Christian Service Update

Love in a Box...it was difficult to say just how many boxes we received. We ran out of room in the storage area and had to use the social hall. We estimate that we received well over 100 boxes and bags. As a result of your overwhelming generosity, we served 8 of our St. Vincent de Paul families. Each family received at least 4 boxes. The John Bolde Food Depot was the recipient of 2802 lbs. of food. We also delivered about 20 large packages of toilet paper and paper towels to Sanctum House (a women's human trafficking refuge facility). Thank you to all who donated the boxes, and to the many volunteers that accepted, stacked and delivered the boxes to John Bolde, Sanctum House and our St. Vincent Paul families. The parishioners of Resurrection always amaze us with your love, support and generosity to our neighbors in need. We are truly blessed.



Pope Francis Center...thank you to all our most faithful sandwich ministry families. Sandwich ministry families (20) per week make about 250 sandwiches. The Center averages 200-250 guests a day and they would like to provide at least 2 sandwiches per guest. The Center has requested that we continue this ministry through the summer months again this year. We can always use more families. If you would be interested in this ministry, contact George Krinke at ghrinke@comcast.net for details and instructions. FYI in March the Center served 11,858 meals, did 439 loads of laundry and provided for 326 showers, not to mention the counseling, medical and legal aid that is provided. It is a very busy place serving the homeless and needy of Detroit.

La Mora Clinic...again Thank You to all who supported the Sunshine in a Box project. We nearly sold out at the 4 PM Mass Palm Sunday weekend! Orders taken were delivered prior to Easter. We will be taking orders for Mother's Day. Through your generosity we will have raised close to \$5000 towards next year's clinic budget. This ministry welcomes new members. - Paper products, bar soap
- Cereal (hot and cold)
- Canned fruits and vegetables
- Coffee, tea and sugar
- Hearty soups with meat (beef, chicken)
- Peanut butter, jelly, honey
- Can or box potatoes and rice

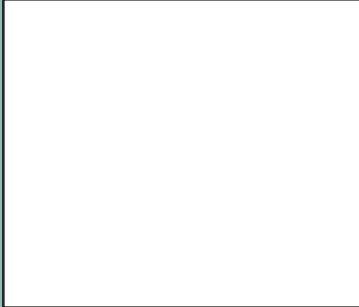

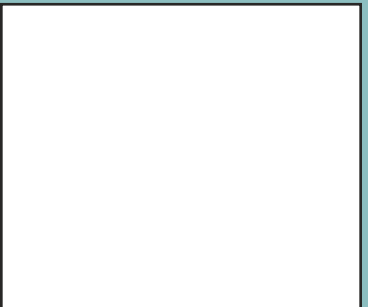
