SALAM ! SHALOM ! PAX ! PEACE ! This week we come to the second insight from the Holy Spirit conferred on the Church at Pentecost. As promised by Jesus, we now have a deeper appreciation and understanding of the Eucharist. This week-end we celebrate CORPUS CHRISTI - the Feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus in the Eucharist. First Reading: Exodus 24: 3-8

(Summary) The Israelites promised to observe all the prescriptions of the Lord as related by Moses. To seal this promise Moses offered a sacrifice to the Lord and sprinkled the people with the blood offering.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 116

Response: Our blessing cup is a communion with the Blood of the Lord.

Second Reading: Hebrews 9: 11-15

(Summary) Jesus came as high priest, not offering the blood of animals but his own blood, to achieve eternal redemption. Jesus is mediator of the new covenant.

Sequence followed by the Alleluia

Gospel: Mark 14: 12-16, 22-26

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples said to him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?" He sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the city and a man will meet you, carrying a jar of water. Follow him. Wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, "Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?'" Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there." The disciples then went off, (continued)

entered the city, and found it just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover. While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. Amen, I say to you, I shall not drink again the fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God." Then, after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.

The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

In response to an urgent request from the U.S. federal government, Starr Commonwealth is opening its Albion campus to help alleviate the developing humanitarian challenge at the southern border. A leader in healing trauma and building resilience in children, Starr has signed a facilities agreement to allow the Administration for Children and Families to utilize its 350-acre campus as a safe haven. ACF intends to provide temporary shelter for up to 240 unaccompanied migrant children as it works to unite them with their family or sponsors.

In May of 1891 Pope Leo XII wrote concerning NEW THINGS, 'Rerum Novarum'. This encyclical dealt with Capital and Labor. All following Popes have specifically ratified its teachings.
