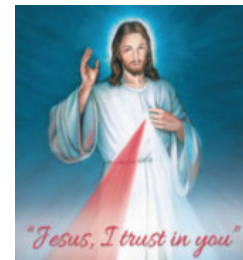

Today, the Second Sunday of Easter, was designated by Pope St. John Paul II as "Divine Mercy Sunday" following the inspirations of St. Faustina, a Polish mystic who lived in the first half of the 20th century. This designation draws attention to the merciful forgiveness the risen Jesus freely gives in today's Gospel from St. John, "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them..." The popular image of Jesus associated with St. Faustina's visions, showing red and pale-colored rays streaming from Jesus' heart, symbolize blood and water, the two elements recalling Christ's baptism and crucifixion as ways he became manifest

Pastor’s Corner

In the commercial world the celebration of Easter ended last weekend. For most people now is the time to concentrate on spring cleaning and gardening.

In the Church our remembrance and celebration of the resurrection of Jesus is such an important event that it can’t be contained to a single day. Rather, the Church gives us fifty days, known as the Easter Season, to reflect and celebrate the presence of the Risen Lord in our lives. This year’s Easter Season ends on Sunday, June 5th with the Solemnity of Pentecost.

In our parish there are a number of ways for us to maintain the joy of the Easter Season. Our worship space in church continues to be decorated with spring flowers and plants and the Easter Candle burns brightly at its place of prominence near the ambo. Each weekend Mass begins with the Rite of Sprinkling with Holy Water which calls to mind our baptism and we continue singing our Easter hymns. In our personal prayer lives we are encouraged to use the white “Easter Reflection Books” as a source of reflection and inspiration.

Today, the Second Sunday of Easter, is designated by the Church as “Divine Mercy Sunday” and is highlighted with the image of Jesus radiating red and pale streams of light from his heart. Our church is graced with this image located in the chapel. This Sunday may be observed with participation in the Divine Mercy devotional prayers. The Divine Mercy devotion, like all devotions approved by the Church, is strictly optional and is left up to the individual Catholic to decide whether or not one should practice it. Several parishes, ours included, provide a public praying of the devotion and if you wish to participate in it, I encourage you to do so on Sunday afternoon. Please read the article on the first page of today’s church paper for more information.

The Easter Season is a perfect time for parishes to celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation for children. The baptism of children is celebrated this weekend on Saturday and again on May 21st. At this weekend’s 4:00 pm and 10:00 am Masses several children from our Religious Education Program are celebrating the reception of their First Holy Communion. Please remember to pray for our children and their families so their appreciation of these wonderful sacraments will continue to grow in their young lives.

In the Catholic tradition the month of May is dedicated to the memory of the Blessed Virgin Mary. At the beginning of May our parish observes the ancient custom of crowning an image of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This custom is traditionally known as a May Crowning. Our parish’s May Crowning will take place next Sunday, May 1st after the 10:00 am Mass. We will gather in the church for the singing of Marian hymns, the praying of the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary,

and the crowning of Mary’s statue. Weather permitting, we will then walk in procession to the Marian grotto located outside the Activities Center for additional prayers and hymns and the crowning of the statue there. Afterwards everyone is invited into the Activities Center for the serving of free ice cream sundaes compliments of the Dr. Thomas Dooley Council of the Knights of Columbus. Please participate and show your devotion to our spiritual mother.

Communal Celebration of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick Next Sunday, May 1st In the Church at 1:15 pm

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is intended for anyone seven years and older who is chronically ill, undergoing medical testing or surgery, disabled by disease, age or addiction, or is affected by psychological or emotional problems. As the title states, this is a sacrament for the sick and not the dying!

If you need to celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, please join others next Sunday, May 1st at 1:15 pm in the church. The celebration of the sacrament will begin once everyone is assembled and depending on the number being anointed the ritual should take approximately 20 – 30 minutes.

The communal celebration of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick takes place in our parish every month (usually the first Sunday). The personal celebration of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick may take place anywhere and anytime there is a need for it (like prior to medical testing or surgery). Contact the parish office to arrange for the personal celebration of this sacrament when the need arises.

Easter Holy Water

The Easter Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday evening includes the blessing of the new holy water. In nature water is the sign of life. Water is used at Easter to remind us of the new life we received from the Risen Lord. At the Easter Vigil the newly baptized are immersed in the waters of Baptism. At Easter Masses, after the renewal of our baptismal promises, we are sprinkled with holy water. We do the same at the beginning of all weekend Masses during the Easter Season to remind us of our baptism many years ago.



Some people have the custom of taking new holy water home at Easter. They bless themselves with the holy water before they begin their private prayers.

If you would like to receive the holy water, bring with you a glass or plastic jar or metal container. Throughout the Easter Season the holy water for home usage is located near the baptismal font in the front of the church. During the rest of the year it can be found in the back of the church near the statue of the Infant of Prague.



The Easter Candle

The Easter Candle is one of the most visible signs of our Easter joy. It symbolizes “the light of Christ rising in glory, which dispels the darkness of our minds and hearts.”

The Easter Candle is to burn for every worship service during the 50 days of the Easter Season (from Easter to Pentecost). After Pentecost it is used throughout the year to light the candles of the newly baptized making a strong connection between all baptisms and the Easter mystery. The Easter Candle also is placed at the head of the casket or cremated remains during the Funeral Mass to remind us that we have all died and have been buried with Christ in baptism and likewise have been raised with Christ to a new life.

What To Do With Old Lenten Reflection Books



Each year our parish provides reflection books for the liturgical seasons of Advent/Christmas and Lent/Easter. These are dated materials and expire at the end of each respective season. What should you do with the books when the season ends? Since they are not blessed items you should put them in your recycle bin with your other paper products! Please don't bring them back to church leaving them in the Gathering Space. Since they are dated materials the parish cannot reuse them. Help keep our church neat and tidy and please recycle!

Are You a Catholic Whose Marriage Was Not Witnessed in a Catholic Church?

All married Catholics should have their marriage witnessed by a Catholic priest or deacon, and thus, celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage. Doing so is called convalidation (having your marriage made sacramentally valid in the Church).

Convalidation of a marriage in the Church is not very difficult. It entails some preparation as well as gathering in prayer for the couple to exchange their vows in the presence of a priest or deacon and two witnesses (and others if so desired). Interested couples should contact the Parish Office to make necessary arrangements at 734-464-4433.

Are You a Divorced Catholic?

Please know you are a welcomed member of the Catholic Church! You are free to receive Holy Communion and the sacraments as long as you have not remarried in any type of religious or civil ceremony.

The Catholic Church encourages all divorced Catholics to apply for a Church annulment. There are many misconceptions regarding Church annulments (such as wrong information regarding costs and the legitimacy of children). Please contact the Parish Office and speak to Fr. Gary or Deacon Gary and they will be happy to assist anyone who is interested.

Coffee/Juice & Donuts/Bagels Served This Weekend

After all Masses this weekend complimentary coffee/juice and donuts/bagels are served in the Social Area located in the church building between the chapel and restrooms. The purpose of serving coffee/juice and donuts and bagels is to provide an opportunity and atmosphere for parishioners to socialize and spend time together building up our parish family here at St. Colette Parish.

EVERYONE is invited this weekend to gather in the Social Area for these free refreshments. COVID-19 protocols in the Social Area will be observed as they are in the church: wearing a face-covering when not eating/drinking is recommended but not mandatory. “Is There Anyone Sick Among You?”

This question is from the New Testament Letter of St. James and is part of the Church’s celebration of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The answer to the question is to contact the Church so God’s people can pray for the sick person and offer spiritual support. Here is what you (or your family members) should do when illness enters your life:

- Contact the parish office so the name of the sick person can be included in the Sick List printed weekly in the church paper.
- If the sick person is homebound and cannot come to church for Mass, family members or friends may take Communion to them after Mass. See one of the priests or Deacon Gary for instructions regarding taking Communion to the homebound. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the parish has a very limited number of volunteers who are able to take Communion to the homebound.
- If the sick person’s illness is serious, he/she should celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The beginning of serious illness is the best time to celebrate this sacrament. It should be celebrated prior to surgery or medical treatments, in cases of chronic illness, and may be repeated during long illnesses or as the elderly struggle with the infirmities of age. It may be celebrated with sick children at least seven years old. The Anointing of the Sick is NOT the Last Rites of the Church. As the title states, this is a sacrament for the sick and not the dying. In our parish, the communal celebration of the Anointing of the Sick takes place in church every month (usually the first Sunday). The personal celebration of the Anointing of the Sick may take place anywhere and anytime there is a need for it.
- When the time comes that medicine, surgery and even prayers for healing have done all that can be done – in other words, we accept that the sick person is dying, then the Church celebrates the “Last Rites” beginning with *Viaticum* (Latin for “food for the journey”). This is the reception of Communion by the dying person and it is celebrated as often as necessary even on successive days, frequently if not daily. As the person begins to enter the final months or weeks of life (or when admitted to hospice care) is the time to celebrate Viaticum. Family members should not wait until the final days or hours when the dying person may be incoherent and unable to respond. Since Viaticum can be given by a family member, friend, deacon, extraordinary minister of Communion or even a priest, please contact the parish office to make arrangements.



April Food Drive

The April Food Drive, April 23rd/24th, is designated to help Sister Judie’s Outreach in Detroit. Groceries are distributed to the homeless in the city. Items of most need for the “treasures of the street” are:

- Tuna
- Chicken in a can
- Milk in a box
- Potatoes in a box
- Pasta
- Pasta sauce
- Boxed macaroni and cheese
- Canned soup
- Cereal
- Spaghetti or ravioli in a can
- Canned green beans
- Canned corn
- Black beans
- Canned vegetables
- Ramen noodles

At this time, they do not need plastic forks or spoons. Please make sure that items do not have expired “use by dates.” Monetary donations are always needed, too, and can be put in the box in the Gathering Space or put in the Offertory Collection in an envelope marked Food Drive. Please do not donate food beyond its expiration date. If the church doors are locked, please do not leave food outside where it is exposed to weather conditions and the nighttime feeding of animals.
