




Today we celebrate the greatest feast of the Catholic year. It would not be the same without you ! So, THANK YOU for being with us. And to all who have been waiting for the end of the dispensation, WELCOME BACK HOME !

This is, of course, a very different Easter from last year. I was here alone in the Church. True, I enjoyed the singing. But I could see so many of you in my mind's eye. I was not alone. I know you wanted to be here too. This year, despite the pandemic, we are in much better shape. The schools are open. Many have received a shot or two. And God has provided wonderful sunny weather to follow the cloudy Winter. So, be it Spring, Easter, a family gathering or just the desire to 'get out', your presence makes it more beautiful than even the many flowers do. Thank You.

We do have special rules for our liturgies now. They have been developed over the last several months as some have returned to Mass. THANK YOU for listening to and following them. We believe that when we work together on such things – masks, sanitizing, distancing – and act INTENTIONALLY when seating or coming to Communion, we make the event comfortable and memorable for all. THANK YOU to all those who have helped create and evolve these rules.

Finally, THANK YOU to all those whose efforts have made the Easter events so wonderful. The CHOIR and MUSICIANS have been a treat. The LECTORS and now the EM's (Eucharist Ministers) are inspiring. The USHERS have been invaluable. The DECORATING Team have out-done themselves – especially since we have had to guess at numbers and weather. And, as usual, your STAFF have been the key to all our successes ! THANK YOU to all.

But, this is the beginning ! It is not the end. As our RCIA candidate has found, we are a community of FAITH, HOPE and LOVE in ACTION. WELCOME to RAY KRAFT as you come to the end of your early formation journey. Now, empowered with so much knowledge and insight, but especially with the many relationships you have formed during the RCIA sessions, I am certain you know both that GOD is and loves you AND that you are NOT ALONE ! THANK YOU to the RCIA team ! Now, as we all set off into the new – and better, if we dare – world of PDA, post pandemic adventure, embrace the glorified Jesus of the Resurrection. Deacon Paul's Ponderings...

On entering the tomb they saw a young man sitting on the right side, clothed in a white robe, and they (the women) were utterly amazed! He said to them, "Do not be amazed! You seek Jesus of Nazareth, the crucified. He has been raised; he is not here.

From the Easter Vigil's Gospel: Mark 16: 5, 6

An inmate in a Chicago prison was watching a television talk show. The show's guest was G. Gordon Liddy. He was one of the men convicted in the Watergate scandal, which forced Richard Nixon to resign the presidency. The topic of the show was religion. At one point the host turned to Liddy and said, "How can you be so certain God created you?" Liddy smiled and replied, "No one else but God would have dared to do it. No one else but God would have had the nerve to create someone like me." The audience howled with laughter. So did the talk show host. And so did the inmate in the Chicago prison.

That night, the inmate lay down on his prison cot and began to think to himself: "Why did God create me? Why did God create someone who would end up behind prison bars? "Why did God create someone who would die for a sinner and be buried in a tomb of evil and hate in a prison cell?" It was then that a surprising thought entered the inmate's mind. The greatest event in history began in a tomb— a tomb just as secure and guarded as his prison cell. That event, of course, was the resurrection of Jesus. And the reason it is history's greatest event is because of the transformation it brought about in Jesus. Jesus was no longer buried in a tomb. He was now raised from the dead. And because Jesus was raised to new life, the world was also raised to new life. For the new life that Jesus received also empowered him to communicate it to others.

It was then that a second surprising thought entered the prisoner's mind. What happened to Jesus in the tomb in Jerusalem could happen to him in his tomb in Chicago! Because of Jesus' new life and power, he too could be reborn! He too could be re-created! He too could rise from the dead! At that moment it dawned on him what Easter is really all about. It's about being reborn. It's about being re-created. It's about rising from the dead. It's about becoming a new person. At that moment what happened to Jesus in the tomb happened to the prisoner in his tomb. He was reborn! He was re-created! He rose from the dead! He became a new person!

And this brings us to all of us in this church this morning. What happened to the inmate in the Chicago prison is what God wants to happen to us in this church this morning. We've been dealing with COVID for the past year. Last year, we weren't able to come to Church on Easter. We, in a sense, see the beginnings of a new life without COVID. We have new hope. We have new life.

But more importantly, God wants to re-create us! For all of us in this church find ourselves buried in some tomb, as the prisoner was. It may be a tomb of resentment because of some hurt received from someone. It may be a tomb of fear about the future and what it holds for us. It may be a tomb of confusion about our faith and how to deal with it. It may be a year of confinement due to COVID and longing for something normal. Or it may be a tomb of despair about some difficult situation in our lives and how to handle it. And that's where Easter comes in. For just as Jesus used his Easter power to raise the Chicago prisoner from his tomb, so he wants to do the same for us. He wants to raise us from our tomb. This is the Good News of Easter!

This is the Good News we celebrate this morning in this church. It's the Good News that Jesus extends an Easter invitation to each one of us. He invites us to open our hearts to his new Easter power! He invites us to let him do for us what he did for the prisoner in Chicago. Jesus wants to give us the power to rise from tombs of darkness after our hope has been dashed to pieces. He wants to give us the power to rise from tombs of discouragement after our love has been rejected. He wants to give us the power to rise from tombs of doubt after our faith has been shaken. It's about opening our hearts to Jesus to let him do for us what he did for the prisoner in Chicago. This is what Easter is about. This is what we celebrate in this church at this Easter liturgy on this beautiful day. Adapted from Sunday Homilies by Fr. Mark Link, S.J.







First Reading: Acts 10: 34, 37-43

Peter proceeded to speak and said: "You know what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name."

Second Reading: Colossians 3: 1-4

Brothers and sisters: If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory.

Gospel: John 20: 1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

In the First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles, St. Peter recaps Jesus' mission: to release us from the devil's grip through His good works and sacrifice on the Cross and to send us forth as His missionary disciples to preach the Good News of salvation. In St. John's Gospel, Mary Magdalene arrives first at the empty tomb on that first Easter morning. She then prompts Peter and John to go there. Scripture tells us that upon their arrival, they discover the burial wrappings. St. John saw and believed. This is the beloved disciple who sat at Jesus' side at the Last Supper, who bravely stood at the foot of the Cross, who, at Jesus' request, took our Blessed Mother Mary as his mother, and, through his faith, was one of the first disciples to believe in the Risen Christ. St. Paul, in his letters, illustrates how Christ has been raised up, raising us along with Him. Like St. John, may the gift of Easter grace strengthen our faith and deepen our relationship with our Lord so we, too, may boldly profess, Jesus is risen. Alleluia! Christ invites us to make Him personal in our lives and commissioned to spread His Good News to everyone we meet. A good place to start is at Alpha or a similar evangelization course at your parish or a neighboring parish.

Spiritual Communion Prayer

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire to receive you in my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there. And unite myself wholly to you. 
