National Holiday of Independence Day – July 4th

Imagine flying over the United States in a plane at twilight this weekend. You could watch fireworks going off between you in all directions as every town celebrates the birthday of our nation. They celebrate because, on this day in 1776, the *Declaration of Independence* was announced publicly.

The Declaration was basically a list of the reasons why the 13 colonies had broken ties with their mother country, Great Britain. It was written by a committee headed by Thomas Jefferson. It stated that all people have a right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. By the time the Declaration was produced, the Revolutionary War had already been going on for some months. It would take eight years for the colonists to win the independence they prized so greatly.

Traditional celebrations for Independence Day include parades, bell ringing, picnics, family reunions, band concerts, and, of course, fireworks. It's a time for fun and a time for reflection, too. People give thanks today for a beautiful country and for a system of government that is admired all over the world.

Even in the United States, the poor and minority citizens are often robbed of their basic rights. Frederick Douglas, the great anti-slavery writer, was once asked to give a speech on the Fourth of July. Pointing out that many African Americans were still held as slaves, he told those who had asked him to speak, "The blessings for which you on this day rejoice are not held in common."

Our bright celebrations for Independence Day are done in the hope that one day all will be free, that one day the earth itself will shine with liberty!



Communal Celebration of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick This Sunday, July 4th In the Church at 1:15 pm

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is intended for anyone seven years and older who is chronically ill, undergoing medical testing or surgery, disabled by disease, age or addiction, or is affected by psychological or emotional problems. As the title states, this is a sacrament for the sick and not the dying!

If you are in need of celebrating the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, please join others this Sunday, July 4th at 1:15 pm in the church. The celebration of the sacrament will begin once everyone is assembled and depending on the number being anointed the ritual should take approximately 20 – 30 minutes.

The communal celebration of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick takes place in our parish every month (usually the first Sunday). The personal celebration of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick may take place anywhere and anytime there is a need for it (like prior to medical testing or surgery). Contact the parish office to arrange for the personal celebration of this sacrament when the need arises.

Pastor’s Corner

Our country’s observance of Independence Day is being celebrated today, Sunday, July 4th! Having begun on Friday and continuing thru Monday there will be picnics, fireworks, patriotic concerts, parades and speeches. I hope you enjoy the long holiday weekend with your family and friends as we celebrate our country’s 245 years of independence. Whatever you do to observe the holiday, please be careful especially when driving. Let us remember to pray for those who are traveling so they may have a peaceful and safe journey. Let us also remember our fellow countrymen and women serving in the armed forces who do so to protect our cherished freedoms.

This is one of the rare occasions when Independence Day is celebrated on a Sunday (the last time was in 2010). Though it is important for us to observe Independence Day, when it is observed on a Sunday the celebration of the Lord’s Day takes precedence over the national holiday. As people of faith when we gather for Mass, our responsibility is to offer worship, praise and thanksgiving to God. When Independence Day is on a Sunday, we are still called to worship God and not our country. This is not unpatriotic. It is a reminder of our priority that God comes before everything else, including our country. Today at Mass, during the General Intercessions (Prayers of the Faithful) we will pray for our country. Our hymns during Mass are not patriotic hymns praising our country but rather hymns that offer praise and worship to God. Today’s closing hymn is our country’s National Hymn, “God of Our Fathers;” a hymn to God as our country seeks God’s guidance and protection.

Because Independence Day is on a Sunday, this year the observance is extended to Monday. Please note our parish offices and the church building will be closed on Monday, July 5th.

Currently our parish is joining all the parishes of the Archdiocese of Detroit by participating in the annual Catholic Services Appeal (CSA). Every parish is given a CSA target goal established by the Archdiocese. This year our parish’s goal is \$173,034. Every parish household is asked to make a sacrificial gift to this year’s CSA. The hope is that the average gift will be in the vicinity of \$275 per household. For some, especially those on fixed incomes, this will not be possible, even as a sacrifice, so whatever gift they can give will be appreciated. For others a gift of \$275 or more gift can be made to this year’s CSA campaign. What is asked from everyone is not an equal gift but an equal sacrifice. What is important is that each of us does the very best they can. Please consider making a pledge to the CSA allowing you to spread the payment of your gift over several months.

Prayerfully consider the most generous gift possible to support the CSA. When you receive your information in the mail regarding this year’s CSA campaign, please read it very carefully and support the CSA to the best of your ability. May God bless you for your continued support.

The Prophecy of You and Me

Prophet. There’s a heaviness to this word. It’s weighted down with meaning. We think of prophets and we think of Charlton Heston with wild hair and a booming voice, reaching out his hand to work wonders of nature by the grace of God. We think of prophets and we think of ancient Biblical history — someone far away, someone so removed from our everyday life. A prophet is someone who knows something we don’t.

When I let you in on this secret, it might scare you at first: in a way, God is calling you to be a prophet. He is calling me. He is calling anyone who hears the truth of the Gospel. However, there is no need for the megaphone and the wild locusts. This prophet gig might not be what you’re thinking.

What does a prophet do? He hears and testifies to the truth, even when it’s uncomfortable, even when it’s unpopular, even when it results in, as Paul says, “weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions and constraints.” A prophet doesn’t have to be smart or rich or ordained; heck, he doesn’t even have to be particularly willing.

All a prophet has to do is listen to the truth. The truth we receive from Christ, through the Gospel and the sacraments, is a mighty gift. But it is a gift that we are not meant to simply keep for ourselves. In possessing it, we are compelled to also pass it on, to share it, to let the Spirit set us on our feet.

Marriage Anniversary Mass



Every year in the Fall, St. Colette Parish honors and celebrates with married couples who are observing a significant marriage anniversary. This year's celebration will take place in church on **Sunday, October 17th at the 12 Noon Mass**. Married couples whose marriages were witnessed by a Catholic priest or deacon and are observing their 10th, 25th, 40th, 50th, 60th, 70th or 75th Anniversary are invited, with their families, to join in the celebration. After the 12 Noon Mass, all the couples will be called to stand in their place and renew their marriage vows and receive a Papal Blessing.

If you are observing one of the significant marriage anniversaries listed above this year, contact the parish office at 734-464-4433 or parishoffice@stcolette.net. Please leave your name, contact information, anniversary year, and the name of the church where your marriage was witnessed. Since Papal Blessings need to be ordered ahead of time, **please contact the parish office by Tuesday, July 13th.**

These are not the only years a couple can request a celebration honoring their anniversary of marriage; especially if it is a significant anniversary such as 15th, 20th, 30th, 35th, 45th, 55th, 65th, or any year. The anniversary blessing for a couple whose marriage was witnessed by a Catholic priest or deacon can be celebrated during or after almost any weekend or weekday Mass and family and friends are invited to participate. When the Sabbath came he began to teach....and many...said

"Where did this man get all this?..." —Mark 6:2

Have you ever heard these sayings: "You can't judge a book by it's cover" or "Still water runs deep" or "All that is gold does not glitter"? Each of these statements cautions us to look deeper before deciding the value of something or someone. In today's Gospel, we see that people in the synagogue had trouble believing that Jesus could interpret the scriptures because they knew him as just another one of their neighbors. They knew his family and considered them ordinary people. How wrong they were about Jesus! We sometimes make the same mistake when we see someone who does not appear to be knowledgeable or successful and judge him or her without really knowing them. The Gospel passage concludes with an observation that Jesus was unable to perform many miracles there because of their lack of faith. How many blessings have we missed that could have come through people we dismissed?

Let us pray: Lord, help me treat all people with love, respect, and dignity because everyone has a valuable role in your plan.

Reflection: Write a note of encouragement to someone who might need a friend today.
