Last Week to Sign Up For Marriage Anniversary Mass

Every year in the Fall, St. Colette Parish honors and celebrates with married couples who are observing a significant marriage anniversary. This year's celebration will take place in church on **Sunday, October 17th at the 12 Noon Mass**. Married couples whose marriages were witnessed by a Catholic priest or deacon and are observing their 10th, 25th, 40th, 50th, 60th, 70th or 75th Anniversary are invited, with their families, to join in the celebration. After the 12 Noon Mass, all the couples will be called to stand in their place and renew their marriage vows and receive a Papal Blessing.



If you are observing one of the significant marriage anniversaries listed above this year, contact the parish office at 734-464-4433 or parishoffice@stcolette.net. Please leave your name, contact information, anniversary year, and the name of the church where your marriage was witnessed. Since Papal Blessings need to be ordered ahead of time, **please contact the parish office by Friday, August 13th.**

These are not the only years a couple can request a celebration honoring their anniversary of marriage; especially if it is a significant anniversary such as 15th, 20th, 30th, 35th, 45th, 55th, 65th, or any year. The anniversary blessing for a couple whose marriage was witnessed by a Catholic priest or deacon can be celebrated during or after almost any weekend or weekday Mass and family and friends are invited to participate. To make arrangements for the blessing of a married couple contact the parish office as listed above.

Fall Ten Week Bible Study.

From Genesis to Jesus: A Brief Look at Salvation History.

This is a perfect Bible Study for those just beginning to look into what is found in the pages of Scripture. Looking primarily into the Old Testament we will seek to appreciate and begin to dialogue with why Jesus needed to come and die for our salvation and those historical events that lead to His coming to earth. This study will begin September 15th, meeting each Wednesday for ten weeks at 10:30 am in the Church. Bible Study

Reflections on the Liturgy of the Eucharist – Part 3

This year the Sunday Gospels during August (except August 15th and 29th) are taken from the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John. This chapter of John’s Gospel is known as Jesus’ “Bread of Life Discourse.” As we hear the proclamation of these Gospels let us take time to reflect on some practical ways we Catholics celebrate the part of the Mass known as the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

A Catholic should receive Holy Communion at every Mass in which he/she participates even twice a day as long as the person participates at both Masses (such as a Saturday morning funeral or afternoon wedding and then again at a Saturday evening Vigil Mass). What is to be avoided is to receive Communion twice in one day when it is the same Mass being celebrated, such as two Sunday Masses. If we believe that in Communion we are receiving the whole Body and Blood of Jesus, why receive him again at another Mass? Also to be avoided is coming to church just to receive Communion without participating in the rest of the Mass such as the Liturgy of the Word and the Eucharistic Prayer. If we arrive too late and miss the majority of the Mass it is better to attend another Mass at a time that is more convenient and allows us to celebrate the whole Mass from beginning to end.

A person who is conscious of grave sin (a serious break in our relationship with God or others, such as deliberately not celebrating weekend Mass, stealing, murder, adultery, etc.) should not receive Communion without prior celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation by going to confession. Prior to the reception of Communion Catholics who are in good health are obligated to abstain from eating food (including candy and chewing gum) and drinking beverages (including coffee or tea). This is being spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament as well as a sign of reverence. Water and medicine may be taken at any time prior to receiving Communion. The one who is to receive Communion is to abstain from food and drink for at least one hour before the actual time Communion is received (not from the time Mass begins).

Today many parishes, ours included, provide Communion hosts made of low gluten to be used by people with Celiac Disease or with a gluten intolerance. To avoid contamination the low gluten hosts must be kept separate from the regular hosts. If one is in need of a low gluten host, please visit the sacristy at least five minutes before Mass and inform the priest or deacon of the need for a low gluten host. *(Continued next week)*

Pastor’s Corner

Today and Sunday August 8th, our Gospel Readings at Mass are from the Gospel of John known as the “Bread of Life Discourse” when Jesus instructs us about his real presence in the Holy Eucharist. The second part of every Mass we celebrate is called the “Liturgy of the Eucharist.” I encourage you to read the article on page two, and future articles, to reacquaint ourselves with this part of the Mass.

A little more than one month from today is our Parish Picnic taking place on Sunday, September 12th (the Sunday after Labor Day). The Parish Picnic will take place outdoors on the parish grounds behind the parish offices. Last year we did not have the opportunity to have a Parish Picnic due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Also cancelled last year was our parish’s 50th Anniversary Banquet that was scheduled for October 11, 2020. Therefore, this year’s Parish Picnic will be different from past Picnics because we are using it as an opportunity to celebrate on parish’s special anniversary: fifty years plus one equals 51 years of Faith! There will be an enhanced food menu and a different variety of activities and the ones we are more accustomed to. Finally, there is no set charge for attending the Picnic! Everyone attending will be asked to make a free will offering to enjoy the food, drinks and activities at the Parish Picnic. More information is forth coming but for now mark your calendars for our Parish Picnic taking place on Sunday, September 12th.




Headed To College This Fall?



PROFESSION OF FAITH - NICENE CREED






