventually be calmed. Do we not have faith that God will do this? True faith trusts in the steadfastness of God’s love when the seas are calm and when they are choppy. God’s unconditional loving presence shines through all of it and endures forever. Knowing this allows us to put our boats out into uncharted waters without hesitation. Knowing that we prefer the comfort and safety of what we know to be still waters, how do we feel when Jesus says, “Let us cross to the other side”?
