CONCERNING THE 'EQUALITY ACT'

Recently some have been concerned about a bit of legislation called the EQUALITY ACT, being worked on in the Federal legislature. I have been asked to provide you the resources to respond in an informed Catholic manner. Below you will find some resources to enable you to do that. They include both the phone numbers for our two U.S. Senators as well as a couple of websites. The Bishops invite us to be active citizens. They encourage us to work at planting the seeds of the Gospel not only in our own lives, but in the life of the community as well. But in doing so we are wise – at least at this time in our history – to demand not just that some specific item be avoided, but to advise as well on how to properly address the issue that inspired to legislation in the first place. To seek to shut down the whole process, ignoring the reason for the legislation, would be as wicked as not addressing the fault we may find in the proposed act. The problem would still fester. So, after prayerful consideration, as well as some information gathering, know you do us all a favor by contacting your senators.

Covid Restrictions at Resurrection are Changing July 1, 2021

Because cases of Covid 19 have been drastically reduced and the requirements of the State of Michigan and the Archdiocese of Detroit have been amended, we can now change many of the measures put into place to prevent the spread of Covid at Resurrection.

Effective July 1, 2021, Resurrection will be changing the following:

- Masks will not be required if you are vaccinated.
- Social distancing is not required if you are vaccinated.
- Only the overflow area of the church will have socially distanced seating.
- The 9 AM Mass can be livestreamed to the social hall if there is interest. In the social hall there would be additional socially distanced seating. Masks would be required in this space. You would come into church from the social hall to receive Communion. If you might be interested in attending Mass in the Social Hall at 9 AM, please complete the survey at www.resurrectionparish.net/mass-changes-july-1st
- Mass signups will no longer be used.

The following will remain unchanged:

- Offering baskets will be on the Baptismal font (or by social hall door) and not passed during Mass.
- Only the priest and deacon will receive the Blood of Christ.
- Hand sanitizer will be available for use in the Gathering Space and before receiving Communion.
- If you are not feeling well, please do not attend Mass.
- If you receive a positive Covid 19 diagnosis after attending Mass, please contact the office.
- There is a Communion Service at 10:20 AM in the parking lot.

Thank you for your continued patience as we do our best to help everyone feel safe and protected.
