

**The Feast of the
Presentation of the Lord
February 2
Luke 2: 22-38**

February 2 is exactly forty days after December 25, the nativity of Jesus. Jewish law (Ex 13:2, 12) dictated that Jesus, as the firstborn, be consecrated to God. This was done by the parents as they presented their Son in the Temple.

Jewish law further specified (Lv 12:2-8) that a mother was ritually impure after giving birth, and that she had to wait a set period of time (forty days for a boy) before she was to offer a sacrifice to the Lord for purification.

The convergence of these two Jewish regulations occasions Luke's account of both the Presentation of the Lord and the Purification of Mary. These days the liturgical emphasis is more on the Presentation of Jesus. Luke highlights the role of Simeon and Anna, two righteous Jews who recognized Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah and praised God for being able to see and experience such a marvel in their lifetimes.

Simeon's prayer concerning the special role of Jesus states that Jesus is "a light for revelation to the Gentiles." This phrase eventually originated the custom of blessing candles on this day which were to be used in the ceremonies, rituals, and processions throughout the church year. Thus February 2 is also known as Candlemas Day. This day is indeed a rich feast to be savored.

Pat and a counselor have available appointments to meet one on one with you if you like – even the masseuse is available.

In the dining room we did sit only two to a table, but that did not stop conversation around the room! There was true fellowship and we each met fellow retreatants from other parishes just like always.

Thank You From the LaMora Clinic Committee

We want to thank the parish once again, for your generous response to the many needs of the Salvadoran people. Our parish sent to the La Mora clinic in El Salvador under the auspices of the Sisters of Charity, \$6,046 on December 16, 2020. This will go toward the ongoing expenses of the clinic including medications and medical supplies.

The \$6,046 represents craft sale proceeds, online donations and the Tree of Life donations. An additional \$2200 had been sent in November. Once again, the parishioners of Resurrection parish have demonstrated their generosity and their solidarity with the poor.

We have recently been in touch with Sister of Charity, Sr. Peggy O'Neil, who has lived in El Salvador helping the people there for many years. Tuesday is the Feast of the PRESENTATION of the Lord by His parents in the Temple at the time of His birth. The sacrifice of two doves was required by the Law of Moses for a 'first born son' of the poor. this is a good moment to lift up in prayer both children recently born or currently expected as well as their families. But it is also Groundhog Day. Will Winter continue or end early ? With Easter at the start of April, I suspect we would all like a beautiful early Spring. Both of these events speak of wishes and hopes. Be it the weather or the life of a child, we want the best ! But the Presentation reminds us that such an outcome requires investment. What are we willing to sacrifice ? What are we willing to do to insure a better future for our children as well as those of others ? Groundhog Day speaks of our 'wishes' – it would be nice. The Presentation speaks to our 'hopes' – what are we willing to do ? May the Lord bless us in both.

Friday we have an event that speaks to our realities. First Fridays have become especially powerful this pandemic year. As usual, we will have Mass at 8:30 a.m. It will include the Sacred Heart Devotion. Further, as is true each month, there will be the Anointing of the Sick. During the Winter – with slips and falls as well as flu and colds, and long and short term illnesses – you may want to join us to pray, to receive the Sacraments, to be together.

Pope Francis Tells Us That the Future Has a Name

The political turmoil of the past 4 + years has taken a toll on us, regardless of what side we are on. The persistent illness and death brought on by this pandemic has worn down our spirits. The injustices, social unrest, and destruction of environment can leave us feeling hopeless that real change is possible. But Pope Francis has a message for all of us in the midst of these hardships. Here is an excerpt from his TED talk from 2017:

We have so much to do, and we must do it together. But how can we do that with all the evil we breathe every day? Thank God, no system can nullify our desire to open up to the good, to compassion and to our capacity to react against evil, all of which stem from deep within our hearts. Now you might tell me, "Sure, these are beautiful words, but I am not the Good Samaritan, nor Mother Teresa of Calcutta." On the contrary: we are precious, each and every one of us. Each and every one of us is irreplaceable in the eyes of God. Through the darkness of today's conflicts, each and every one of us can become a bright candle, a reminder that light will overcome darkness, and never the other way around. To Christians, the future does have a name, and its name is Hope. Feeling hopeful does not mean to be optimistically naïve and ignore the tragedy humanity is facing. Hope is the virtue of a heart that doesn't lock itself into darkness, that doesn't dwell on the past, does not simply get by in the present, but is able to see a tomorrow. Hope is the door that opens onto the future. Hope is a humble, hidden seed of life that, with time, will develop into a large tree. It is like some invisible yeast that allows the whole dough to grow, that brings flavor to all aspects of life. And it can do so much, because a tiny flicker of light that feeds on hope is enough to shatter the shield of darkness. A single individual is enough for hope to exist, and that individual can be you. And then there will be another "you," and another "you," and it turns into an "us." And so, does hope begin when we have an "us?" No. Hope began with one "you." When there is an "us," there begins a revolution.

How can we open ourselves up to the hope that the world yearns for? What is our hope in? The demon possessed man in today's Gospel recognized this hope in Jesus of Nazareth when he said, "I know who you are, The Holy One of God" (Mark 1: 26). Our hope is in The God who is control of this world and yet loves you intimately. The God who promises "I will not leave you, I will never abandon you" (Hebrew 13: 5). This is the firm foundation of our hope; this is where we can find our strength when our lives feel turned upside down. "*The future has a name, and its name is hope.*" May we keep our eyes fixed on Jesus in the midst of life storms.



Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 7: 32-35

Brothers and sisters: I should like you to be free of anxieties. An unmarried man is anxious about the things of the Lord, how he may please the Lord. But a married man is anxious about the things of the world, how he may please his wife, and he is divided. An unmarried woman or a virgin is anxious about the things of the Lord, so that she may be holy in both body and spirit. A married woman, on the other hand, is anxious about the things of the world, how she may please her husband. I am telling you this for your own benefit, not to impose a restraint upon you, but for the sake of propriety and adherence to the Lord without distraction.

Gospel: Mark 1: 21-28

Then they came to Capernaum, and on the sabbath Jesus entered the synagogue and taught. The people were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes. In their synagogue was a man with an unclean spirit; he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God!" Jesus rebuked him and said, "Quiet! Come out of him!" The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him. All were amazed and asked one another, "What is this? A new teaching with authority. He commands even the unclean spirits and they obey him." His fame spread everywhere throughout the whole region of Galilee.



In today's Scripture passage from Deuteronomy, Moses prophesies about a future figure that God will raise up from the Israelite community, from their own kin. Moses professes: to him you shall listen. In the Gospel from St. Mark, Moses' ancient prophecy is fulfilled in Christ. It is Jesus, who speaks, heals, and drives out evil spirits with authority in the Capernaum synagogue. St. Paul encourages the Corinthians, in his First Letter, to commit themselves entirely to the Lord. As faith-filled stewards, we not only recognize Christ as the Great Prophet, but also support the bishops and others who observe and proclaim Jesus' teaching — His Truth — and prophesy against moral relativism and injustices of our day. It is imperative to contact our governmental officials by telephone, email, or letter about laws or proposed laws that oppose Church teaching.
