Covid Restrictions at Resurrection are Changing July 1, 2021

Because cases of Covid 19 have been drastically reduced and the requirements of the State of Michigan and the Archdiocese of Detroit have been amended, we can now change many of the measures put into place to prevent the spread of Covid at Resurrection.

Effective July 1, 2021, Resurrection will be changing the following:

- Masks will not be required if you are vaccinated.
- Social distancing is not required if you are vaccinated.
- Only the overflow area of the church will have socially distanced seating.
- The 9 AM Mass can be livestreamed to the social hall if there is interest. In the social hall there would be additional socially distanced seating. Masks would be required in this space. You would come into church from the social hall to receive Communion. - Mass signups will no longer be used.

The following will remain unchanged:

- Offering baskets will be on the Baptismal font (or by social hall door) and not passed during Mass.
- Only the priest and deacon will receive the Blood of Christ.
- Hand sanitizer will be available for use in the Gathering Space and before receiving Communion.
- If you are not feeling well, please do not attend Mass.
- If you receive a positive Covid 19 diagnosis after attending Mass, please contact the office.
- There is a Communion Service at 10:20 AM in the parking lot.

As the state 're-opens' from the pandemic, we, of course, say WELCOME BACK to all who have been waiting. And to all those who are still 'homebound', HELLO and GOD BLESS to you as well. As we approach our next national holiday, July 4th next week-end, we all pray for great weather so we can all gather and travel and enjoy safely and without concern. Continue to pray for the DEFEAT of the VIRUS. Continue to pray

that ALL who seek will find that they are WELCOME. God Bless America !

As part of our national Holiday celebration week-end, next Friday is FIRST FRIDAY. As usual, at Mass we will have the ANOINTING of the SICK, as well as the SACRED HEART devotion. Deacon Paul will present the homily. Come and start your celebration of what God has wrought here in the USA by praying that we be healed of all that discomforts us.

Just over 60 years ago Pope John XXIII called for an Ecumenical Council. There have only been 21 such gatherings over the past 2000 years - plus, of course, the Council at Jerusalem reported in the New Testament. But the SECOND VATICAN COUNCIL, as he proclaimed it, was to be different from those before. In the coming weeks I will explore some of those differences. What I want to focus on now is the CONTEXT in which that council was held. In my recent readings concerning it, I have been reminded that it was a stressful time. Two World Wars had been fought in the preceding 50 years. The many European 'empires' had vanished. Wars of 'independence' and national identity were active all over the world. The Cold War was on – in fact, the Cuban Missile crisis began just a week after the Council started. However, Polio was just being conquered around the world. The so-called 'Green Revolution' was beginning to address hunger and want also around the world. In other words, as the Pope stated in his Opening Address as well as in his invitation to the Council, we had a choice. We could think and act in FEAR. OR, we could think and act in HOPE. He declared that the Council was to do the latter. It was to be POSITIVE, not condemning. It was to be HOPEFUL, inviting to dialogue all the world as well as all the sciences and religions. It was to be EVANGELICAL – nor self-righteous nor small minded, but 'conquering' by revealing the TRUTH. And that Truth was to be found in ALL people and religions – not just our own. In fact, the Catholic Church was to learn through its dialogues with the World many facts to improve its message and taste. As we enter into the 'POST-PANDEMIC' world, let us determine to 'go forward'.

The CSA continues. We are approaching our goal. But, ALL ARE NEEDED ! Pray for its success here at Resurrection and across the Archdiocese. Remember, YOU MAKE A DIFFERENCE ! WE ARE ALL IN THIS TOGETHER. Wear your Masks ! Keep your distances ! Wash your hands ! Get Vaccinated ! BE RESURRECTION ALIVE ! Christ IS RISEN ! Alleluia ! He is RISEN indeed ! Alleluia !
