Marriage Anniversary Mass

church on **Sunday, October 17th at the 12 Noon Mass**. Married couples whose marriages were witnessed by a Catholic priest or deacon and are observing their 10th, 25th, 40th, 50th, 60th, 70th or 75th Anniversary are invited, with their families, to join in the celebration. After the 12 Noon Mass, all the couples will be called to stand in their place and renew their marriage vows and receive a Papal Blessing.

If you are observing one of the significant marriage anniversaries listed above this year, contact the parish office at 734-464-4433 or parishoffice@stcolette.net. Please leave your name, contact information, anniversary year, and the name of the church where your marriage was witnessed. Since Papal Blessings need to be ordered ahead of time, **please contact the parish office by Friday, August 13th**.

These are not the only years a couple can request a celebration honoring their anniversary of marriage; especially if it is a significant anniversary such as 15th, 20th, 30th, 35th, 45th, 55th, 65th, or any year. The anniversary blessing for a couple whose marriage was witnessed by a Catholic priest or deacon can be celebrated during or after almost any weekend or weekday Mass and family and friends are invited to participate. July Food Drive

Our July Food Drive, July 17th/18th, is a Non-Food Drive for Livonia Cares. Livonia Cares is a group of churches we belong to that work in collaboration with each other to try to help local residents who are in need. The items of need are:

Tissues, Toothpaste, Bar Soap, Shampoo, Deodorant, Dish Soap, Household Cleaner, Liquid Laundry Detergent; Dryer Sheets, Garbage Bags and Spray household cleaners

These items, which are "housed" at two local churches, help residents in our Livonia Community. Any Livonia resident who receives assistance can visit the pantry. A person must receive a referral to be able to obtain these items. These are essentials that most of us take for granted, but when you have a limited income, these items probably fall to the bottom of the list so the monies available can be used for food and shelter. If you would prefer to make a monetary donation, please use the envelopes in the Gathering Space. The envelope can be put in the collection basket, the food drive box or dropped off in the Parish Office. Thank you again for all you continue to do for those less fortunate.



Pastor’s Corner

Ordinarily every month our parish sponsors a Food Drive helping to provide assistance to those in the metro Detroit area who are living in poverty. This month we are sponsoring a “Non-Food Collection” which will take place next weekend. Items that can be donated are paper products, cleaning supplies, toiletries, etc. For a complete list of what you can donate please read the related article printed elsewhere in today’s church paper. All donations will support “Livonia Cares” which forwards the donations to two local churches who distribute these items to people in need. If you prefer to make a monetary donation for this collection, please use one of our regular “Food Drive” envelopes found in the Gathering Space and on the windowsill to the right of the altar. If donating by check, please make it payable to St. Colette Parish. Monetary donations may be dropped in the collection basket during Mass, deposited in the Food Drive box in the Gathering Space, or mailed/hand delivered to the parish office.

St. Colette Parish continues to join all the parishes of the Archdiocese of Detroit by participating in the annual Catholic Services Appeal (CSA). Every parish is given a CSA target goal established by the Archdiocese. This year our parish’s goal is \$173,034. Elsewhere in today’s church paper the CSA article shows where we are at with contributions to this year’s CSA. As you can see, we still have a long way to go to reach our goal! Therefore, every parish household is asked to make a sacrificial gift to this year’s CSA. The hope is that the average gift will be approximately \$275 per household. For some, especially those on fixed incomes, this will not be possible, even as a sacrifice, so whatever gift they can give will be appreciated. For others a gift of \$275 or more gift can be made to this year’s CSA campaign. What is asked from everyone is not an equal gift but an equal sacrifice. What is important is that each of us does the very best they can. Please consider making a pledge to the CSA allowing you to spread the payment of your gift over several months.

Prayerfully consider the most generous gift possible to support the CSA. When you receive your information in the mail regarding this year’s CSA campaign, please read it very carefully and support the CSA to the best of your ability. May God bless you for your continued support.

What We Carry from Town to Town

In my experience, there are two kinds of people: the folks who kick off their shoes the second they walk through the door, and the ones who don’t.

People can feel strongly about this on both sides. The main thrust of the Shoes-Off Brigade seems to be this: we track a lot of weird stuff on the soles of our feet. Little reminders of all the places we’ve been — whether it’s a private home or a public bathroom — cling to our shoes long after we leave.

This same theory applies to our spiritual lives. As human beings and as disciples, we visit a lot of figurative towns and pick up a lot of figurative dust. Sinfulness. Shame. Defeat. Anger. Fear. Doubt. No matter how hard we try to keep free of it, these things have a way of attaching themselves to us, sometimes without us even noticing. We need to take a good look at what unhelpful and unconstructive baggage from our past we’re tracking into our present and future encounters.

What is the “town” God is asking you to visit today in His name? Is it a tough conversation with a friend, a brief witness to a stranger in the checkout line, a call to be present to someone in your family? Before you go, remember, shake off the dust. Don’t let a past disappointment constrain you. Don’t allow yesterday’s failures or burdens to keep you from the joy of today’s witness, whatever form it might take.

Air Conditioning in the Church



Are you comfortable where you are sitting today in church? Or are you a little chilly? If you are cold the person behind you may be fanning him/herself because it's too warm in church! The thermostat in our church is set for 72 degrees. However because of the size and design of the church building the temperature will vary a little throughout the building. Also if you are taking prescription medications you may feel more chilled than others.

Please be prepared by wearing a sweater or coat, or maybe try another area of the church next weekend so you will be warmer and more comfortable.



During Mass:

Are You Praying the Rosary or Devotional Prayers?

Are You Reading the Articles in the Church Paper?

If yes to either or both of these questions, once the Mass begins please stop praying the rosary or devotional prayers and stop reading the articles in the church paper. As Mass begins (either in church or during livestreaming), we should stop whatever we are doing and join the celebration by singing the hymns printed in the church paper, and, if you prefer, to follow the reading of the Scripture Readings. The Mass is the Church's most perfect prayer and demands our full and active participation from beginning until the end. Saying other prayers during Mass or reading the articles in the church paper competes with that participation. The praying of the rosary or devotional prayers and the reading of the articles in the church paper can be done before or after Mass. After Mass take the church paper home with you and recycle it. Please don't leave it in church as a precaution against the spread of COVID-19.

Reading the church paper or praying the rosary or devotional prayers during Mass may jeopardize one's obligation to participate at Sunday and Holy Day Masses. Participation at Mass minimally means physical presence and consciousness of the celebration. It is assumed the same level of participation should be practiced at all Masses.



Baptism Preparation

Expecting a child? Just gave birth? Baptism is a celebration of the gift of faith we give our children. If you have a baby or toddler that has not been baptized and this is your first child, before the sacramental celebration of Baptism can be scheduled, a class must be taken by the parents. Our St. Colette Pariah staff recognizes anew the importance of praying together for each other, our parishioners, and the needs of our community!


Our desire is that all staff be present on that day so they could participate in staff prayer. In an effort to make this more accessible to the staff we have developed the schedule below for the weekly prayer experience. Thus, during our scheduled staff prayer time, our parish offices will be closed. Our weekly prayers last approximately 15 minutes and when we attend daily Mass together, we will need about 45 minutes. Don't worry if you forget we are closed, we will have a friendly reminder posted on our doors!

- Week 5:** Tuesday Prayer – offices closed 10:55 am to 11:15 am

COVID-19 Liturgical Protocols

On May 19, 2021, Archbishop Allen Vigneron issued updated COVID-19 liturgical protocols for churches in the Archdiocese of Detroit in light of guidance from national and state health officials. These protocols are meant to permit and encourage the reverent offering of and active participation in the liturgical life of the Church.

Updated liturgical protocols in our church:

- All church doors are unlocked for entrance into the church building.
- The Scripture Readings and music for weekend Masses are printed in the church paper. When entering the church, please receive a copy of the paper so you can more fully participate in the Mass.
- Face coverings and seating:
 - ◆ If you are fully vaccinated the wearing of a face covering is optional and you may sit anywhere in the church.
 - ◆ If you are not fully vaccinated, wear a face covering and sit in the side sections of pews (those along the church windows).
- The in-person monetary collection is resumed with the passing of the collection baskets in the pews.
- The Presentation of the Gifts of Bread and Wine by members of the assembly is resumed.
- The offering of the Sign of Peace is resumed allowing individuals to make their own determination about how widely and in what form to share the Sign of Peace.
- Distribution of Holy Communion:
 - ◆ When walking in procession to receive Communion, it is no longer necessary to keep a distance of six feet between you and the person in front of you.
 - ◆ We continue to refrain from distributing the consecrated Wine at Communion.
 - ◆ Clergy and Extraordinary Ministers of Communion continue to sanitize their hands after they receive Communion prior to distributing Communion. They will continue to wear a face covering while distributing Communion.
 - ◆ If receiving Communion on the tongue, please receive from the priest and try to be the last person in line. If seated in the special needs pews you will have to wait until after Mass to receive Communion from the priest.

Mass Dispensation During COVID-19

Catholics in the Archdiocese of Detroit continue to be dispensed from the obligation to celebrate Masses on weekends and Holy Days of Obligation if one or more of the following circumstances applies to you:

- You are ill or your health condition would be significantly compromised if you were to contract a communicable illness (that is, you have underlying conditions or are in a high-risk category.)
- You exhibit flu-like symptoms.
- You have good reason to think you might be asymptomatic of a contagious illness, such as if you were in recent contact with someone who tested positive for a contagious illness such as COVID-19 or influenza.
- You care for the sick, homebound, or infirmed.
- You are pregnant.
- You are 65 years of age or older (per the CDC’s recommendation of high risk individuals.)
- You cannot attend Mass through no fault of your own (no Mass is offered, you are infirmed, or, while wanting to go, you are prevented for some reason you cannot control such as your ride did not show up, the church was at capacity, etc.).
- If you have significant fear or anxiety of becoming ill by being at Mass.

Once again, if one or more of the above-mentioned circumstances applies to your situation you are dispensed from the obligation to celebrate Masses on weekends and Holy Days of Obligation. Those who find themselves in these circumstances must still observe the Lord’s Day and are encouraged to spend time in prayer on Sundays, meditating on the Lord’s passion, death, and resurrection; an excellent way to do this is through participation in a broadcast/livestreaming of the Sunday Mass. Our parish continues to livestream on Facebook the 4:00 pm Saturday Mass. For a schedule of other livestreamed Masses, please visit the website of the Archdiocese of Detroit at aod.org.

Considering the grave obligation we have of being physically present with our brothers and sisters at Mass on weekends and Holy Days of Obligation for the reception of the Eucharist, each of us is asked to make a good and sincere judgment as to whether the above-mentioned circumstances apply or not. Where doubt or confusion persists, consult any priest for clarity.



He said to them, “Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

PROFESSION OF FAITH - NICENE CREED



He summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two.... —Mark 6:7

Why do you suppose Jesus sent his disciples out "two by two"? Have you ever had a school or work project where you were part of a team? If everyone does their part, it's much easier to accomplish the task. The task Jesus was entrusting to his disciples was huge! In some places, the disciples were well received, given a place to stay, food to eat, and even clothes to wear. However, some villages rejected them. Jesus cautioned them not to feel defeated when this happened, just to "shake the dust from their feet" and move on to the next town. But if you have ever felt rejection, you know that if just one other person stands with you, it can make all the difference in the world. Jesus' strategy to send them out "two by two" provided the support they would need to meet with opposition. When we are standing up for Jesus, people may sometimes reject us, but we do not stand alone. We have other believers, as well as the angels and saints, who God gives us to lean on.

Let us pray: Help me remember, Lord, that you will always give me what I need to accomplish your will.

Reflection: Make a list of people who have helped you in your life. Remember to thank God for them.




