

### Today's Solemnity

Today on this last Sunday of Ordinary Time we celebrate the great Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Jesus' kingship is unlike other kings and rulers, for in today's Gospel we hear Jesus tell Pilate that his kingdom is not of this world. Jesus reveals the unique mystery of his kingdom most fully on the Cross as he pours out himself for the salvation of all souls whom he desires to draw into the glory, joy, and life of the Kingdom of God. We are challenged to recognize our royal ruler in the hungry, the thirsty, the sick, dying and imprisoned. These are the kings and queens of God's Kingdom!



The Church uses the language of royalty as a symbol when we celebrate Baptism. In this sacrament we become a royal people. We share in Jesus' crown. The Kingdom we are called to announce is one of justice, self-sacrifice, peace and freedom.

Beginning the First Sunday of Advent, November 27th/28th (also Thanksgiving Weekend), our parish is once again making available in the pew racks missalettes for the celebration of Masses! The missalettes include the Order of the Mass, weekend Scripture Readings and a wide selection of hymns. With the return of the missalettes, we will no longer be printing in the church paper the Scripture Readings and hymns for each weekend's Mass. Since there is no longer a need to have the church papers available during Mass, the ushers will resume the pre-pandemic practice of distributing the church papers after Mass as people leave the church. **Today is the last time you will need to receive a church paper prior to weekend Masses.**

The new missalettes will be stored in the pew racks with the binding of each one facing up! When you return the missalette to the pew rack, please be sure to do so in the same manner. This will help keep the missalettes from being damaged when the church building is sprayed with a disinfectant as a precaution against COVID-19.

## Pastor’s Corner

Today the universal Church observes the last Sunday of the current liturgical year with the celebration of the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Today’s Gospel account is not a story of Jesus enthroned in heaven. It is the story of Jesus facing the injustice of Pilate’s judgement prior to his crucifixion. Jesus defined his own kingship in terms of being one who testifies to the truth. In imitation of Christ, we are to become bearers of the truth that will lead us to the freedom of the children of God. Let us listen to God’s Word today with gratitude to Jesus who loves us and frees us from our sins by his blood, making us part of God’s Kingdom and a priestly people in service to our God.

As one liturgical year comes to an end, next weekend a new one begins as the Church observes the Season of Advent. Our parish offers many opportunities to observe the Advent Season. This weekend Advent/Christmas Reflection books are available in the Gathering Space and the doorway to the right of the altar. In the sanctuary will be our parish’s Advent Wreath. At weekend Masses the Church omits the singing of the “Glory to God” and we sing our Advent hymns. The Advent Giving Tree project is an opportunity for us to practice works of Christian charity during the Advent and Christmas Seasons. The “Advent by Candlelight Tea Reflection” will take place in the Activities Center on Wednesday, December 1st. Finally the parish provides opportunities to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation with confessions scheduled on the Saturdays of Advent and at two Communal Penance Services, one in our church on Monday, December 6th at 7:00 pm and another at St. Edith Church on Saturday, December 18th at 1:00 pm. A prayerful observance of Advent helps make the upcoming Christmas Season more meaningful for us and for others in the community.

This weekend is our November Food Drive. Non-perishable food items and/or monetary donations for the November Food Drive may be left in the church this weekend. All donations for the Food Drive will support Loaves and Fishes Outreach in southwest Detroit.

On Thursday of this week, our country will observe the national holiday of Thanksgiving Day. Sometimes we take so much time in prayer asking God for things that we often forget how important it is for us to offer thanks for the many blessings we have received! Fortunately, our country sets aside one day per year for us to simply say “thank you” for our lives, families, friends, faith, country, homes, food, and so many other things. Please consider beginning the holiday weekend with the celebration of Mass on **Wednesday, November 24th at 7:00 pm**. It is important to begin the long holiday weekend with the celebration of Mass because our English word, “eucharist” comes from the ancient Greek word “eucharistien” which translates, “to give thanks.”

Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Mass on Thanksgiving Eve was followed with a “Pie-Fest,” a pie eating social in the Gathering Space of the church. All pies were provided by parishioners and left-over pies donated to Our Lady of Loretto Parish in Redford for their Thanksgiving Day free meals to those living in poverty. However, once again due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Our Lady of Loretto Parish will not be offering their free holiday meals on Thanksgiving Day. Therefore, we will not be collecting pies on Wednesday, November 24th and there will be no “Pie-Fest” after the 7:00 pm Mass. Hopefully conditions will improve next year when this popular custom and collection can resume.




## November Food Drive



## PROFESSION OF FAITH - NICENE CREED




