Current Covid Restrictions at Resurrection

Because cases of Covid 19 have been drastically reduced and the requirements of the State of Michigan and the Archdiocese of Detroit have been amended, we have changed many of the measures put into place to prevent the spread of Covid at Resurrection.

Effective July 1, 2021, Resurrection has changing the following:

- Masks and social distancing are not required if you are vaccinated.
- Only the overflow area of the church has socially distanced seating.
- The 9 AM Mass can be livestreamed to the social hall if there is interest. In the social hall there would be additional socially distanced seating. Masks would be required in this space. You would come into church from the social hall to receive Communion. If you are interested in attending Mass in the Social Hall at 9 AM, please complete the survey at www.resurrectionparish.net/mass-changes-july-1st
- Mass signups are no longer being used.

The following remains unchanged:

- Offering baskets are on the Baptismal font (or by social hall door) and not passed during Mass.
- Only the priest and deacon receive the Blood of Christ.
- Hand sanitizer is available for use in the Gathering Space and before receiving Communion.
- If you are not feeling well, please do not attend Mass.
- If you receive a positive Covid 19 diagnosis after attending Mass, please contact the office.
- There is a Communion Service at 10:20 AM in the parking lot.

SALAM ! SHALOM ! PAX ! PEACE ! This week we are in the 15th Week of Ordinary Time in the Church liturgical year. Like many things, such an identity is relative. We are in the Second Week of the Fiscal Year for the parish (the AOD begins its year July 1 for employment as well as financially.) This 21/22 year is my fifth year here at Resurrection. We are well into the second year of the pandemic. What are the things that mark the passing of the year to you ? Perhaps it is the changing of the seasons. Perhaps it is the flowers and plants you grow and harvest. Perhaps it the holidays and anniversaries. Perhaps it is the books you have read. It may seem trite to write it, but DO NOT LET THE DAYS JUST GO BY ! I am told that authors often make a point of writing at least a bit each day. Each day they can measure some 'accomplishment' by doing so. Perhaps this Summer is a good time to identify some 'writing' you can do daily. Call a friend or write a letter. The Lord is with you.

A year and a half ago the AOD – Archdiocese of Detroit – began a process called FAMILIES of PARISHES. Every parish is paired with others to plan and act into the future. Our 'family' is Resurrection, St. John Neumann, St. Thomas A 'Becket, and OLG. We are in what is called 'the Second Wave'. This means we will begin fuller planning starting this Winter – in January. Fuller action and consolidation will begin next Summer. Our 'leadership' team has already been discussing where we are, who we are, and what we have to offer to this Family Community. At this time, Archbishop Vigneron's plans are to consolidate each Family into a single parish over the coming years. Originally he spoke and wrote of this occurring in just a few years. Later he has spoken and written of a longer time. But as the rules for cooperation are being worked out, fewer and fewer options are being left to the Families. Where this will all be come next January I cannot tell. Those in the so-called First Wave are setting the patterns and rules. Locally, St. Kenneth, St. Edith, St. Collette and Victory are the First Wave Family. Pray for them as they lead us into this future. Pray for those parishes as they explore together. And pray for the people of those parishes that they may find their Faith empowered into action – Love and Hope.

With the July 4th holiday, this column had to be written early. While I cannot report the current CSA status, I am confident we have moved closer to fulfillment. (We had been at about 80 %.) Continue to pray for our success. Remember, YOU MAKE A DIFFERENCE ! WE ARE ALL IN THIS TOGETHER. Get Vaccinated ! Respect the on-going pandemic. Be decent to all about you. BE RESURRECTION ALIVE ! Christ IS RISEN ! Alleluia ! He is RISEN indeed ! Alleluia !

What We Carry from Town to Town

In my experience, there are two kinds of people: the folks who kick off their shoes the second they walk through the door, and the ones who don't.


People can feel strongly about this on both sides. The main thrust of the Shoes-Off Brigade seems to be this: we track a lot of weird stuff on the soles of our feet. Little reminders of all the places we've been — whether it's a private home or a public bathroom — cling to our shoes long after we leave.

This same theory applies to our spiritual lives. As human beings and as disciples, we visit a lot of figurative towns and pick up a lot of figurative dust. Sinfulness. Shame. Defeat. Anger. Fear. Doubt. No matter how hard we try to keep free of it, these things have a way of attaching themselves to us, sometimes without us even noticing. We need to take a good look at what unhelpful and unconstructive baggage from our past we're tracking into our present and future encounters.

What is the "town" God is asking you to visit today in His name? Is it a tough conversation with a friend, a brief witness to a stranger in the checkout line, a call to be present to someone in your family? Before you go, remember, shake off the dust. Don't let a past disappointment constrain you. Don't allow yesterday's failures or burdens to keep you from the joy of today's witness, whatever form it might take.
